WHAT TO WATCH FOR VS. D.C. UNITED

TEAM:

- New England improving on its 32-34-15 all-time record against D.C. United, including five straight victories. The Revolution are 5-0-3 over the last eight encounters and have never won six straight vs. D.C.
- The Revolution moving closer to clinching the 2021 Supporters' Shield. They enter Wednesday's match with a nine-point lead over Seattle Sounders FC. Seven total points won by New England or lost by Seattle would secure the Revs' first-ever Supporters' Shield crown.
- New England (66 pts.) earning seven points in the final four games to break the MLS single-season points record (72 - LAFC, 2019).
- The Revs maintaining their 2.20 points per game pace to set a new MLS record (2.13 - LA Galaxy, 2018).
- The Revolution (.767) finishing the season with the league's best-ever winning percentage, beating the previous high of .750.
- New England becoming the fifth team in MLS history to win 21 games in regulation (adjusted for shootouts from 1996-99).
- The Revolution becoming the third team to win 10 road games in regulation. New England's nine road victories are tied with Seattle for the MLS lead.
- New England (5-0-2) extending its seven-game unbeaten streak, including three straight road wins.
- The Revolution winning on the road for the eighth time in nine games.
- The Revs remaining on track to record the fewest losses in team history (7 - 2005). Four losses would be tied for the fewest in any MLS season.
- New England improving on its +23 goal differential, which would set a new club mark and ranks second in MLS behind Seattle (24) this season.
- The Revolution adding to their club-record 59 goals scored this season, including 11 goals in the last four contests.
- The Revs' attack continuing to lead MLS in goals (59), assists (61) and shots on target (161).
- New England (61) registering five assists to match the single-season club record (66).
- New England holding its position among league leaders in shots (3rd - 429), duels won (6th - 1577), and fouls won (6th - 368).
- New England improving on its 16-0-3 record when scoring first.

INDIVIDUAL:

- Bruce Arena** (238) winning two more games to tie Sigi Schmid (240) for the most regular season victories in MLS history.
- Arena** campaigning for his fourth MLS Supporters' Shield title, which would break a deadlock with Schmid for the most all-time.
- Arena** building on his 12-4-8 record against D.C. United, his former club.
- GK Matt Turner** winning a 16th game to tie the Revs' single-season mark for a goalkeeper (Matt Reis - 2005; Bobby Shuttleworth - 2014). Turner is 6-1-2 all-time record against D.C.
- New England's trio of Designated Players - **F Gustavo Bou**, **F Adam Buksa**, and **M Carles Gil** - adding to their combined 30 goals and 26 assists.
- Bou** (T4th - 14) and **Buksa** (T6th - 13) continuing to challenge for the MLS Golden Boot.
- Bou** continuing to lead MLS in combined goals and assists (40) since he entered the league on July 17, 2019.
- Bou** finding the scoresheet with a goal or assist for the fifth straight game.
- Gil** continuing to lead MLS in assists (17), chances created (113), chances created from open play (67), chances created from set play (46), and successful crosses/corners (79).
- Gil** (17) approaching the Revolution's single-season assists record (19).
- Gil** (8) recording a ninth game-winning assist to set a new MLS single-season record.
- Gil** (113) nearing Diego Valeri's league record of 124 chances created in a single season (source: Opta - data since 2011).
- Buksa** recording three more shots to hit the century mark on the season, and five more shots to set a new Revolution single-season high (Wolde Harris - 101, 2000).
- Buksa** remaining among league leaders in shots (2nd - 97), shots on goal (3rd - 37), aerial duels won (3rd - 102), and duels won (9th - 176).
- Buksa** leading the league in headed shots (42).
- Buksa** adding to his five goals and one assist over his last seven appearances.
- M Matt Polster** collecting his 125th MLS appearance.
- D Andrew Farrell** continuing to rank among MLS leaders in minutes played (T2nd - 2610), clearances (4th - 125) and blocks (T6th - 22).

2022 CONCACAF CHAMPIONS LEAGUE

After clinching the top seed in the Eastern Conference, the New England Revolution have qualified for the 2022 Concacaf Champions League, marking their return to the North American continental competition for the first time since its inaugural 2008-09 edition. It marks the Revs' first continental competition since the 2010 SuperLiga. New England is one of four MLS teams ever to win a North American continental trophy, capturing the 2008 North American SuperLiga title.

Here are a few notable quotes following last Saturday's match against Chicago:

Revolution Sporting Director & Head Coach Bruce Arena

On the team's priorities for these final five regular season games:

Arena: "We treat it like every game we play. It doesn't matter whether we had 16 or 17 days off or not. We treat it like every game. We look at the good and the bad. Then we move forward and get on with the next game."

On Emmanuel Boateng's performance:

Arena: "He gave us good energy. He did a good job. I thought the three players that came into the game gave us good energy, helped us in the attack. We were obviously looking for that second goal and got it. The third goal was staring at us and we didn't finish off a few plays. But I thought [Ema] Boateng, [Adam] Buksa, and [Tajon] Buchanan did well. I think Tajon had to make some better decisions on the ball."

