## NEW CREST USHERS IN NEW ERA FOR REVOLUTION

The New England Revolution unveiled a new crest and brand identity ahead of the 2022 Major League Soccer campaign, the club's 27th season. Rooted in the region's history as the birthplace of the American Revolution and the resilient spirit of the people of New England, the Revolution's new crest reflects the evolution of one of Major League Soccer's founding clubs.



The Revolution's new logo and identity are the culmination of several years' work that began with hearing directly from fans. The club enlisted an independent third party to conduct focus groups consisting of New Englanders, ranging from loyal Revolution supporters to Boston sports fans, to elicit feedback about what professional soccer in New England should represent. The resounding feedback informed the process that resulted in the evolution of the club's identity unveiled today.

The Revolution's new logo features a stylized "R", invoking the club's name, in a style reminiscent of the Revolutionary War era. A red strikethrough of the R roots the club's identity in the defiant and patriotic spirit of the American Revolution. The seal is bordered by a design emblematic of traditional flag drapery with details embodying patriotic bunting. To form the official crest, the club's full name and inaugural season – 1996 – are inscribed in a circle with a navy-blue border.

### PUMAS UNAM

Pumas UNAM is making its fifth appearance in the Concacaf Champions League since the tournament was restructured in 2008, and its first berth in the continental competition since 2016-17. A semifinalist in the 2012 iteration and three-time champion of the the previously-named Concacaf Champions Cup (1980, 1982, & 1989), Pumas qualified for this year's tournament as runner-up of the Liga MX 2020-21 Apertura (first half of the season), but finished in seventh place of the overall 2020-21 Liga MX table.

## WHAT TO WATCH FOR AGAINST PUMAS

### TEAM:

- The Revolution appearing in international competition for the first time since 2010 and in Concacaf Champions League for the first time since 2008.
- New England competing in a continental tournament for the first time since 2010, when the Revolution finished as runners-up in the North American SuperLiga.
- The Revolution improving on an 0-2-0 all-time record in Concacaf Champions League play.
- The Revolution potentially winning their second trophy in international competition, adding to the 2008 North American SuperLiga.
- New England potentially becoming the sixth MLS team to win a continental tournament. The Revolution are one of four MLS sides still competing in the Concacaf Champions League along with Seattle, Montreal, and New York City.
- The Revolution continuing a stretch of three home matches within an eight-day window, with New England resuming its MLS schedule next Saturday night (7:30 p.m. ET) against Real Salt Lake.
- New England building on its 14-20-12 record across all competitions in the month of March.

### INDIVIDUAL:

- Revolution Sporting Director and Head Coach **Bruce Arena**, who became the winningest regular season coach in MLS history last Saturday with league win No. 241, improving upon his 43-18-25 record across all competitions with New England.
- Arena** coaching his third different team (D.C. United, LA Galaxy) in a Concacaf continental tournament. Arena won the Concacaf Champions Cup in 1998 with D.C. United.
- Arena** improving on his 15-9-6 record in Concacaf club tournaments.
- D Andrew Farrell** (299) potentially playing in his 300th game across all competitions, just behind Matt Reis' total of 301 (2nd) and Shalrie Joseph's Revolution record of 305 all-competition appearances.
- D Omar Gonzalez** playing in SCCL for the second straight year, after featuring in the tournament with Toronto FC in 2021. Gonzalez was a member of the C.F. Pachuca side that won the tournament in 2017.
- Gonzalez** adding to his team-best 28 SCCL appearances and playing 26 minutes to surpass 2,500 minutes played in SCCL.
- F Jozy Altidore** adding to his team-leading three goals scored in SCCL competition.
- M Carles Gil**, the reigning 2021 Landon Donovan MLS MVP, potentially finding the scoresheet for the third consecutive match to open the 2022 campaign.
- D A.J. DeLaGarza** potentially making his 25th career SCCL appearance, second most on the team behind his former LA Galaxy teammate **Omar Gonzalez**.
- GK Earl Edwards Jr.** potentially seeing his first career SCCL action in net and his third consecutive start across all competitions to begin 2022. Edwards collected his first MLS clean sheet on March 5 vs. FC Dallas.
- Any Revolution player scoring three goals in SCCL play to tie the Revs record for goals in international competition (3 - Kheli Dube, Kenny Mansally).

**KING OF THE GIL: REIGNING MLS MVP ENTERS 2022**

In 2021, Revolution captain **Carles Gil** became the second player in club history to take home the Landon Donovan Major League Soccer Most Valuable Player award. Gil, who earned MLS Player of the Month for June, an MLS All-Star selection, and the MLS Comeback Player of the Year award, recorded 18 assists on the season, one shy of the club record.

Since his arrival in MLS in 2019, Gil has transformed the New England attack through his chance creation and attacking prowess. Despite missing most of the 2020 campaign, Gil has compiled the most assists in MLS since the start of the 2019 season across both the regular season and playoffs:

**ARENA SETS MLS WINS RECORD**

**Bruce Arena**, who won his MLS-record fourth Supporters' Shield title in 2021, continues climbing the MLS record books as he enters his 18th season as an MLS head coach. With New England's win over FC Dallas on March 5, 2022, Arena became the league's all-time leader in regular season wins, passing the late Sigi Schmid (240). Arena was already the winningest coach in the history of the MLS playoffs (35 wins) and the U.S. Men's National Team program.

