MLS ALL-STARS v ESTRELLAS de la LIGA MX

The 2022 MLS All-Star Game presented by Target marks the second consecutive season in which the stars of Major League Soccer take on the best of the best from Mexico's LIGA MX. Hosted at Allianz Field, the home of Minnesota United FC, the game is a rematch of the 2021 All-Star Game, where the MLS All-Stars, knotted 1-1 at the end of regulation, defeated the LIGA MX All-Stars in penalty kicks courtesy of two jaw-dropping saves by New England goalkeeper Matt Turner and a game-winning penalty kick by FC Dallas academy product Ricardo Pepi.

MLS & LIGA MX REUNITE

The 2022 MLS All-Star Game is part of the groundbreaking partnership between MLS and LIGA MX that also consist of major events on the soccer calendar, including Leagues Cup and Campeones Cup, and is committed to providing continued competitive opportunities to strengthen both leagues. Below are quotes from leadership of both organizations, MLS Commissioner Don Garber and LIGA MX Executive President Mikel Arriola, on the continued partnership between the Major League Soccer and LIGA MX.

- **MLS Commissioner Don Garber:** "Last year's match between the MLS All-Stars and the LIGA MX All-Stars was the most competitive MLS All-Star Game ever, and we're pleased to renew the rivalry between the two leagues this summer. Our partnership with LIGA MX has brought out the best in both leagues on and off the field, and I have no doubt the intensity will be even higher for the rematch in Minnesota. Beyond the game, All-Star Week will celebrate our sport with a series of cultural and community initiatives for the passionate soccer fans of the region. From the first day through the MLS All-Star Game presented by Target, it will be an unforgettable week in Minnesota."
- **Mikel Arriola, Executive President of LIGA MX:** "For LIGA MX it was a great experience to play in the MLS All-Star Game for the first time last year. The players gave their all to represent our league and everyone enjoyed an unprecedented game, where the fans of each of our 18 teams came together to support the LIGA MX team. For us, the opportunity to relive this experience in 2022 is exciting and fills us with pride, but we are committed to preparing ourselves in the best way, and with our best players, to seek a win, and of course, revenge against MLS."

MLS AGAINST MEXICAN OPPOSITION

For the third time, MLS All-Stars will be taking on a team from LIGA MX in All-Star competition. Last year, the MLS All-Stars defeated LIGA MX in penalty kicks after ending regulation knotted at 1-1. New England goalkeeper **Matt Turner**, who was named the game's Most Valuable Player, recorded two sensational saves in the penalty shootout and FC Dallas academy product **Ricardo Pepi** recorded the game-winning penalty kick to give the MLS All Stars the victory.

The MLS All-Stars faced a team from LIGA MX just once prior to 2021. In 2003, CD Guadalajara (Chivas) was the competition for the MLS All Stars in the first game to feature the MLS All-Star team against a foreign opposition. The MLS All-Stars were victorious, 3-1, in a game played at the-then Home Depot Center (now Dignity Health Sports Park).

THE PARTNERSHIP GROWS

The 2022 MLS All-Star Game presented by Target is just another part of a larger partnership between the two most important soccer leagues in North America, MLS and LIGA MX, launched in 2018. The partnership is rooted not only in the on-field rivalry, designed to strengthen the sport in the region, but by a true spirit of collaboration off it, with a focus on sharing best practices and on being a force for positive change in the local communities of both leagues.

- **LEAGUES CUP:** The highly-anticipated 2023 Leagues Cup will feature all 47 MLS and LIGA MX clubs in a month-long tournament. The Leagues Cup champion will earn an automatic qualification for the Concacaf Champions League round of 16. In addition, clubs finishing second and third in Leagues Cup starting in 2023 will qualify for the Opening Round of the CCL. MLS and LIGA MX – which entered a partnership in 2018 rooted in the on-field rivalry as well as the true spirit of collaboration off the field – will pause their respective seasons for one month during the 2023 summer to play Leagues Cup, showcasing the soccer infrastructure and capabilities in the region in the years leading into the 2026 FIFA World Cup in the U.S., Canada and Mexico – the first World Cup to feature 48 countries.

- **LEAGUES CUP SHOWCASE:** In a preview of the 2023 Leagues Cup, five matches featuring MLS and LIGA MX clubs comprise the Leagues Cup Showcase. On Wednesday, August 3, SoFi Stadium in Inglewood, California hosted its first-even soccer event as it welcomed four of the continent's most popular clubs – Los Angeles Football Club, LA Galaxy, Club Deportivo Guadalajara and Club América – to compete on the grand stage. The Galaxy emerged victorious, 2-0, over Chivas, while Club America defeated LAFC in penalty kicks.

Three featured matches were added to the calendar for this September in Cincinnati, Nashville and Salt Lake City. For the first time in each club's history, FC Cincinnati will host Club Deportivo Guadalajara (Sept. 21), Nashville SC will face Club América (Sept. 21), and Real Salt Lake will play against Atlas FC (Sept. 22).