Revolution Midfielder Emmanuel Boateng

On the team's mentality following Saturday's draw:

Boateng: "I wish you guys would be able to see us on Monday. Come into the locker room, see how guys will be ready to bounce back right away. The good thing is we have another game in three or four days, so we have a chance to right it. A lot of guys are going to be pissed, and they are already pissed, you can go into the locker room there's probably only three guys left. I know we're going to turn this around. It's not like we're in a crisis, it's just a bad result and we'll be better in the next game."

On building chemistry with teammates in the midfield:

Boateng: "Yeah, I've just been working at it in training. I know Carles [Gil], his movements, where he wants to be, especially with Tajon [Buchanan] too, just get the ball to him out on the flanks and let him create. It's been a year now with these guys and I feel pretty comfortable knowing their tendencies, where they want the ball, and what kind of movements they're going to make."

RECORD-SETTING SEASON ENTERS FINAL STRETCH

Entering Wednesday's match, the New England Revolution remain the only Eastern Conference side – and one of two MLS clubs overall – to have already punched their ticket to the Audi 2021 MLS Cup Playoffs. The Revolution have clinched the No. 1 seed in the conference for the third time in the team's history, guaranteeing a 2022 Concacaf Champions League berth and homefield advantage through at least the Conference Final round.

With four games to play, the Revolution have already secured the most successful regular season in the club's 26-year history. New England has set multiple new team records including wins (20), points (66), away wins (9), and goals scored (59) while also on pace to shatter several other club and league records that are within reach:

New England has been running away from the pack this season and enters Wednesday's match 18 points clear of second-place Nashville SC in the Eastern Conference and nine points ahead of Seattle Sounders FC, the Western Conference leaders, in the Supporters' Shield standings.

In the league's previous 25 seasons, only 10 teams have won their conference (or division) by 10-or-more points. The all-time largest margin of victory in a conference race was 16 points – LAFC in 2019 and San Jose in 2015.

New England, an original MLS club, is well on its way to recording one of the best regular seasons in the league's 26-year history. With a rate of 2.20 points per game, the Revolution remain on pace to set new MLS single-season records for points (72 – LAFC, 2019), points per game (2.13 – LA Galaxy, 1998), and winning percentage (.750 – three times).

NEW ENGLAND ACHIEVES FIRST 20-WIN CAMPAIGN

The New England Revolution recorded the first 20-win season in club history, and just the 14th in MLS annals, with their victory on Sept. 29 at CF Montreal to cap an undefeated September. While the 20-win threshold sets new heights for the Revolution, Sporting Director & Head Coach Bruce Arena is no stranger to the feat, having accomplished it on two prior occasions, both with D.C. United in the shootout era (no ties).

In 1998, Arena's most recent 20-win campaign prior to 2021, the legendary coach set an MLS record with 24 victories. A year prior, Arena led his D.C. United side to a 21-win season en route to his second consecutive MLS Cup.

Of the 14 previous teams with 20-win seasons, five have won MLS Cup – D.C. United in 1997 and 1999, Chicago Fire FC in 1998, Toronto FC in 2017, and Atlanta United in 2018.



From 1996-99, MLS matches that ended in a tie after 90 minutes went to a shootout. Taking those contests into consideration, the MLS record for regulation victories in a season sits at 22, first accomplished by the 1998 LA Galaxy and later matched by the 2018 New York Red Bulls.

The rankings below have been adjusted to account for games from 1996-99 before ties were implemented. Games that ended tied after regulation and were decided in a shootout were recounted as draws.

The Revolution are also approaching the 2018 New York Red Bulls record for most home points in a season (43). While New England is out of contention for the best home winning percentage in a season (1.000) set last year by the Philadelphia Union (9-0-0), the Revolution are looking to write themselves into a top-five spot with their .833 winning percentage at Gillette Stadium this year.

New England is also in position to challenge the MLS record for most regulation home wins in a season. The Revolution have won 11 times at Gillette Stadium this season, three shy of the league record with two regular season home matches left to play in 2021.

TEAM NOTES

BALANCED ATTACK: REVS LEAD MLS AT HOME AND AWAY

The Revolution's success this season is equally attributed to the club's dominance at home and on the road. The Revolution own a 11-1-3 record in Foxborough this year as the team has achieved double-digit wins at home for the sixth time in team annals. The club's .833 winning percentage at home is best in MLS and on pace to be among the 10-best home seasons in MLS history.

The Revolution's 2.4 points per home game this season is best in the league. The Revs need only one more win in the final two home games to tie the club's single-season mark (12 - 2017).

The Revolution recorded a ninth away win against CF Montreal on Sept. 29, improving the club's road record to 9-3-3 on the year. The Revs have now won seven of their last eight road games. With two road games still remaining on the docket, the Revs have already set a new single-season club record for away wins, surpassing the previous mark of six reached on eight occasions, most recently in 2014. New England won four straight away contests earlier this season for only the second time in club history (2008).

New England has emerged as the league's most formidable away team dating back to Bruce Arena's arrival in New England. Since Arena debuted as head coach on June 2, 2019, the Revs lead MLS in away wins across regular season and postseason play. With their latest victory away from Foxborough, the Revolution became the ninth MLS team with 30 away points in a season, a league-best mark this season.

GOALS AND ASSISTS EXPECTED FROM REVS ATTACK

New England has been Major League Soccer's top attacking team throughout the 2021 regular season, with 59 goals and counting through 30 games. Behind much of the Revolution's success in the final third is their trio of Designated Players -- Adam Buksa, Gustavo Bou, and Carles Gil -- all of whom have enjoyed career-best seasons up top.