Arena owns 276 combined regular season and postseason wins in MLS, more than any other coach. In 2019, he became the second coach in MLS history to eclipse 700 regular season points earned, joining Sigi Schmid (843). Entering 2022, his all-time regular season record stands at 241-136-113 (39-15-24 with New England).

TEAM NOTES

REVS CHASING ELUSIVE CONTINENTAL CROWN

Since Major League Soccer began play in 1996, the success and popularity of the sport domestically has skyrocketed, with league expansion and talent both growing exponentially over the past 26 years. While club success in domestic competition has been ample, it's success in continental competitions that has remained elusive for MLS outfits.

Since 1996, only five MLS clubs have won a continental title, including the New England Revolution's 2008 North American SuperLiga trophy. In recent years, the disparity between MLS and Liga MX has begun to evaporate. In 2021, for the first time, the MLS All-Stars and Liga MX All-Stars faced off, with the American side claiming a win on penalties as Revolution goalkeeper Matt Turner saved two penalties in the shootout.

As New England enters the Concacaf Champions League for the first time since 2008, also the club's first foray into a continental tournament since 2010, the Revolution are looking not only to notch their first Champions League victory, but to make history as the first American side to win CCL since the competition was restructured 15 years ago.



Only two MLS teams have ever won the Concacaf Champions Cup, prior to its transformation to the current Champions League format: the 2000 LA Galaxy and the 1998 D.C. United.

The 1998 D.C. United team was coached by **Bruce Arena**, with a roster featuring current Assistant Coach **Richie Williams**, Revolution II Head Coach **Clint Peay**, and Revolution Technical Director **Curt Onalfo**. Arena also led the LA Galaxy to the 2013 Concacaf Champions League semifinals.

NEWCOMERS ADD CHAMPIONS LEAGUE EXPERIENCE

For the first time in 14 years, the New England Revolution are back in the Scotiabank Concacaf Champions League following a record-breaking 2021 season that saw the club capture its first Supporters' Shield and set an MLS record with 73 points.

New England bolstered its roster over the offseason, adding several veteran players with previous Champions League experience. Among those reinforcements is defender **Omar Gonzalez**, who leads all current Revolution players with 28 career appearances in the Champions League with the LA Galaxy, Toronto FC, and Mexican club Pachuca. Gonzalez won the 2017 Champions League with Pachuca.

**A.J. DeLaGarza**, **Tommy McNamara**, **Sebastian Lletget**, and **Emmanuel Boateng** complete the group of current Revolution players with prior Champions League experience.

ALTIDORE BRINGS SCORING PEDIGREE TO BALANCED ATTACK

The New England Revolution acquired forward Jozy Altidore via free agency on Feb. 14, 2022. Altidore, a two-time U.S. Soccer Male Player of the Year with more than 195 career goals and 550 games played for club and country, joins the Revolution for his 11th MLS season as he continues a decorated career that includes participation in two FIFA World Cups, MLS Cup MVP honors, a Dutch Cup title, and more than 200 appearances in European club competition.

For his MLS career with the New York Red Bulls (2006-08), where he played under Bruce Arena, and Toronto FC (2015-21), Altidore has tallied 77 goals with 25 assists, along with nine additional playoff goals. One of the most decorated goalscorers in MLS and U.S. Soccer history, Altidore ranks seventh among active MLS players in career goals and has maintained an average of 156 minutes per goal throughout his MLS career:

GUSTAVO BOU A CONSISTENT ATTACKING THREAT

Forward **Gustavo Bou** has been one of Major League Soccer's top attacking players since entering the league in 2019. Bou enjoyed an electric season in 2021, scoring 15 goals to rank second on the Revolution, along with nine assists.

The Argentine ranks second in MLS in combined goals and assists in regular season play since he arrived in MLS in July 2019 with a total of 43 direct goal involvements. Bou's 29 goals in regular season play since arriving in New England and his 28 goals from open play across all competitions are both third most in MLS dating back to his debut on July 17, 2019:

The 2021 MLS All-Star was recognized for his blistering scoring pace with his first selection to the MLS Best XI. Bou scored five times across six games in July, adding one assist, as the Revs went 4-1-1 in the month. It marks the first time in Revolution history the club has produced back-to-back Player of the Month winners, following **Carles Gil**'s honor in June.

Bou's 15 total goals on the season ranked tied for eighth in the MLS Golden Boot race, one behind teammate **Adam Buksa** (16), who finished tied for fifth in goals this season. Since the strike pairing joined forces ahead of the 2020 MLS campaign, Bou and Buksa rank in the top three in MLS in expected goals + expected assists during the regular season, according to American Soccer Analysis.

Bou has scored at a rate that puts him in elite company. His 0.48 goals per game ranks second in club history, while his rate of 0.55 goals per 90 minutes played is tied with Adam Buksa for second in club annals behind Taylor Twellman.

The Revolution have lost only once when Bou scores a goal, posting a 21-1-8 record across all competitions. The Revs are 5-0-2 record in games when Bou tallies in the 85th minute or later.

300 CLUB: FARRELL NEARING MORE CLUB SERVICE RECORDS

In 2021, defender **Andrew Farrell** set new career highs for games started and minutes played in a season. The ninth-year pro became the Revolution's all-time leader in MLS regular season games played (274), games started (271), and minutes played (24,192).