- **CAMPEONES CUP:** In its fourth edition, the 2022 Campeones Cup will feature the reigning MLS Cup champion New York City FC, against the winner of LIGA MX's Campeón de Campeones, Atlas FC, on September 14 at Yankee Stadium (7:30 p.m. ET). Campeones Cup is sponsored by BODYARMOR, Buchanan's, Crest and Dawn, and will be broadcast on Univision and ESPN2 in the United States and TUDN platforms in Mexico.

In the history of the Campeones Cup, the MLS leads two wins to one against LIGA MX. Tigres UANL conquered Toronto FC in the inaugural 2018 edition, Atlanta United defeated Club América 3-2 in the exciting 2019 match, and the Columbus Crew resoundingly defeated Cruz Azul 2-0 in the 2021 edition.

LIGA MX: A HISTORY

Mexico's professional national league was established in 1943. The announcement from the Federación Mexicana de Fútbol Asociación (F.M.F.) of the nation's first professional league brought interest from many clubs to join. The F.M.F. announced that 10 clubs would form the Liga Mayor (Major League). The league was founded by six clubs from the Primera Fuerza of Mexico City [América, Asturias, Atlante, Veracruz, Necaxa, and Marte], two clubs from the Liga Occidental [Atlas and Guadalajara], and two from the Liga Veracruzana [ADO and Moctezuma].

Since those founding days, of the 56 teams to have competed in the league, América has won the title 13 times, followed by Guadalajara (12), Toluca (10), Cruz Azul (9), León (8), UANL and UNAM (7). The current league champions are Atlas FC, LIGA MX's Campeón de Campeones given the club's back-to-back Apertura 2021 and Clausura 2022 season wins.

Prior to the start of the 2012–13 season, the organization Liga MX / Ascenso MX was created to replace the Mexican Football Federation as the organizing body of the competition. The league also announced a rebranding, with the introduction of a new logo.

THE REFEREES

Joe Dickerson was selected as the referee for the 2022 MLS All-Star Game presented by Target. This is Dickerson's first All-Star game, having made his MLS debut in 2017. He was among the first to graduate from PRO2 in 2018, a year when he also took charge of the USL Cup. It will be almost two years to the day that he worked the MLS is Back Tournament Final as the fourth official.

The assistant referees are **Micheal Barwegen** and **Chris Elliott**. Barwegen joined the international panel in 2018 before making his first MLS appearance later that year. The Canadian has since been involved in two Concacaf Gold Cups and recently worked the Concacaf Nations League group stage last month. Elliott, who also broke into MLS in 2018 and has worked more than 70 regular-season games since, will run the opposite line with **Jeffrey Greeson**, a regular since 2015, providing cover as reserve assistant referee.

Experienced referee **Tim Ford** will be the fourth official at the MLS All-Star game for the second time, having done so in 2019. Since then, he has joined the FIFA international panel as a Video Match Official and worked in the booth at Concacaf's Gold Cup and Women's U-20 Championship.

Jorge Gonzalez (VAR) and **Tom Supple** (AVAR) will be monitoring from the screens in the VOR for the All-Star game. Gonzalez has been a regular VAR since its introduction in MLS, often working 30-plus games a season. Now retired from on-field duty, he was the MLS All-Star referee in 2010 and a fourth official in 2011 and 2012. Supple is a seasoned AVAR having officiated more than 100 games from the booth. He will be working his first MLS All-Star game as an AVAR and third overall, having worked as an AR in 2004 and 2010 – the latter alongside Gonzalez.

RULES OF COMPETITION

All players in the squad for both teams are eligible to play. Each team will be allowed to make up to 10 substitutions. At the end of 90 minutes, if the teams are tied, no extra time will be played and the game will be decided by kicks from the penalty mark.

MLS ALL-STAR TEAM SELECTION

The 2022 MLS All-Star team was selected through a combination of a vote of MLS players, fans, and media, selection by MLS All-Star head coach Adrian Heath (Minnesota United FC) and by MLS Commissioner Don Garber. A total of 26 players were named MLS All-Stars.

Players were selected in seven specific positions: goalkeeper, right back, center back, left back, defensive midfielder, attacking midfielder, and forward/winger. MLS reviewed performance metrics from the current 2022 season to categorize players in the positions where they are most utilized.

The breakdown of the MLS All-Stars selected was:

- **12** were determined by a vote of MLS players, fans, and media. Each of the three voting groups will represent one-third of the combined vote.
- **12** were selected by MLS All-Star head coach Adrian Heath of host team Minnesota United FC.
- **Two** were selected by MLS Commissioner Don Garber.