When it comes to combined goals and assists, the trio all ranks in the top 20 in MLS, with Gil's 16 assists this season leading the league. It's safe to expect goals when the Revs play, and the underlying analytics back that eye test.



According to American Soccer Analysis (@AnalysisEvolved), New England boasts three of the top-10 players in the league in expected goals + expected assists this season. Gil is the MLS leader in expected assists this season at 11.51 while Buksa ranks second in MLS with 16.60 expected goals.

KING OF THE GIL: CARLES IS MLS MVP FRONTRUNNER

Revolution captain **Carles Gil**, Major League Soccer's Player of the Month for June, an MLS All-Star, and a leading MLS MVP candidate, returned to action on September 3 after being sidelined for the month of August with a muscle injury. Gil owns 17 assists on the season and earned the June honor after recording five assists in three games during the month. Despite missing six games, Gil's league-leading 17 assists remain well ahead of any other player in MLS.

Gil, who signed a new multi-year contract with the Revs on May 24, either leads or is among the league leaders in virtually every attacking category, staking his claim as a frontrunner for Landon Donovan MVP consideration:

BUKSA DOUBLES SCORING OUTPUT FROM 2020

Forward **Adam Buksa** has doubled his 2020 scoring output with a career-high 13 goals on the season, one behind Gustavo Bou for the team lead. The Polish international has scored in three of his last four MLS games, with five goals and one assist in his last seven outings. In addition, Buksa has scored five goals in five caps for the Poland National Team during FIFA World Cup Qualifiers in September and October.

In regular season play, Buksa's 19 career goals are tied for fifth most since the start of 2020. His five headed goals are tied for third most in MLS during that span.

The six-foot-three forward is among Major League Soccer's most dominant player in the air. He paces the league in headed shots and ranks second in aerials won. Buksa's aerial prowess is on display in the Revolution's defending third as well. His 20 headed clearances rank second most among MLS forwards this season.

BOU KNOWS GOALS: GUSTAVO CHASING MLS GOLDEN BOOT

Forward **Gustavo Bou** is in the midst of an electric run of form, having scored 14 goals on the year and earned a MLS All-Star selection. He was recognized for his blistering scoring pace with MLS Player of the Month honors for July. Bou scored five times across six games in July, adding one assist, as the Revs went 4-1-1 and ascended to the top of the Supporters' Shield table. It marks the first time in Revolution history the club has produced back-to-back Player of the Month winners, following **Carles Gil**'s win for June.

With 14 total goals on the season, Bou ranks fourth in the MLS Golden Boot race. His teammate **Adam Buksa** (13) has also matched his tally for the team lead.

Bou continues to score at a rate that puts him in elite company. His 0.48 goals per game and 0.56 goals per 90 minute clips are second only to Taylor Twellman in Revolution club history.

The Argentine leads MLS with the most combined goals + assists in regular-season play, with 40 since he arrived in MLS in 2019. Since joining the club on a club-record transfer fee from Liga MX's Club Tijuana, The Revolution have lost only once when Bou scores a goal. New England owns an 20-1-8 record across all competitions when "La Pantera" finds the back of the net.

Bou has also shown a flare for the dramatic in MLS, having scored seven times in the 85th minute or later with the Revs posting a 5-0-2 record in those games, inclusive of both regular season and postseason play.

ARENA APPROACHING MLS WINS RECORD

Bruce Arena, in search of what would be an MLS-record fourth Supporters' Shield title, continues climbing the MLS record books in his 17th MLS season as a head coach. Arena trails the late Sigi Schmid by two wins for a share of the all-time record. Already the winningest active coach in MLS, he also eclipsed Schmid last season for most MLS Cup Playoff games coached (54) in 2020.

Arena owns 273 combined regular season and postseason wins in MLS, more than any other coach. In 2019, he became the second coach in MLS history to eclipse 700 regular season points earned, joining Sigi Schmid (843). With an all-time regular season record of 238-135-111 (36-14-22 with New England), Arena ranks second in league history in regular season wins and points earned.

Arena's five MLS Cup victories are unlikely to be rivaled anytime soon, as no other active coach has more than two trophies under their belt.

TURNER'S SHOT-STOPPING RATES ARE HISTORIC

Despite finishing second in Allstate Goalkeeper of the Year voting last year, Turner ranked atop the charts in several advanced and traditional statistical categories, including goals allowed minus expected goals allowed. According to American Soccer Analysis, Turner's -7.27 goals allowed minutes expected goals (GA-xGA) was the best mark among MLS goalkeepers in 2020 by a margin of 1.96.

For his career, Turner has totaled -24.40 goals saved above expected, the best total in MLS since the statistic began being tracked by American Soccer Analysis in 2013. Turner's impressive total comes despite him playing only four of the nine seasons during that span and seeing approximately 10,000 fewer minutes than the three next-closest players.

The six-year veteran also posted outstanding numbers by traditional metrics during his breakout 2020 campaign. He anchored New England to a new club record for best goals-against average (1.09) in a single season, set a new career high with six shutouts - two shy of the league lead - despite the shortened season, and conceded only 24 goals through 22 starts. He finishing the year ranked among the top five league-wide in saves and saves percentage.