**Farrell** has been an ironman since he entered the league, leading all MLS players in games played, games started, and minutes played since 2013. Farrell, who played all but 90 minutes in 2021, has never missed more than five games in a season.

While the defender set Revolution service records in MLS regular season play, he continues to inch closer to the club's all-time records across all competitions. Throughout his Revolution career, including MLS Cup Playoffs and U.S. Open Cup, Farrell has logged 26,446 minutes across 299 matches, 294 of which he started.

TURNER'S SHOT-STOPPING RATES ARE HISTORIC

The 2021 Allstate MLS Goalkeeper of the Year and an MLS Best XI selection, Revolution goalkeeper **Matt Turner** ranked atop the charts in several advanced and traditional statistical categories, including goals allowed minus expected goals allowed. On Feb. 11, 2022, the Revolution agreed to terms for Turner to join Arsenal of the English Premier League in a summer transfer for an undisclosed fee.

For his MLS career, Turner has totaled -27.42 goals saved above expected, the best total in MLS since the statistic began being tracked by American Soccer Analysis in 2013. Turner's impressive total comes despite him playing only four of the nine seasons during that span and seeing approximately 10,000 fewer minutes than the three next-closest players.

In the 2021 MLS All-Star Game, Turner stopped two penalties in a shootout to give the MLS All-Stars a win over the Liga MX All-Stars and earn All-Star Game MVP honors. He was also capped 13 times by the United States Men's National Team, a record for most appearances by a goalkeeper in their debut year, and set a new USMNT mark with nine clean sheets in a calendar year.

REVS II PIPELINE CONTINUES TO SHOW RESULTS

Since the New England Revolution launched Revolution II ahead of the 2020 season, the club has completely transformed its pathway from its elite youth teams to the professional ranks. In only two seasons, five different players have ascended from Revolution II to sign with the first team, most recently the club's eighth Homegrown Player, **Noel Buck** and defender **Ryan Spaulding**.

Buck, 16, is one of 30 players, along with Maciel and Bell, to make his professional debut with Revolution II since the club began play in 2020, and one of 18 current or former Academy players to do so. Buck signed his first professional contract with Revolution II in June 2021, one of six Academy players to sign a pro deal directly to the second team from the club's youth ranks: **Meny Silva, Dennis Ramirez, Colby Quinones, Hikaru Fujiwara,** and **Esmir Bajraktarevic**.

Spaulding, 23, signed with Revolution II on January 16, 2020 and played two seasons with the USL League One side, setting team records in games played (42), starts (38), minutes (3,402) while totaling four goals and three assists in that span. A resident of Cary, N.C., Spaulding earned eight elections to the USL League One Team of the Week over the past two years and was one of three defenders named to the 2021 All-USL League One First Team, the first Revolution II player to earn the honor.

REVS RESILIENT WHEN SCORING FIRST UNDER ARENA

The Revolution have struck first in each of their opening two contests of the 2022 MLS regular season, posting a 1-0-1 record in those games. With their 1-0 victory over FC Dallas on March 5, the Revs extended their unbeaten streak to 34 games in matches where New England scores the opening goal -- dating back to March 7, 2020.

The last time New England lost when scoring first came on Feb. 29, 2020 in a 2-1 defeat at Montreal to open the season. Since then, the Revolution have compiled 28-0-6 record across both the regular season and playoffs when striking first, outscoring opponents 71-32 in those contests. New England coach Bruce Arena has also notably never lost in his career during the postseason when his team has scored first (29-0-3), including three victories with New England.

Since the start of 2020, New England has compiled the third-most wins and the second-best record when scoring first in regular season contests. The Revolution's one defeat in such games is also tied for the second-fewest in MLS, with Seattle going unbeaten in that span:

HELLO GOOD BYE: REVS INK RIGHT BACK TO NEW DEAL

New England recently re-signed defender **Brandon Bye** to a three-year contract extension through the 2024 MLS season. Bye, selected by New England with the eighth-overall pick in 2018 out of Western Michigan, has established himself as one of the league's premier right backs with his athleticism and playmaking offensively coupled with superior aerial ability.

In New England's first match of the 2022 season, Bye matched a career high winning nine of his 13 aerials. Since entering MLS in 2018, Bye is one of the league leaders in aerials won, doing so at a 60 percent success rate, and ranks first among fullbacks:

HERE TO STAY: DEJUAN JONES POISED FOR BIG YEAR

Defender **DeJuan Jones** enjoyed a career year in 2021, his third season at the professional level, tallying three goals and five assists while more than doubling his previous career high with 2,546 minutes played. For his efforts, Jones was the only outside back to finish in the top five of 2021 MLS Defender of the Year voting.

U.S. Men's National Team Head Coach Gregg Berhalter also took notice of Jones' big year, calling the Lansing, Mich. native in to the USMNT's 2022 January Preparation Camp in Phoenix, Ariz. The call-up marked Jones' first national team participation at any age level.

Jones, who established himself as one of the league's top left backs and played a crucial role in the Revolution's backline throughout the season, signed a three-year contract extension with the club to remain in New England through the 2024 MLS season.