Players, fans and reporters cast their votes for 11 players: one goalkeeper, one right back, two center backs, one left back, one defensive midfielder, two attacking midfielders and three forwards/wingers. The top players in each position from the combined vote were named All Stars. The 12th player honored was the one with the next-highest total number of votes overall. To qualify for the ballot, players must have appeared in at least 50 percent of matches this season at the time the ballot was created on June 1. Players who did not qualify for the ballot were eligible for selection by Heath or Commissioner Garber.

Every player from each of the 28 MLS clubs was provided a special link to vote for their peers. Approximately 300 members of the media who regularly cover MLS also made their picks for the league's top players.

THE REPLACEMENTS

Two players were added to the MLS All-Star roster after the original roster announcement. FC Cincinnati forward **Brandon Vázquez** replaced former NYCFC forward **Valentín “Taty” Castellanos** on Wednesday, August 3, and Philadelphia Union defender **Jakob Glesnes** replaced NYCFC defender **Alexander Callens** on Sunday, August 7. It is the first All-Star appearances for both Glesnes and Vázquez.

ADRIAN HEATH AT THE HELM OF MLS ALL-STAR TEAM

The MLS All Stars will be coached Minnesota United FC head coach **Adrian Heath**, who will be joined by his technical staff as assistant coaches. Heath, who agreed to a contract extension through the 2024 season in June, will be coaching his first MLS All-Star Game.

Heath joined MNUFC in November of 2016 as the club’s first MLS coach ahead of Minnesota’s inaugural season in 2017. Currently in his sixth season with the Loons, the Englishman has a 68-74-39 record in Minnesota, including a 10-9-5 record this season. In 55 regular season games at Allianz Field, the host site of the 2022 MLS All-Star Game presented by Target, Heath has registered a 30-9-16 record.

During the 2019 campaign, Heath led MNUFC to a club-record 53 points, 4th place in the Western Conference, one of the best defensive turnarounds in league history, the club’s first-ever spot in the MLS Cup Playoffs and the championship game of the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup. In 2020, Heath guided the Loons to the Western Conference Finals of the MLS Cup Playoffs – the furthest Minnesota United has reached in MLS postseason play in club history, followed by a third-consecutive playoffs appearance for the Loons in 2021. Heath is notably one of three coaches in the Western Conference and seven in MLS who have led their club to three-straight playoffs appearances.

Prior to arriving in Minnesota, Heath coached Orlando City SC for two seasons in MLS and four in USL, where Orlando won two USL Pro championships and three Commissioner’s Cups. His U.S coaching career began in Austin for the Austin Aztex in 2009. The team spent two years in Austin before relocating to Orlando in 2010, becoming Orlando City SC. Heath spent 11 years coaching in England for clubs such as Burnley, Sheffield United and Coventry City.

Hailing from Staffordshire, England, Heath enjoyed an 18-year professional soccer career before entering into coaching. The attacker’s journey began with Stoke City and included a notable career at Everton, where he scored 71 goals in 226 appearances, won two league titles, an FA Cup and a UEFA Cup Winner’s Cup in 1985. In 1989, Heath went on to play for Espanyol in Spain, then returned to England to play for Manchester City and Burnley, where he eventually transitioned into the role of player-manager in 1996.

Thirteen of the 26 players on the MLS All-Star roster have previously been selected as All-Stars, including Philadelphia goalkeeper **Andre Blake** (2016, 2019, 2021, 2022) and LAFC forward **Carlos Vela** (2018, 2019, 2021, 2022), who are each making their fourth appearance in the gathering of the stars. A pair of defenders – Inter Miami’s **DeAndre Yedlin** and Nashville SC’s **Walker Zimmerman** – will be making their third All-Star appearances, with Yedlin’s appearance marking his first since the 2014 season.

Nine additional players have been selected to their second MLS All-Star Game: defenders Julián Araujo (LA Galaxy), Aaron Long (New York Red Bulls), and Kai Wagner (Philadelphia Union), midfielders Carles Gil (New England Revolution), Darlington Nagbe (Columbus Crew), Emanuel Reynoso (Minnesota United FC), and Ilie Sánchez (LAFC), and forwards/wingers Javier “Chicharito” Hernández (LA Galaxy) and Raúl Ruidíaz (Seattle Sounders FC).

MLS ALL-STAR DEBUTANTS

Thirteen players have been selected as an MLS All-Star for the first time, including Commissioner's selection **Sean Johnson** of NYCFC, who was named an All-Star for the first time in his 13-year MLS career. Conversely, D.C. United forward **Taxiarchis "Taxi" Fountas** and Austin FC midfielder **Sebastián Driussi** were both named to the All-Star Game in their first full seasons in Major League Soccer.

Other All-Star debutants include: goalkeeper Dayne St. Clair (Minnesota United FC), defenders Jakob Glesnes (Philadelphia Union), Kamal Miller (CF Montréal), and Diego Palacios (LAFC), midfielders Luciano Acosta (FC Cincinnati) and Hany Mukhtar (Nashville SC), and forwards/wingers Paul Arriola (FC Dallas), Jesús Ferreira (FC Dallas), Jordan Morris (Seattle Sounders FC), and Brandon Vázquez (FC Cincinnati).