In both MLS and international circles, Turner has also become notorious for his heroics on penalty kicks, including saving one from Orlando City SC's Nani in the 2020 Eastern Conference Semifinals to help secure the win. Turner stonewalled Nani again in the Revs' victory on September 25 vs. Orlando. He also stopped two penalties in a shootout to give the MLS All-Stars a win over the Liga MX All-Stars to earn All-Star Game MVP honors. Since taking over as a starter in 2018, Turner has stopped three penalties with New England and is tied for second in penalty save percentage during that span.

BUCHANAN NAMED GOLD CUP'S BEST YOUNG PLAYER

Midfielder **Tajon Buchanan** was named Best Young Player for the 2021 Concacaf Gold Cup after leading the Canada Men's National Team to the Semifinal. Buchanan was Canada's catalyst throughout its run at the tournament, starting all five of the Canada's games and recording one goal and five assists, including his first international goal in the Semifinal against Mexico.

Buchanan has continued to spark the Canadian side during FIFA World Cup Qualifying. The 22-year-old owns 14 career caps, three goals, and four assists in his senior international career, including two goals in the Concacaf's "Octagonal" final round of qualifying this September and October. His performances have helped lift Canada into third place in the region through six-of-14 matchdays.



In MLS play, the 2021 All Star continues to establish himself as one of the league's most explosive wingers. He has already posted single-season career highs in both goals (7) and assists (5). The 22-year-old has tallied five times in his last 10 league outings.

His ability to beat defenders one-on-one and draw fouls in dangerous positions has set up several advantageous set-piece opportunities for the Revolution. Despite missing five games for international duty, Buchanan sits tied for second in the league with 24 fouls won in the final third:

WE'RE NO. 1: REVS EYE LARGEST MARGIN OF VICTORY

The Revolution are 13-1-3 over the last 17 matches dating back to July 7, helping the club clinch the top spot in the Eastern Conference on Oct. 3. New England elevated into first place in the Eastern Conference back on May 16 and has not looked back since.

The Revolution are currently 18 points clear of second-place Nashville SC in the Eastern Conference. Prior to 2021, only 10 teams have finished the regular season with a 10-point lead in the conference. The league's largest margin of victory in the conference is 16 points, a feat accomplished by LAFC in 2019 and San Jose in 2015.

KILLER B'S: REVS BOAST HISTORICALLY BALANCED SCORING

Forwards **Gustavo Bou** and **Adam Buksa** are the team's top scorers this season, with 14 and 13 goals, respectively, and are among the league's top 10 scoring leaders. As a team, the Revolution have already surpassed the club record for goals in a season (55), set in 2003 and matched in 2005.

Tajon Buchanan scored his seventh goal of the season in New England's win over New York City FC on Sept 11. Buchanan has now tallied in five times in his last 12 appearances for the Revolution. New England is an unbeaten 6-0-1 when the Canadian tallies this season.



With Buchanan's next goal, New England would have three players on eight-or-more goals for just the fourth time in club history and first since 2018. Should Buchanan reach double digits in scoring this year, it would mark the first time in club history New England had three players with 10-plus goals in a single season.

REVS SET MLS RECORD FOR ONE-GOAL WINS

With five games remaining in New England's 2021 MLS regular season, the Revolution have raced to the top of the league standings and now stand eight points clear in the chase for the Supporters' Shield and 18 points ahead in the Eastern Conference.

The Revolution have won a club-record 20 games this season, most in the league by a margin of five and eight more than any other Eastern Conference side.

Of the Revolution's 20 wins, an MLS-record 16 have come via one-goal margins. New England is just fourth team in MLS history to notch at least 13 wins in one-goal games, a feat last accomplished by the Colorado Rapids in 2016.

REVS TRIO SHINES ON INTERNATIONAL STAGE

A trio of Revolution players excelled on the international stage during October's World Cup Qualifiers as **Adam Buksa** (Poland), **Tajon Buchanan** (Canada), and goalkeeper **Matt Turner** (United States) combined to earn six caps and in FIFA World Cup Qualifiers for their countries.

Buksa, 25, scored his fifth international goal and added two caps with the Poland National Team in World Cup Qualifying matches at home against San Marino on Oct. 9 and on the road at Albania on Oct. 12. Buksa scored in Poland's 5-0 victory over San Marino, playing 18 minutes off the bench in the second half. In Poland's 1-0 victory on Tuesday against Albania, Buksa notched his third international start, playing 71 minutes.



Buchanan, 22, has earned all 14 of his senior caps with Canada in 2021, with nine coming in World Cup Qualifiers. The Brampton, Ontario native played in two of Canada's three matches, starting twice, and scoring in Canada's 4-1 win over Panama in Toronto on Wednesday. Buchanan now owns three goals and four assists in his national team career.

Turner, 27, saw his streak of 12 consecutive starts for the U.S. Men's National Team come to an end on Wednesday. His international record now stands at 9-1-2 with eight shutouts. Turner started in the first two United States' qualifying matches during the October window, keeping a clean sheet in a 2-0 win over Jamaica on Oct. 7 and registering three saves in a 1-0 loss to Panama on Oct. 10.