Drafted by New England with the 11th-overall pick in the 2019 MLS Super-Draft, Jones has brought an attacking mentality to his defensive position. In 2021, he ranked among the top-five MLS defenders in chances created (37), assists (5), and goals (3) during the regular season. To open the 2022 campaign, Jones registered an assist and two chances created:

REVS SET MULTIPLE CLUB, MLS RECORDS IN 2021

The Revolution won the Supporters' Shield for the first time in club history and set a new league mark with 73 regular season points for a rate of 2.15 points per game, eclipsing the previous MLS single-season records for points (72 - LAFC, 2019) and points per game (2.13 - LA Galaxy, 1998). New England also matched the league's highest winning percentage of all time (.750 - three times).

The Revolution won the Eastern Conference by a 19-point margin, the largest-ever margin of victory atop an MLS conference surpassing the previous mark of 16 points set by Los Angeles FC (2019) and San Jose (2015). The Revolution also matched the largest margin of victory for a Supporters' Shield winner by posting a 12-point edge over second place Colorado.

**STARS ALIGN: FORMER GALAXY PLAYERS REUNITE WITH ARENA**

New England made an early splash during the offseason, acquiring U.S. international **Sebastian Lletget** in a trade with the LA Galaxy. New England then signed former Galaxy and Toronto FC defender **Omar Gonzalez**. The duo, who were teammates on the Galaxy from 2015-16, reunite with their former coach, **Bruce Arena**, and fellow former teammates **Emmanuel Boateng** and **A.J. DeLaGarza**.

Gonzalez was signed with New England as a free agent following a three-year stint with Toronto FC. The 33-year-old brings a championship pedigree to the Revolution as the owner of three MLS Cup titles (2011, 2012, and 2014), two Supporters' Shields (2010 and 2011), four MLS Best XI selections (2010, 2011, 2013, and 2014), and one MLS Defender of the Year award (2011), all won under Arena's leadership with the LA Galaxy. In addition, Gonzalez won a Liga MX championship and the 2017 Conca-caf Champions League title with C.F. Pachuca. Gonzalez has totaled 244 regular season appearances with 16 goals and 12 assists across 10 MLS seasons along with 52 caps with the United States Men's National Team.

Lletget, 29, arrives in New England following a seven-year stint with the LA Galaxy in which he made 158 MLS appearances, registering 23 goals and 27 assists, from 2015 to 2021. The 2021 MLS All-Star midfielder logged three goals and five assists in 26 appearances for the Galaxy this past season. His postseason career totals include six starts and two goals. On the international stage, the San Francisco native has been capped 33 times by the United States Men's National Team since his debut under Arena in January 2017.



**SUPER SUB: BOATENG SPARKS REVS OFF THE BENCH**

Revolution midfielder **Emmanuel Boateng** was a major contributor off the bench down the stretch last year. Despite only playing 382 minutes across both the regular season and playoffs, Boateng recorded two goals and five assists, including one game-winning goal and an additional winning assist. In the Revs' lone playoff game, Boateng delivered the crucial assist on Tajon Buchanan's dramatic extra time equalizer.

In his limited playing time, Boateng was one of the most effective players in MLS, finishing the 2021 season as the league leader in assists per 90 minutes. Fellow Revolution teammate Carles Gil, the MLS MVP, finished second to Boateng in assists per 90 minutes last season.

**YOUNG BUCK: REVS INK 16-YEAR-OLD HOMEGROWN**

The New England Revolution signed 2021 UnitedHealthcare Academy Player of the Year **Noel Buck**, 16, to a Homegrown Player contract ahead of the 2022 season. The Arlington, Mass. native, who has been developing in the Revolution Academy since age 12, becomes the eighth Revolution Academy product to ascend to the first team roster.

Born in April 2005, the 16-year-old becomes the youngest active member of the Revolution's MLS roster, and the club's second-youngest Homegrown Player signing to date. Only Diego Fagundez, the club's first Homegrown Player, was younger when he signed with the Revolution in 2010.



The Revolution Academy product signed his first professional contract with Revolution II in June 2021 and finished the season as one of two players to appear in all 28 league games. The teenager ranked second on the team with five goals and added one assist.

Buck joined the New England Revolution Academy in 2017 at the age of 12 and made 70 appearances across all age levels for the program. He totaled 12 goals at the youth level while playing as both a forward and midfielder. During the abbreviated 2020-21 MLS NEXT campaign, Buck suited up six times for the U-17s, scoring one goal and registering two assists. The 16-year-old also joined the Under-17 side during the MLS NEXT Winter Showcase in December, where he featured in three matches with one goal and one assist.

**SUPERDRAFT PICK JACOB JACKSON MAKES HISTORY**

The New England Revolution signed goalkeeper Jacob Jackson, the 24th-overall selection in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft, to a one-year MLS contract with additional club options through the 2025 MLS season. Jackson, 21, makes history as the first goalkeeper ever taken by the Revolution in the first round of the MLS SuperDraft and joins five other first-round picks on the Revolution roster.

During the 2021 spring season, in which Jackson started nine matches for Loyola Marymount, posting a 6-0-3 record and allowing just two goals over 270 minutes. The Escondido, Calif. native was named the West Coast Conference Goalkeeper of the Year and an All-WCC First Team selection in each of the last two seasons, ranking sixth in the nation with a 0.67 goals against average as a senior during the fall of 2021.

Among goalkeepers selected in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft, Jackson ranked third in career GAA, posting an 0.68 mark over three seasons:

• New England Revolution II has been building their roster ahead of the inaugural MLS NEXT Pro season, adding a pair of defenders and three Brazilian players, pending league and federation approval and receipt of their international transfer certificates (ITC).