The most debutants for any single MLS team in the current format was 18, in 2015.

INTERNATIONAL FLAVOR

In advance of this winter's FIFA World Cup in Qatar, the MLS All-Star Game will feature many players who have contributed to the success of their respective national teams. 13 players named as MLS All-Stars have represented their countries at full international level during qualifying for the 2022 FIFA World Cup – covering six different countries.

- USA: Paul Arriola (FC Dallas), Jesús Ferreira (FC Dallas), Sean Johnson (NYCFC), Aaron Long (New York Red Bulls), Jordan Morris (Seattle Sounders FC), DeAndre Yedlin (Inter Miami CF), Walker Zimmerman (Nashville SC).
- Canada: Dayne St. Clair (Minnesota United FC), Kamal Miller (CF Montréal)
- Ecuador: Diego Palacios (LAFC)

Of the 26 players on the MLS All-Star roster, there are 11 different countries of birth represented: Argentina (three players), Canada (two), Ecuador (one), Germany (two), Greece (one), Jamaica (one), Mexico (three), Norway (one), Peru (one), Spain (two), and the United States (nine). The record for the most different countries represented (by birthplace) on an MLS All-Star roster is 17, set in 2018.

CHICHARITO NAMED ALL-STAR CAPTAIN

LA Galaxy forward **Javier "Chicharito" Hernández** was named the 2022 MLS All-Star captain following a Twitter fan vote. Chicharito, in his third year in Major League Soccer, has 28 goals in 54 games over the span, including nine goals this season. This is his second All-Star selection, and the 34-year-old, who began his pro career at Liga MX's Chivas, will also be competing in the MLS Skills Challenge presented by AT&T 5G on Tuesday, August 9.

From July 27 – August 3, fans used hashtags to pick between Chicharito, Nashville SC defender Walker Zimmerman, FC Dallas forward Jesús Ferreira and New York City FC goalkeeper Sean Johnson. Chicharito received the highest volume of hashtag usage (#CaptainChicharito) over that period. Both original tweets and retweets counted toward a player's total votes.

MLS ALL-STAR JERSEY UNVEILED

This year's All-Star Game kit is a celebration of the host state of Minnesota. A dark grey base serves as the canvas and is accompanied by color shift iridescent trims and branding that celebrate the northern light. A raised silicon execution of the state of Minnesota on the jock tag a "MN 22" wing on the back neck are both executed in zenith blue. An elegant Henley collar rounds out the kit.

THE FORMAT

This is the 18th time the MLS All-Stars have taken on international competition in the All-Star Game. The MLS teams hold an 9-5-3 record; the foreign clubs own a 29-28 advantage in goals scored. Below is a recap of each of those 18 matches played against international competition.

2021: The MLS All Stars defeated the best of LIGA MX in a penalty shootout (3-2), after completing 90 minutes of regulation tied at 1-1 at Banc of California Stadium in Los Angeles, CA. LAFC defender Jesús Murillo scored the lone MLS goal in regulation in his home stadium, leveling the contest in the 53rd minute. Matt Turner was named the All-Star Game MVP after recording two saves in the penalty shootout, and the three converted MLS penalties came via Damir Kreilach, Daniel Sallói, and Ricardo Pepi.

2019: Atlético de Madrid of Spain’s La Liga claimed a 3-0 victory in the last MLS All-Star Game, played at Exploria Stadium in Orlando. Marcos Llorente was named All-Star Game MVP after scoring the opening goal late in the first half; João Félix and Diego Costa put the game away with late goals.

2018: Juventus FC of Italy defeated the MLS All-Stars in a penalty shootout following a 1-1 draw at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta. Andrea Favilli gave Juventus the lead on 21 minutes, but All-Star Game MVP Josef Martínez (of host club Atlanta United) leveled terms just five minutes later. All four Juventus players then scored in winning the shootout 5-3.

2017: Real Madrid of Spain defeated the MLS All-Stars in a penalty shootout following a 1-1 draw at Soldier Field in Chicago. All-Star Game MVP Borja Mayoral gave the visitors the lead just before the hour, but Dom Dwyer netted the leveler three minutes from full time. All four Real players then scored in winning the shootout 4-2.

2016: Arsenal FC of England defeated the MLS All-Stars 2-1 at Avaya Stadium in San Jose, Calif. Joel Campbell converted a penalty kick to give Arsenal the lead after 11 minutes, but Didier Drogba equalized for the MLS side in first-half stoppage time. With three minutes to play, substitute Chuba Akpom scored the match-winner for Arsenal, earning his All-Star Game MVP honors.