- Reached the MLS Cup final in seven of 15 seasons as an MLS head coach, with a record 35 MLS Cup Playoff wins and 54 postseason games coached.
- Managed the U.S. Men's National Team through two separate stints (1998-2006, 2016-17) and two FIFA Men's World Cups in 2002 and 2006, and won three Gold Cup titles.
- Built a dynasty over 18 seasons as head coach at the University of Virginia, winning five NCAA Division-1 National Championships and six ACC titles.

Bruce Arena is in his third season as Sporting Director and Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on May 14, 2019. The five-time MLS Cup winner is the eighth head coach in club history and oversees all soccer operations for the New England Revolution, including head coaching duties, roster management, scouting, and the oversight of Revolution II and the Revolution Academy.

In his first two seasons at the helm in New England, Arena has led the Revolution to consecutive MLS Cup Playoff appearances, including a berth in the Eastern Conference Final in his first full season in New England. He made his return to the MLS postseason in 2019 by leading one of the most remarkable turnarounds in league history. After a 2-8-2 start had the Revolution sitting in last place in MLS, Arena went unbeaten in his first eight games on the sidelines and helped New England reach the postseason, ending a three-year drought for the club.

The team's historic turnaround in 2019 came despite Arena only making one in-season addition to the roster, bringing in Argentine striker Gustavo Bou via a club-record transfer in July. In his first offseason, Arena further bolstered the roster with a combination of MLS veterans and international signings highlighted by young Polish striker Adam Buksa. The roster improvements paid dividends as Arena led the Revolution on a run to the Eastern Conference Final in 2020, highlighted by away wins against the top-seeded Philadelphia Union and fourth-seeded Orlando City SC.

The Long Island, N.Y. native joined the Revolution with one of the most decorated coaching careers in American soccer history that has spanned more than 40 seasons at the collegiate, professional, and international levels. Arena's MLS resume includes a record five MLS Cup titles, three Supporters' Shields, seven conference championships, one U.S. Open Cup title, and one Concacaf Champions' Cup. He has reached the MLS Cup final in seven of his 15 seasons coaching in the league. Arena has earned three MLS Coach of the Year selections, tied for the most all-time, first winning the honor in 1997 with D.C. United before being recognized in 2009 and 2011 with the LA Galaxy.

With more than 250 combined regular season and postseason wins in MLS to date, and a regular season record of 218-131-105 (.596) entering 2021, Arena is the league's winningest active head coach. He is one of two coaches in league history to have surpassed 200 regular season wins and 700 career points, along with Sigi Schmid. Arena is the league's all-time leader in MLS Cup Playoff games coached with 54 (35-13-6), while his 35 playoff wins are also the most in league history.

On the international stage, Arena, 70, coached the U.S. Men's National Team over two separate stints from 1998-2006 and 2016-17, amassing the most wins in the program's history with a record of 81-35-32. He led the Stars and Stripes to a Quarterfinal finish in the 2002 FIFA Men's World Cup – the country's best showing since 1930 – as well an appearance in the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. Arena also guided the U.S. Men's National Team to more Gold Cup titles than any other coach, capturing the continental trophy three times in 2002, 2005, and 2017.

Before his time in the professional ranks, Arena began his head coaching career with one season at the University of Puget Sound (1976), before being named the head coach at the University of Virginia in 1978. During his decorated 18-year tenure at Virginia, he led the Cavaliers to five NCAA Division-1 National Championships, including four in a row from 1991-94, as well as six ACC Men's Soccer titles (1988, 1991-95). While at Virginia, Arena coached a number of American soccer legends, including Claudio Reyna, John Harkes, and current D.C. United Head Coach Ben Olsen.

In 1996, Arena received an offer to lead the United States Under-23 Men's National Team in the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta. Shortly after the Olympics, he assumed the head role with D.C. United, where he led the Black-and-Red to a 61-35 record, including the first two MLS Cup titles in 1996 and 1997, and the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup title in 1996.

Following the 1998 FIFA Men's World Cup in France, the United States Soccer Federation turned to Arena, who helped the team qualify for the 2002 FIFA Men's World Cup. In the tournament, Arena's team recorded an impressive win over powerhouse Portugal and topped Mexico, 2-0, in the Round of 16 en route to the nation's first appearance in the Quarterfinals in a 72-year span. That same year, Arena led the USMNT to the Concacaf Gold Cup title, one of his three triumphs in the competition.

In 2005, Arena won his second Concacaf Gold Cup ahead of the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup in Germany. In the 2006 tournament, the United States earned a 1-1 draw against Italy, but a 2-1 defeat to Ghana sent the USMNT home early.

The next season, Arena took charge of the New York Red Bulls, where he spent the end of the 2006 season and all of the 2007 campaign. In 2008, Arena joined the LA Galaxy for what would be an incredible nine-year tenure that included three MLS Cups in a four-year span and two Supporters' Shields in 2010 and 2011.

Following his decorated career with the Galaxy, Arena rejoined the U.S. Men's National Team in November 2016. In his second run as head coach, he lost only two out of 18 games at the helm, though the United States fell short of qualification for the 2018 FIFA Men's World Cup.

A 2010 National Soccer Hall of Fame inductee, Arena was named the 2015 Werner Fricker Builder Award recipient, earning U.S. Soccer's highest honor for his more than 40 years of service to the game.