Ítalo, 20, joins Revolution II from Clube de Regatas do Flamengo, where he was a central part of their Under-20 side in 2021. The João Pessoa, Brazil native appeared in 24 matches with Flamengo's U-20s last season, logging over 1,300 minutes played. Ryan, 20, joins New England after notching four goals in 29 matches for Botafogo's Under-20 team this season across more than 1,200 minutes played. Dias, 20, comes to New England on a one-year loan from Brazilian club Vasco de Gama. The forward appeared in 87 matches, logging over 3,700 minutes, with 21 goals scored across all competitions.

DeShields signed his first professional contract with Revolution II on Nov. 30, 2020, but did not appear with the team before joining D.C. United for the 2021 campaign. In his collegiate days, DeShields played in 60 games with 49 starts for Wake Forest University, logging over 4,000 minutes with three goals, including two game-winners.

Revolution II also signed defender Ben Reveno to an MLS NEXT Pro professional contract. Reveno, 23, was drafted 52nd overall by New England in the 2022 MLS SuperDraft. The defender played five seasons of collegiate soccer, including two at UC Irvine and three at UCLA. Reveno made 49 appearances for the Bruins, including 47 starts, with one goal and six assists. As a redshirt senior in 2021, he logged a career-high 1,570 minutes between central defense and outside back.

The Revolution II roster currently stands at 15 players, including the following 10 returning players from the 2021 roster: Esmir Bajraktarevic, Pierre Cayet, Michel Costa da Silva, Hikaru Fujiwara, Yannik Oettl, Sean O'Hearn, Marzuq Puckerin, Colby Quiñones, Jake Rozhansky, and Meny Silva.

• Revolution II opened its preseason campaign on Feb. 26 with a 1-1 draw at Gillette Stadium against USL Championship side Hartford Athletic. Recent Homegrown Player signing Noel Buck tallied the lone goal for Revs II, with fellow first team players Edward Kizza and Damian Rivera also featuring in the match. Academy goalkeepers Max Weinstein (2004 - Burlington, Vt.) and Ryan Carney (2006 - Dunstable, Mass.) split the match in net, with the latter posting a second-half shutout.

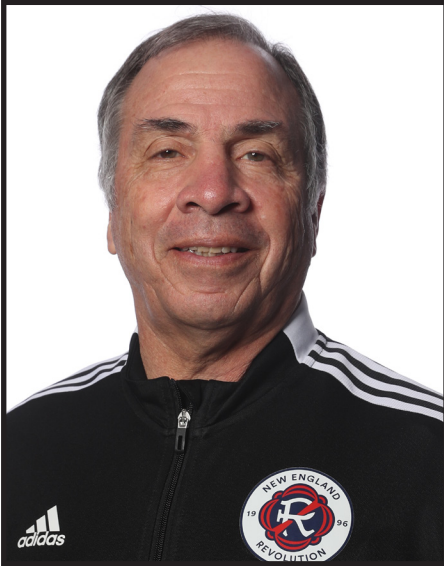

**BRUCE ARENA****SPORTING DIRECTOR & HEAD COACH**

- Named the Revolution's sporting director and the club's eighth head coach on May 14, 2019.
- Won record five MLS Cup titles (1996, 1997, 2011, 2012, 2014), four MLS Coach of the Year honors, and four MLS Supporters' Shields.
- Winningest head coach in MLS regular season (241), MLS playoff (35), and U.S. Men's National Team history.
- Managed the U.S. Men's National Team through two separate stints (1998-2006, 2016-17) and two FIFA Men's World Cups in 2002 and 2006, and won three Gold Cup titles.
- Reached the MLS Cup final in seven of 17 seasons as an MLS head coach.
- Built a dynasty over 18 seasons as head coach at the University of Virginia, winning five NCAA Division-1 National Championships and six ACC titles.

Bruce Arena is in his fourth season as Sporting Director and Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on May 14, 2019. The five-time MLS Cup winner is the eighth head coach in club history and oversees all soccer operations for the New England Revolution, including head coaching duties, roster management, scouting, and the oversight of Revolution II and the Revolution Academy.

In his first three seasons at the helm in New England, Arena has revived the Revolution by leading the side to three consecutive MLS Cup Playoff appearances. His .634 winning percentage with New England is the best in club annals. Last season, Arena won his record fourth Supporters' Shield, the first in Revolution history, after guiding the team to 22 wins, 73 points, and 2.15 points per game - all MLS records. For his efforts, Arena was awarded with his league-leading fourth MLS Coach of the Year honor.

In 2020, his first full season in New England, Arena led the Revolution to the Eastern Conference Final. Arena's impact in New England was immediately evident upon his arrival in Foxborough. Arena made his return to the MLS postseason in 2019 by leading one of the most remarkable turnarounds in league history. After a 2-8-2 start had the Revolution sitting in last place in MLS, Arena went unbeaten in his first eight games at the helm and helped New England reach the postseason, ending a three-year drought for the club. The team's historic renaissance came despite Arena only making one in-season addition to the roster, bringing in Argentine striker Gustavo Bou via a club-record transfer in July.