2015: The MLS All-Stars defeated Tottenham Hotspur of England 2-1 at Dick’s Sporting Goods Park in Commerce City, Colo. Kaká converted a penalty kick in the 20th minute to send the MLS side on their way, and David Villa doubled the lead just three minutes later. Harry Kane pulled a goal back for Spurs in the 37th minute, but the MLS side held out for the win. Kaká was named the All-Star Game MVP.

2014: The MLS All-Stars defeated FC Bayern München of Germany 2-1 at Providence Park in Portland, Ore. Robert Lewandowski gave Bayern the lead after just eight minutes, but Bradley Wright-Phillips leveled the score six minutes after the halftime break. Then in the 70th minute, Landon Donovan – making his record 12th All-Star Game appearance in his final season – netted the match-winner. Donovan was named the All-Star Game MVP.

2013: AS Roma defeated the MLS All-Stars 3-1 at Sporting Park in Kansas City, Kan., the fourth victory by the foreign opposition in five MLS All-Star Games.

2012: The event was a rematch, as the MLS All-Stars defeating Chelsea FC of the English Premier League 3-2 at PPL Park in Chester, Pa. It was a rematch of the 2006 game, won 1-0 by the MLS All-Stars at Toyota Park in Bridgeview, Ill.

2011: Manchester United FC provided the opposition each of the two previous years. United won 4-0 in 2011 at Red Bull Arena in Harrison, N.J., after winning 5-2 in 2010 at Reliant Stadium in Houston.

2009: English Premier League side Everton FC ended the five-game winning streak by the MLS All-Stars in a penalty kick shootout after a 1-1 draw over 90 minutes. Everton FC goalkeeper Tim Howard received the game's Most Valuable Player award after making three saves in the penalty decider.

2008: The MLS All-Stars defeated English Premier League side West Ham United 3-2 in Toronto, the first All-Star Game played outside the USA.

2007: The MLS All-Stars defeated Scottish Premier League power Celtic FC 2-0.

2005: The MLS All-Stars defeat English Premier League club Fulham FC 4-1 at Columbus Crew Stadium.

2003: The MLS All-Stars downed Mexican club CD Guadalajara 3-1 at The Home Depot Center. The contest was the second consecutive year a single team of MLS All-Stars was selected for the midseason classic, as the year before the MLS All-Stars took on a U.S. national team selection following the USA's historic quarterfinal performance at FIFA World Cup 2002 Korea/Japan. All 18 of the players selected by Bruce Arena for the match plied their trade in MLS.

1998: An international theme was also used in the MLS All-Star Game as a team of U.S. MLS stars took on a squad comprised of international MLS stars. Each of the other seven All-Star Games has featured an East vs. West format.

2022 ALL-STAR WEEK COMMUNITY IMPACT

MLS All-Star Week brings more than a world-class soccer event to the Twin Cities. Throughout the week preceding the game, the League will harness the power of our soccer community to continue reaching our goals of building sustainable, equitable and inclusive communities. Events will include providing meals to those experiencing food insecurity, unveiling a new soccer mini-pitch for youth, hosting a showcase to celebrate local impactful leaders and community heroes, targeted grants and donations, and highlighting environmental sustainability practices that will leave a legacy.

Beneficiaries of the pitch include youth from Mt. The new mini-pitch will allow Sol of the Cities to expand their footprint in St. Paul providing access and a safe space for youth to come together to play soccer. The modular system is complete with lighting, fencing, goals, benches, wheelchair-accessible gates, and lockable storage.

In partnership with Sol of the Cities, MLS and Minnesota United FC will also provide training for more than 300 coaches through the Urban Soccer Diploma, a unique collaboration between United Soccer Coaches and the U.S. Soccer Foundation that provides tools to coaches working in non-traditional soccer settings, including how best to engage youth living in underserved communities.

Festivities kicked off with representatives from MLS, Minnesota United, Target, the U.S. Soccer Foundation and the city of St. Paul participating in a dedication ceremony to officially unveil the new pitch which showcases 200 linear feet of windscreen artwork designed by local youth from Mount Airy Boys & Girls Club. The windscreen artwork will live permanently on the mini-pitch and was created during a three day workshop organized by Design FC, a non-profit organization based in Chester, PA that works with youth across the country to encourage self-expression and storytelling through design. Students were tasked with visually expressing what means the most to them, what they want the world to know about their city and social issues they want to see addressed.

The All-Star Community Day also featured fun, interactive elements including soccer skills and clinics, music, games, refreshments and giveaways for local youth participants from Boys & Girls Clubs of the Twin Cities, Sol of the Cities, and The Sanneh Foundation.

Rising talent and Twin Cities based singer Miloe performed as the opening act.

As part of the League's commitment to highlight diverse leaders in the St. Paul and Minneapolis communities, MLS, Minnesota United, Black Players for Change (BPC), and community leaders teamed up to celebrate a selection of local diverse, innovative, and impactful leaders on Tuesday, Aug. 9 at MLS' All-Star Hometown Heroes Showcase. The private featured a panel conversation that highlighted the leaders and their organizations making positive impact in one of four areas – education, mental health, food security, and social justice.