A talented lacrosse player, Arena grew up on Long Island and would go on to attend Nassau Community College, where he played both lacrosse and soccer. Arena then transferred to Cornell University in 1971, where as a goalkeeper, he led his team to the 1972 NCAA College Cup Final Four and earned the tournament's Most Valuable Defensive Player award. During the 1973 season, Arena contributed as an assistant coach with Cornell, before then accepting a head coaching position at the University of Puget Sound.

Off the field, Arena has authored a number of books and is a member of the NJCAA Lacrosse Hall of Fame, after receiving induction in 2008. He and his wife, Phyllis, live in Boston. Arena's son, Kenny, was an assistant coach under his father with the LA Galaxy from 2014-16, before joining the staff of Los Angeles FC in 2018, where he currently serves as an assistant coach.

CURT ONALFO
TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Curt Onalfo is in his third season as Technical Director of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on June 2, 2019. In his role, Onalfo works closely with Sporting Director Bruce Arena managing the club's day-to-day soccer operations, including oversight of Revolution II, the Revolution Academy and the scouting department.

The Sao Paulo, Brazil native and Ridgefield, Conn. product joins the Revolution following an extensive coaching and playing career in Major League Soccer and with the United States Men's National Team. Onalfo has won MLS Cup as both a player and a coach, including one as a member of D.C. United in 1999, and three as an assistant coach with the LA Galaxy in 2011, 2012, and 2014.

Onalfo owns 12 total years of MLS coaching experience, highlighted by stints as head coach of D.C. United (2010), the then-Kansas City Wizards (2007-09), and the LA Galaxy (2017). While continuing as an assistant with the Galaxy, he also served as the inaugural head coach of USL Championship side LA Galaxy II from 2014-16, where he led the club to a Western Conference title in 2015. When he departed "Los Dos" to take over head coaching duties with the Galaxy first team, his overall record with the developmental side finished at 46-29-20.

On the international level, Onalfo spent six years as an assistant coach for the United States Men's National Team under Bruce Arena. He served as an assistant for the USMNT from 2002-07 – including at the 2002 and 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup™ – and also worked as an assistant with the U.S. Under-23 MNT in 2002. Prior to joining the Revolution, he most recently assisted the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team from 2018 through May 2019, including in Poland at the FIFA U-20 Men's World Cup™, and briefly served as acting head coach of the U-19 side for a training camp in January 2019.

Onalfo, 50, entered the coaching ranks an assistant with D.C. United in 2000 following his retirement. He remained with the Black and Red until September 2002, briefly serving as interim head coach in 2001. After his time in the U.S. Men's National Team setup, Onalfo was appointed head coach of the Kansas City Wizards shortly after the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. He led Kansas City for two-and-a-half seasons, compiling a 27-29-22 record, and helped the club reach the postseason twice, including a Western Conference Finals appearance in 2007. In December 2009, Onalfo was named head coach of D.C. United, where he would remain for eight months before departing the club.

After starring for Ridgefield High School, Onalfo played collegiately for Bruce Arena at the University of Virginia from 1987-1990. In four seasons with the Cavaliers, he earned a pair of All-ACC First Team selections and helped the team win the 1988 ACC Championship. He began his professional career with French side La Ciotat in 1991, before featuring for the Connecticut Wolves of the USISL from 1994-95, and Mexican second division side Tampico Madero in 1995.

Onalfo was selected by the LA Galaxy in the inaugural MLS Draft and would make 13 appearances for the club in 1996, helping it reach the first ever MLS Cup. The defender went on to register 23 appearances across four seasons in MLS, spending additional time with San Jose (1997) and D.C. United (1998-99). He recorded one international cap with the U.S. Men's National Team and featured extensively at the youth level, including the 1989 FIFA World Youth Championship, the 1991 Pan American Games, and the 1992 Summer Olympics.

Onalfo's journey took a detour soon after the 1992 Olympics, when a diagnosis of stage three Hodgkin's disease at the age of 24 disrupted his career and nearly ended his life. After surviving his arduous battle with cancer, Onalfo resumed his playing career with Connecticut and then Mexican side Tampico FC, before joining the Galaxy for the inaugural MLS season.


REMI ROY
DIRECTOR OF SCOUTING & PRO PERSONNEL

Remi Roy is currently in his 12th season with the New England Revolution and his fourth as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel, having been named to the position in January 2018. Roy has been with the club since 2010, previously serving as an assistant coach with New England for eight seasons.

In his current role, Roy is focused on scouting and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with the Revolution technical staff in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the organization, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the Revs' first-team goalkeepers and also provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revs' coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy helped Bobby Shuttleworth establish himself as one of the league's premier goalkeepers since his debut in 2010. In 2016, Roy's guidance helped Brad Knighton start a career-high 13 matches, including six wins.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy was also a member of the Region III goalkeeping staff. Additionally, he served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

In addition to his various coaching positions, Roy spent five years as a player-coach in the United Soccer League (USL) with the Syracuse Salty Dogs (2003) and the Virginia Beach Mariners (2004-07).

Roy played collegiately at the University of Mobile from 1997-99. In his final season in 1999, Roy garnered all-conference, all-region, and All-American honors. He also played five seasons in the Premier Development League (PDL) with the Jackson Chargers (1998-99), Des Moines Menace (2000), and the Spokane Shadow (2001).