The Long Island, N.Y. native joined the Revolution with one of the most decorated coaching careers in American soccer history that has spanned more than 40 seasons at the collegiate, professional, and international levels. Arena's MLS resume includes a record five MLS Cup titles, four Supporters' Shields, seven conference championships, one U.S. Open Cup title, and one Concacaf Champions' Cup. He has reached the MLS Cup final in seven of his 16 seasons coaching in the league. Arena has earned three MLS Coach of the Year selections, tied for the most all-time, first winning the honor in 1997 with D.C. United before being recognized in 2009 and 2011 with the LA Galaxy.

With 275 combined regular season and postseason wins in MLS to date, and a regular season record of 240-136-112 (.607) entering 2021, Arena is the league's winningest active head coach and owns the second-best winning percentage in MLS history. Arena is the league's all-time leader in MLS Cup Playoff games coached with 55 (35-13-7), while his 35 playoff wins are also the most in league history.

On the international stage, Arena, 70, coached the U.S. Men's National Team over two separate stints from 1998-2006 and 2016-17, amassing the most wins in the program's history with a record of 81-35-32. He led the Stars and Stripes to a Quarterfinal finish in the 2002 FIFA Men's World Cup - the country's best showing since 1930 - as well an appearance in the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. Arena also guided the U.S. Men's National Team to more Gold Cup titles than any other coach, capturing the continental trophy three times in 2002, 2005, and 2017.

Before his time in the professional ranks, Arena began his head coaching career with one season at the University of Puget Sound (1976), before being named the head coach at the University of Virginia in 1978. During his decorated 18-year tenure at Virginia, he led the Cavaliers to five NCAA Division-1 National Championships, including four in a row from 1991-94, as well as six ACC Men's Soccer titles (1988, 1991-95). While at Virginia, Arena coached a number of American soccer legends, including Claudio Reyna, John Harkes, and current D.C. United Head Coach Ben Olsen.

In 1996, Arena received an offer to lead the United States Under-23 Men's National Team in the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta. Shortly after the Olympics, he assumed the head role with D.C. United, where he led the Black-and-Red to a 61-35 record, including the first two MLS Cup titles in 1996 and 1997, and the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup title in 1996.

Following the 1998 FIFA Men's World Cup in France, the United States Soccer Federation turned to Arena, who helped the team qualify for the 2002 FIFA Men's World Cup. In the tournament, Arena's team recorded an impressive win over powerhouse Portugal and topped Mexico, 2-0, in the Round of 16 en route to the nation's first appearance in the Quarterfinals in a 72-year span. That same year, Arena led the USMNT to the Concacaf Gold Cup title, one of his three triumphs in the competition.

In 2005, Arena won his second Concacaf Gold Cup ahead of the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup in Germany. In the 2006 tournament, the United States earned a 1-1 draw against Italy, but a 2-1 defeat to Ghana sent the USMNT home early.

The next season, Arena took charge of the New York Red Bulls, where he spent the end of the 2006 season and all of the 2007 campaign. In 2008, Arena joined the LA Galaxy for what would be an incredible nine-year tenure that included three MLS Cups in a four-year span and two Supporters' Shields in 2010 and 2011.

Following his decorated career with the Galaxy, Arena rejoined the U.S. Men's National Team in November 2016. In his second run as head coach, he lost only two out of 18 games at the helm, though the United States fell short of qualification for the 2018 FIFA Men's World Cup. A 2010 National Soccer Hall of Fame inductee, Arena was named the 2015 Werner Fricker Builder Award recipient, earning U.S. Soccer's highest honor for his more than 40 years of service to the game.

A talented lacrosse player, Arena grew up on Long Island and would go on to attend Nassau Community College, where he played both lacrosse and soccer. Arena then transferred to Cornell University in 1971, where as a goalkeeper, he led his team to the 1972 NCAA College Cup Final Four and earned the tournament's Most Valuable Defensive Player award. During the 1973 season, Arena contributed as an assistant coach with Cornell, before then accepting a head coaching position at the University of Puget Sound.

Off the field, Arena has authored a number of books and is a member of the NJCAA Lacrosse Hall of Fame, after receiving induction in 2008. He and his wife, Phyllis, live in Boston. Arena's son, Kenny, was an assistant coach under his father with the LA Galaxy from 2014-16 and is now an assistant coach with F.C. Cincinnati.

**RICHIE WILLIAMS**  
ASSISTANT COACH

Richie Williams is in his fourth season as an assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Bruce Arena's staff in June 2019. Williams brings 16 years of coaching experience in Major League Soccer, USL Championship, and the United States Men's National Team to New England. He most recently served as the first ever head coach of USL Championship side Loudoun United FC.

During the 2020 season, Williams coached the Revolution through three unbeaten games in August 2020 in place of a suspended Bruce Arena, leading New England to a 1-0-2 mark.

A native of Middletown Township, N.J., Williams has previously served as either an assistant coach or head coach for seven different teams over the course of his coaching career. Prior to managing Loudoun United in 2019, he served as an assistant coach for the United States Men's National Team from 2017-18. In addition, he has served as an assistant for Real Salt Lake in 2016, the U.S. U-17 MNT from 2012-15, the U.S. U-18 MNT from 2011-12, the New York Red Bulls from 2006-11 -- where he also completed two stints as interim head coach in 2006 and 2009 -- and the University of Virginia from 2005-06.

Williams enjoyed a successful playing career prior to entering the coaching ranks. He played under Bruce Arena at multiple stops during his career, including at the University of Virginia from 1988-91, D.C. United from 1996-98, and the United States Men's National Team from 1998-2002. Together, Arena and Williams won an NCAA Championship at the University of Virginia in 1991, before helping D.C. United to three consecutive MLS Cup appearances, including championships in 1996 and 1997.