LIGA MX All-Stars will play for The Sanneh Foundation, whose mission is to empower youth by supporting and promoting education attainment through in-school and after-school support, improve lives by providing programs that strengthen physical health and social and emotional development, and unite communities by advancing diversity, equity, and community well-being through the Twin Cities metro area. A \$25,000 donation will be made to the selected charity on behalf of the winning team. Youth from both organizations will be present at the MLS All-Star Skills Challenge to cheer on MLS and LIGA MX, and a check will be presented to the organization in-stadium at the conclusion of the event.

Additionally, for every assist during the Cross and Volley Challenge presented by AT&T 5G, AT&T is pledging \$1,000 (up to \$25,000) to the Karen Football Association (Karen FA) of Minnesota, an organization that aims to unite the community's passion for soccer with the importance of gender equality.

Special Olympics Unified All-Star Game Presented by MLS WORKS, ESPN & Coca-Cola

The 2022 Special Olympics Unified All-Star Game presented by MLS WORKS, ESPN and Coca-Cola will take place on Wednesday, August 10th at the National Sports Center in Blaine at 3:30 p.m. CT. The event is free and open to the public and will be streamed on ESPN3. The West and East Unified All-Star teams will also be recognized on-field during the MLS All-Game presented by Target taking place at Allianz Field on at 7:30 p.m. CT.

As part of the Special Olympics Unified Sports® All-Star experience, MLS WORKS, ESPN and Coca-Cola will host 40 Unified team members, representing 20 MLS clubs, comprised of individuals with intellectual disabilities (Special Olympics athletes) and without intellectual disabilities (Unified partners). Teams will play in an 11 v. 11 competitive match, consisting of two 40-minute halves, outfitted in authentic uniforms provided by adidas.

The Unified All-Star Game is part of the season-long Special Olympics Unified Soccer Exchange program that provides opportunities for Unified soccer teams to participate in a first-team MLS experience. MLS Unified soccer teams travel for exhibition matches, scheduled in conjunction with MLS first-team matches, to reinforce inclusivity and showcase the talents and abilities to MLS fans. MLS clubs provide authentic MLS first-team experiences such as signing days, jersey unveils, practices and scrimmages with MLS front office staff and first-team players, and gameday recognition.

MLS Sustainability

MLS is committed to taking steps to address its environmental impact and raise awareness of sustainability initiatives within local communities throughout the United States and Canada. MLS will offset a portion of the greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions associated with All-Star week festivities (hotel accommodations, on-site transportation, staff, player, executive and MLS guest travel and stadium operations at Allianz Field) by investing in carbon credits used for Forest Conservation projects in partnership with South Pole. \$1 of the proceeds from each MLS All-Star ticket will be used to help support these offsets.

MLS is specifically investing in the Fond du Lac Forestry Project located in Northeastern Minnesota, which collaborates with communities to sustainably manage and conserve Minnesotan Forest. The Fond du Lac Band of Lake Superior Chippewa are one of six bands who comprise the Indigenous Minnesota Chippewa Tribe. Striving to protect native lands and natural resources, this project is developed as part of the Tribal Land Conservation Initiative and works closely with the Fond du Lac people to sustainably manage an area that covers over 8,197 acres of landscape. Revenue generated from carbon credits allows for community members to acquire traditional homelands, develop renewable energy projects, and support other tribal community members through social programs. The project aims to protect the region and its natural resources not only to reduce emissions from deforestation but additionally for the cultural, spiritual, and physical well-being of the Fond du Lac people. By improving the management of Minnesotan forest, the project preserves native species such as black bears, timber wolves, bald eagles, owls, and white-tailed deer.

During All-Star events including the MLS All-Star Game presented by Target and MLS All-Star Skills Challenge presented by AT&T 5G, Allianz Field's Green Team, a group of sustainability professionals will be on hand to educate fans on waste diversion. The Green Team has helped support diverting over 270 tons of recyclable material from landfills since 2019 at Allianz Field.