Roy holds a USSF "A" License and Level I and II NSCAA Goalkeeping Licenses. A native of Petit-Rocher, New Brunswick, Canada, Roy lives south of Boston with his wife and three kids.

**RICHIE WILLIAMS****ASSISTANT COACH**

Richie Williams is in his third season as an assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Bruce Arena's staff in June 2019. Williams brings 16 years of coaching experience in Major League Soccer, USL Championship, and the United States Men's National Team to New England. He most recently served as the first ever head coach of USL Championship side Loudoun United FC.

During the 2020 season, Williams coached the Revolution through three unbeaten games in August 2020 in place of a suspended Bruce Arena, leading New England to a 1-0-2 mark.

A native of Middletown Township, N.J., Williams has previously served as either an assistant coach or head coach for seven different teams over the course of his coaching career. Prior to managing Loudoun United in 2019, he served as an assistant coach for the United States Men's National Team from 2017-18. In addition, he has served as an assistant for Real Salt Lake in 2016, the U.S. U-17 MNT from 2012-15, the U.S. U-18 MNT from 2011-12, the New York Red Bulls from 2006-11 -- where he also completed two stints as interim head coach in 2006 and 2009 -- and the University of Virginia from 2005-06.

Williams enjoyed a successful playing career prior to entering the coaching ranks. He played under Bruce Arena at multiple stops during his career, including at the University of Virginia from 1988-91, D.C. United from 1996-98, and the United States Men's National Team from 1998-2002. Together, Arena and Williams won an NCAA Championship at the University of Virginia in 1991, before helping D.C. United to three consecutive MLS Cup appearances, including championships in 1996 and 1997.

The former midfielder also earned 20 international caps with the USMNT under Arena, highlighted by a CONCACAF Gold Cup title in 2002. He also spent time with the Richmond Kickers in 1993 and 2004-05, Scottish side Ayr United FC from 1993-94, and the New York/New Jersey MetroStars in 2001 and 2003.

**DAVE VAN DEN BERGH****ASSISTANT COACH**

Dave van den Bergh is in his third season as Assistant Coach for the New England Revolution after joining the club's staff in June 2019. Van den Bergh, 44, arrived in New England following nine years as a coach with various United States Youth National teams.

The Amsterdam native served as assistant coach for the United States Under-20 Men's National Team in 2019 and from 2010-16, head coach of the

United States Under-19 Men's National Team in 2018, and head coach of the United States Under-15s from 2016-18. Van den Bergh recorded a 6-0-4 record as head of the U.S. U-15s, and helped guide the U-20s to consecutive Quarterfinal appearances in the 2015 and 2019 FIFA U-20 World Cups.

Van den Bergh enjoyed a decorated playing career from 1995-2009, featuring extensively in the Dutch Eredivisie, La Liga, and Major League Soccer. He began his career with Dutch powerhouse Ajax in 1995 after spending 10 years in the club's academy. Van den Bergh made 12 appearances across three seasons for Ajax -- highlighted by a league title in the 1995-96 season -- before moving to Spanish side Rayo Vallecano, where he logged 47 appearances from 1997-2000. He returned to the Eredivisie in 2000, joining FC Utrecht. The winger scored 29 goals across 184 games played for Utrecht, and led the club to consecutive Dutch Cup wins in 2003 and 2004, as well a Dutch Super Cup title in 2004.

Van den Bergh signed with the Kansas City Wizards of Major League Soccer in 2006. After one season with Kansas City, he joined the New York Red Bulls, where he played under Bruce Arena in 2007. Following two seasons with New York, Van den Bergh featured for FC Dallas in 2009. On the international stage, Van den Bergh collected two caps with the Netherlands in 2004.

**KEVIN HITCHCOCK****ASSISTANT COACH**

Kevin Hitchcock is in his third season as Assistant Coach for the New England Revolution after joining the club's staff in April 2019. Hitchcock brings nearly two decades of professional coaching experience in the top flights of England, Qatar, and India, as well as a decorated 18-year playing career in England, to New England.

Hitchcock, who owns a UEFA 'A' Goalkeeper License and UEFA 'B' License, spent the previous 18 years as a first-team goalkeeper coach with several top-flight clubs. His experience includes stints with Watford FC (2001-04), Blackburn Rovers FC (2004-08), Manchester City FC (2008-10), Fulham FC (2011), Queens Park Rangers (2012-15), Al Arabi Sports Club (2015-16), and Birmingham City FC (2016-18). Most recently, Hitchcock spent one year as the goalkeepers coach for Indian Super League side Chennaiyin FC.

Hitchcock has coached and developed a number of elite professional goalkeepers, including Joe Hart, Kasper Schmeichel, Shay Given, Robert Green, Julio César, and Mark Schwarzer, among others.

Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Hitchcock registered nearly 300 appearances across an 18-year playing career in England, highlighted by two FA Cups, one League Cup, one Cup Winners Cup, and one Super Cup with Chelsea FC. In total, he recorded 96 appearances for The Blues from 1988-2001, also completing loan assignments to West Ham United FC (1993) and Northampton Town FC (1990) during his time with the club. Prior to joining Chelsea, Hitchcock began his professional career with Mansfield Town FC, where he made 168 appearances from 1984-88. At the youth level, he played with both Nottingham Forest FC and Barking F.C.