The former midfielder also earned 20 international caps with the USMNT under Arena, highlighted by a CONCACAF Gold Cup title in 2002. He also spent time with the Richmond Kickers in 1993 and 2004-05, Scottish side Ayr United FC from 1993-94, and the New York/New Jersey MetroStars in 2001 and 2003.



**DAVE VAN DEN BERGH**  
ASSISTANT COACH

Dave van den Bergh is in his fourth season as Assistant Coach for the New England Revolution after joining the club's staff in June 2019. Van den Bergh, 44, arrived in New England following nine years as a coach with various United States Youth National teams.

The Amsterdam native served as assistant coach for the United States Under-20 Men's National Team in 2019 and from 2010-16, head coach of the

United States Under-19 Men's National Team in 2018, and head coach of the United States Under-15s from 2016-18. Van den Bergh recorded a 6-0-4 record as head of the U.S. U-15s, and helped guide the U-20s to consecutive Quarterfinal appearances in the 2015 and 2019 FIFA U-20 World Cups.

Van den Bergh enjoyed a decorated playing career from 1995-2009, featuring extensively in the Dutch Eredivisie, La Liga, and Major League Soccer. He began his career with Dutch powerhouse Ajax in 1995 after spending 10 years in the club's academy. Van den Bergh made 12 appearances across three seasons for Ajax -- highlighted by a league title in the 1995-96 season -- before moving to Spanish side Rayo Vallecano, where he logged 47 appearances from 1997-2000. He returned to the Eredivisie in 2000, joining FC Utrecht. The winger scored 29 goals across 184 games played for Utrecht, and led the club to consecutive Dutch Cup wins in 2003 and 2004, as well a Dutch Super Cup title in 2004.

Van den Bergh signed with the Kansas City Wizards of Major League Soccer in 2006. After one season with Kansas City, he joined the New York Red Bulls, where he played under Bruce Arena in 2007. Following two seasons with New York, Van den Bergh featured for FC Dallas in 2009. On the international stage, Van den Bergh collected two caps with the Netherlands in 2004.



**KEVIN HITCHCOCK**  
ASSISTANT COACH - GOALKEEPERS

Kevin Hitchcock is in his fourth season as Assistant Coach for the New England Revolution after joining the club's staff in April 2019. Hitchcock brings nearly two decades of professional coaching experience in the top flights of England, Qatar, and India, as well as a decorated 18-year playing career in England, to New England.

Hitchcock, who owns a UEFA 'A' Goalkeeper License and UEFA 'B' License, spent the previous 18 years as a first-team goalkeeper coach with several top-flight clubs. His experience includes stints with Watford FC (2001-04), Blackburn Rovers FC (2004-08), Manchester City FC (2008-10), Fulham FC (2011), Queens Park Rangers (2012-15), Al Arabi Sports Club (2015-16), and Birmingham City FC (2016-18). Most recently, Hitchcock spent one year as the goalkeepers coach for Indian Super League side Chennaiyin FC.

Hitchcock has coached and developed a number of elite professional goalkeepers, including Joe Hart, Kasper Schmeichel, Shay Given, Robert Green, Júlio César, and Mark Schwarzer, among others.

Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Hitchcock registered nearly 300 appearances across an 18-year playing career in England, highlighted by two FA Cups, one League Cup, one Cup Winners Cup, and one Super Cup with Chelsea FC. In total, he recorded 96 appearances for The Blues from 1988-2001, also completing loan assignments to West Ham United FC (1993) and Northampton Town FC (1990) during his time with the club. Prior to joining Chelsea, Hitchcock began his professional career with Mansfield Town FC, where he made 168 appearances from 1984-88. At the youth level, he played with both Nottingham Forest FC and Barking F.C.



**SHALRIE JOSEPH**  
ASSISTANT COACH

Shalrie Joseph is in his first season as an Assistant Coach of the New England Revolution on Bruce Arena's staff. Joseph spent the last two seasons as a head coach in the Revolution Academy.

A native of St. George's, Grenada, Joseph returned to the Revolution in 2020 as a Head Coach for the Revolution Academy Under-15 team. During his first season at the helm, Joseph guided the Revolution U-15s to the semifinals of the inaugural

MLS NEXT Cup Playoffs in June 2021. Joseph continued coaching the 2006 age group in 2021-22, moving up to coach the same squad at the Under-17 level.

Joseph began his managerial debut as head coach of the Grenada National Team from 2018-19. He previously earned 20 international caps with the national team from 2002-08. As Grenada's head coach, he helped the side qualify for the 2021 Concacaf Gold Cup and earn promotion to League A in the 2019-20 Concacaf Nations League after an unbeaten 4-0-2 record in League B group play.

Joseph, 43, entered the coaching ranks following a decorated playing career that saw him record the second-most minutes played in Revolution club history. Selected 14th overall by the Revolution in the 2002 MLS SuperDraft, Joseph played for the club from 2003-2012 before returning in 2014. A general in the central midfield, Joseph led New England to three straight MLS Eastern Conference titles from 2005-07. In addition to his seven consecutive MLS All-Star selections (2005-11) and four MLS Best XI nods, both club highs, Joseph was recognized as a finalist in 2009 MLS MVP voting. For all of his contributions, Joseph was recently named to the club's All-Time Team in 2020.