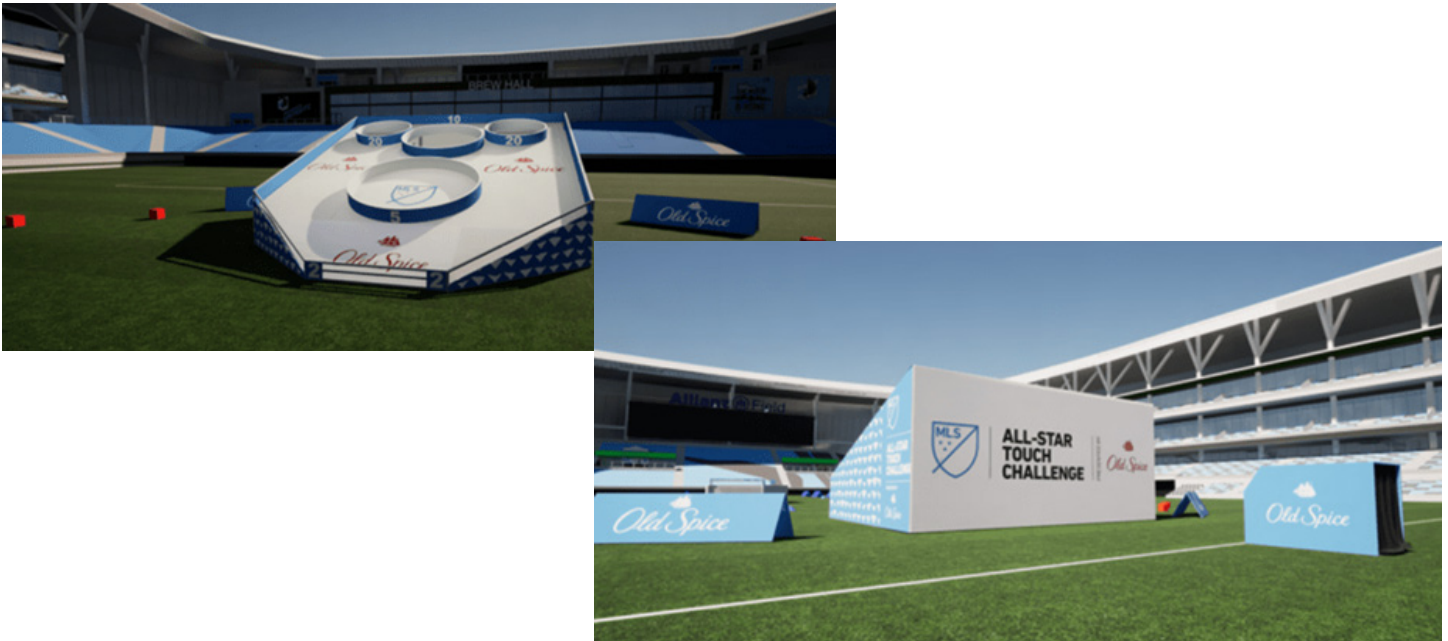


MLS All-Star Touch Challenge presented by Old Spice

Participants: Three players from each team will participate in each round of this competition. The three players will consist of two passers and one receiver.

Rules: In this ultimate test of touch, the receiver will collect balls chipped in by his teammates or launched high in the air by a ball launcher and will have the task of controlling and redirecting each ball into one of four targets that have varying points values (five points, 10 points, 20 points). Any ball that lands on the apparatus and remains there, but does not make it into a target, will count for two points. Teams will alternate between rounds. The final 5 balls, launched from behind the apparatus are worth double points.

Scoring (1 Point on Scoreboard): The team with the most points after both rounds is awarded one point on the Skills Challenge scoreboard.



Cross & Volley Challenge presented by AT&T 5G

Participants: Eight players per team will participate, including six field players and two goalkeepers.

Rules: Creativity and skill will be on display, as players connect with a teammate to score goals in style. The more style, the more points. In each round, the shooting team will have two players sending in crosses from outside the 18-yard box and one shooter behind the penalty spot. The non-shooting team will have one goalkeeper in the net. As the crossers serve balls in, the shooter must receive the ball and volley a shot past the opposing goalkeeper.

Scoring (1 Point on Scoreboard): Players earn points for each goal scored, with 20 points awarded for bicycle or scissor kick, 15 points for a standard one-touch goal, 10 points for a two-touch goal that doesn't hit the ground, and five points for any half-volley goals scored after the ball hits the ground one time.