**JARRYD PHILLIPS****DIRECTOR OF SPORTS PERFORMANCE**

Jarryd Phillips is in his third season as Director of Sports Performance for the New England Revolution after joining Bruce Arena's staff in June 2019. He brings seven years of experience as a sports science and performance coach to the position, including time spent in MLS, USL, NASL, and the NCAA.

Phillips arrived in New England after spending nearly three years as Director of Performance & Sports Science for Minnesota United FC. He established and directed all facets of the performance department for Minnesota's first team and academy beginning in July 2016, as the club prepared to ascend from the NASL to MLS in 2017. In his role with the Loons, he oversaw all nutritional aspects of the squad, administered strength and fitness programs, and participated in daily training sessions.

Prior to joining Minnesota, Phillips spent nearly two seasons as a performance coach with Seattle Sounders FC from January 2015 through July 2016. Before entering the professional coaching ranks, he worked as an assistant coach at the University of Mary in North Dakota from 2013-14. Phillips began his coaching career with the Premier Development League's Thunder Bay Chill in 2012.

Phillips earned his undergraduate degree at the University of Maine before attending graduate school at the University of Mary in South Dakota, where he received a master's degree in kinesiology and exercise science. He holds USSF and UEFA coaching licenses and is an NSCA Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS).

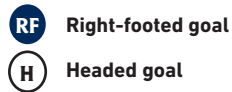

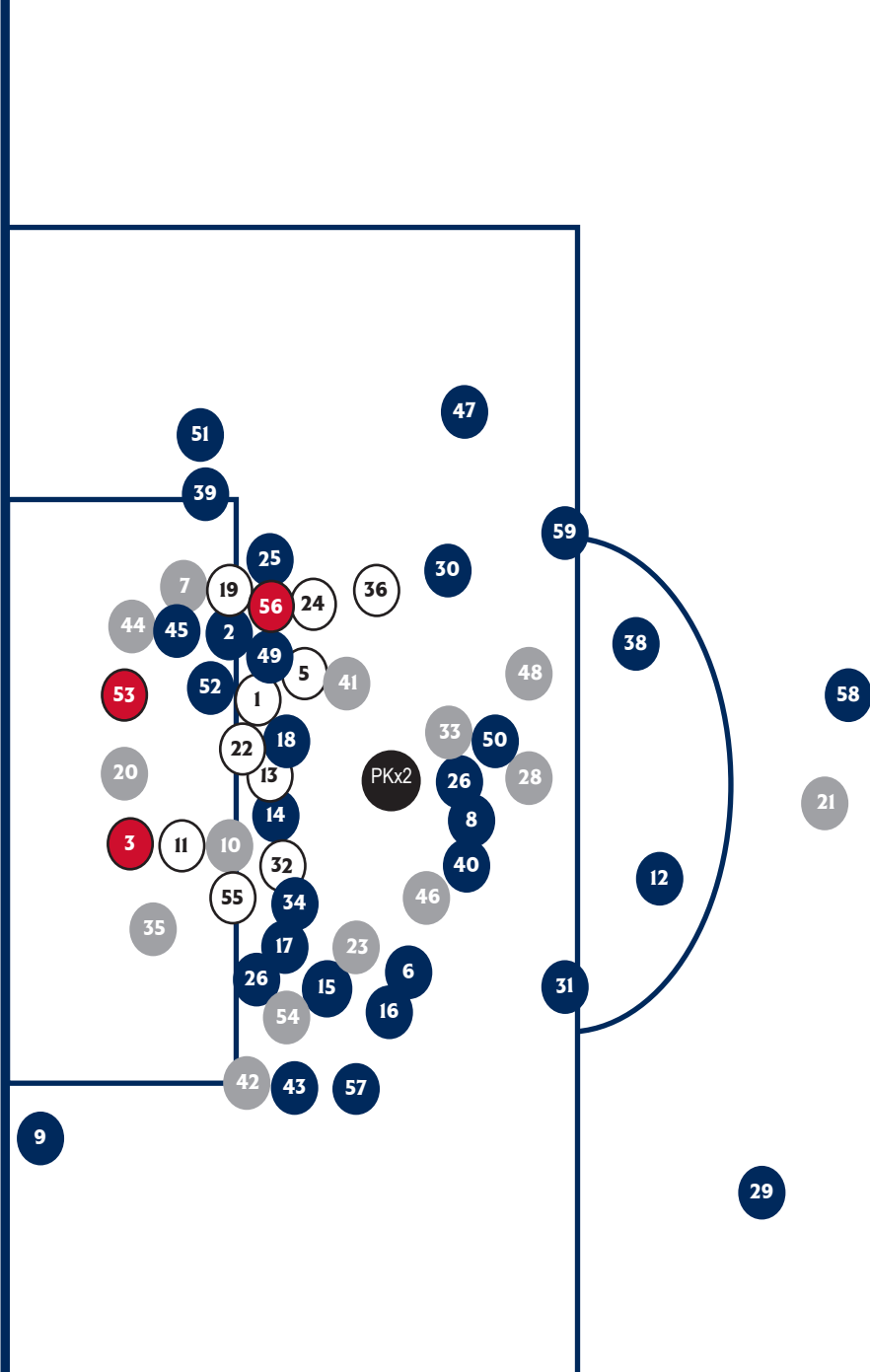