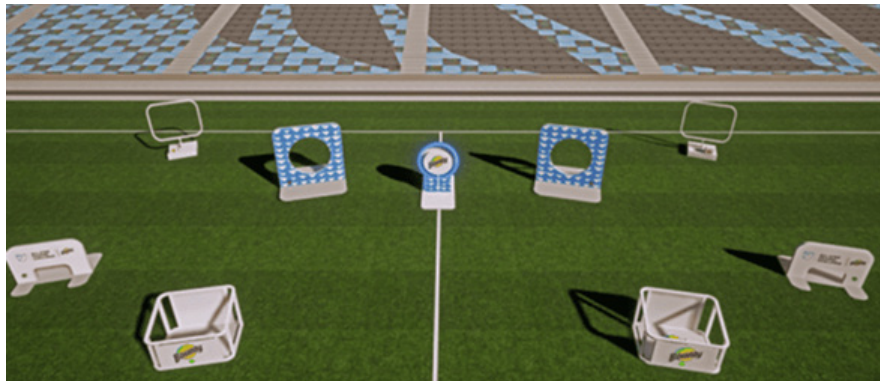


Passing Challenge presented by BOUNTY

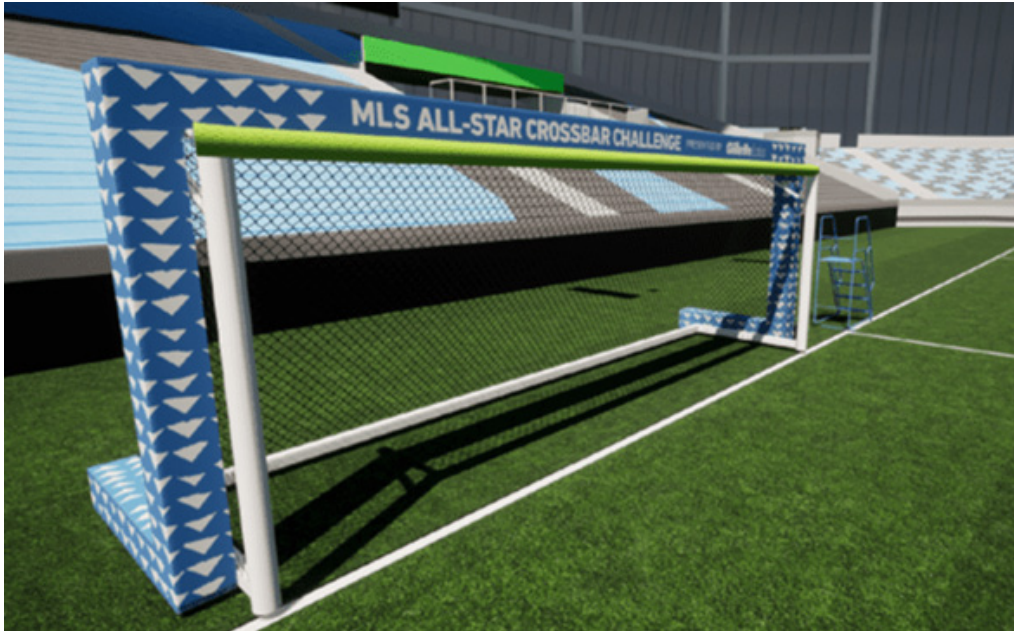

MLS NEXT All-Star Game presented by Allstate

Announced in early July, the inaugural MLS NEXT All-Star Game presented by Allstate will provide a world-class experience for 45 of the best young players in North America to showcase their talent on a national stage. Forty-five of the top MLS NEXT players will compete in an East vs. West format at the National Sports Center in Blaine, Minn. on the day of the MLS All-Star Game presented by Target, Wednesday, August 10.

MLS NEXT and Allstate will provide the selected players with a once-in-a-lifetime player experience during MLS All-Star Week, with a full slate of evening programming events and activities in advance of gameday. The players will be fully integrated into MLS All-Star Week festivities while training and competing in their own All-Star Game.

Two teams will compete in an East vs. West format at the National Sports Center in Blaine, Minn. on the day of the MLS All-Star Game, Wednesday, August 10. Twenty-eight of the 29 MLS academies had at least one player selected to the inaugural rosters, with Inter Miami CF, Philadelphia Union, and San Jose Earthquakes leading the way with three selections apiece. Five non-MLS academies will also be represented in Blaine: Barca Residency Academy, De Anza Force, PDA, Strikers, and the San Francisco Glens.

Additionally, three 2021-22 MLS NEXT Most Valuable Players presented by adidas are also represented on the roster: Roka Tsunehara of De Anza Force (U16), Bryan Moyado of LAFC (U17), and Colin Griffith of PDA (U19).

The MLS NEXT Player Selection Committee also advised on the selection of the coaching staff for both East and West clubs. The head coach of the East team will be MLS Great Javier Morales, who appeared in 255 MLS matches across his 11-year playing career and is currently an Inter Miami academy coach. Morales will be joined on the bench by Rob Becerra of the New England Revolution, who coached the U19 Revolution team to a championship at the 2021-22 MLS NEXT Cup Playoffs in July.

Leading the West squad will be MLS Great Jeremy Hall, who played 127 games for five MLS teams during his playing career and is currently an assistant coach for MNUFC2 of MLS NEXT Pro. Joining Hall is assistant coach Antonio Medina, who coached the U19 San Francisco Glens to a runner-up finish at the 2021-22 MLS NEXT Cup Playoffs.

The 45 players were chosen by the MLS NEXT Player Selection Committee, which is made up of key MLS Player Development department personnel, following the conclusion of the MLS NEXT Cup Playoffs and Showcase. Players must have been U-18 (born in 2004 or earlier) and have competed in one of the MLS NEXT national showcase events this season, including MLS NEXT Fest, MLS NEXT Flex, Generation adidas Cup, and MLS NEXT Cup Playoffs and Showcase.

The match will be streamed live on Twitter. Admission to the MLS NEXT All-Star Game presented by Allstate at the National Sports Center is free of cost.