**JARRYD PHILLIPS**

**DIRECTOR OF SPORTS PERFORMANCE**

Jarryd Phillips is in his fourth season as Director of Sports Performance for the New England Revolution after joining Bruce Arena's staff in June 2019. He brings seven years of experience as a sports science and performance coach to the position, including time spent in MLS, USL, NASL, and the NCAA.

Phillips arrived in New England after spending nearly three years as Director of Performance & Sports Science for Minnesota United FC. He established and directed all facets of the performance department for Minnesota's first team and academy beginning in July 2016, as the club prepared to ascend from the NASL to MLS in 2017. In his role with the Loons, he oversaw all nutritional aspects of the squad, administered strength and fitness programs, and participated in daily training sessions.

Prior to joining Minnesota, Phillips spent nearly two seasons as a performance coach with Seattle Sounders FC from January 2015 through July 2016. Before entering the professional coaching ranks, he worked as an assistant coach at the University of Mary in North Dakota from 2013-14. Phillips began his coaching career with the Premier Development League's Thunder Bay Chill in 2012.

Phillips earned his undergraduate degree at the University of Maine before attending graduate school at the University of Mary in South Dakota, where he received a master's degree in kinesiology and exercise science. He holds USSF and UEFA coaching licenses and is an NSCA Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS).



**CURT ONALFO**

**TECHNICAL DIRECTOR**

Curt Onalfo is in his fourth season as Technical Director of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on June 2, 2019. In his role, Onalfo works closely with Sporting Director Bruce Arena managing the club's day-to-day soccer operations, including oversight of Revolution II, the Revolution Academy and the scouting department.

The Sao Paulo, Brazil native and Ridgefield, Conn. product joins the Revolution following an extensive coaching and playing career in Major League Soccer and with the United States Men's National Team. Onalfo has won MLS Cup as both a player and a coach, including one as a member of D.C. United in 1999, and three as an assistant coach with the LA Galaxy in 2011, 2012, and 2014.

Onalfo owns 12 total years of MLS coaching experience, highlighted by stints as head coach of D.C. United (2010), the then-Kansas City Wizards (2007-09), and the LA Galaxy (2017). While continuing as an assistant with the Galaxy, he also served as the inaugural head coach of USL Championship side LA Galaxy II from 2014-16, where he led the club to a Western Conference title in 2015. When he departed "Los Dos" to take over head coaching duties with the Galaxy first team, his overall record with the developmental side finished at 46-29-20.

On the international level, Onalfo spent six years as an assistant coach for the United States Men's National Team under Bruce Arena. He served as an assistant for the USMNT from 2002-07 – including at the 2002 and 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup™ – and also worked as an assistant with the U.S. Under-23 MNT in 2002. Prior to joining the Revolution, he most recently assisted the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team from 2018 through May 2019, including in Poland at the FIFA U-20 Men's World Cup™, and briefly served as acting head coach of the U-19 side for a training camp in January 2019.

Onalfo, 50, entered the coaching ranks an assistant with D.C. United in 2000 following his retirement. He remained with the Black and Red until September 2002, briefly serving as interim head coach in 2001. After his time in the U.S. Men's National Team setup, Onalfo was appointed head coach of the Kansas City Wizards shortly after the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. He led Kansas City for two-and-a-half seasons, compiling a 27-29-22 record, and helped the club reach the postseason twice, including a Western Conference Finals appearance in 2007. In December 2009, Onalfo was named head coach of D.C. United, where he would remain for eight months before departing the club.

After starring for Ridgefield High School, Onalfo played collegiately for Bruce Arena at the University of Virginia from 1987-1990. In four seasons with the Cavaliers, he earned a pair of All-ACC First Team selections and helped the team win the 1988 ACC Championship. He began his professional career with French side La Ciotat in 1991, before featuring for the Connecticut Wolves of the USISL from 1994-95, and Mexican second division side Tampico Madero in 1995.

Onalfo was selected by the LA Galaxy in the inaugural MLS Draft and would make 13 appearances for the club in 1996, helping it reach the first ever MLS Cup. The defender went on to register 23 appearances across four seasons in MLS, spending additional time with San Jose (1997) and D.C. United (1998-99). He recorded one international cap with the U.S. Men's National Team and featured extensively at the youth level, including the 1989 FIFA World Youth Championship, the 1991 Pan American Games, and the 1992 Summer Olympics.

Onalfo's journey took a detour soon after the 1992 Olympics, when a diagnosis of stage three Hodgkin's disease at the age of 24 disrupted his career and nearly ended his life. After surviving his arduous battle with cancer, Onalfo resumed his playing career with Connecticut and then Mexican side Tampico FC, before joining the Galaxy for the inaugural MLS season.



**REMI ROY**

**DIRECTOR OF SCOUTING & PRO PERSONNEL**

Remi Roy is currently in his 13th season with the New England Revolution and his fifth as the club's Director of Scouting & Player Personnel, named to the position in January 2018. Roy has been with the club since 2010, previously serving as an assistant coach with New England for eight seasons.

In his current role, Roy focuses on scouting and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with the Revolution technical staff in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the club, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the Revs' first-team goalkeepers and also provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revs' coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy also mentored Bobby Shuttleworth and Brad Knighton.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

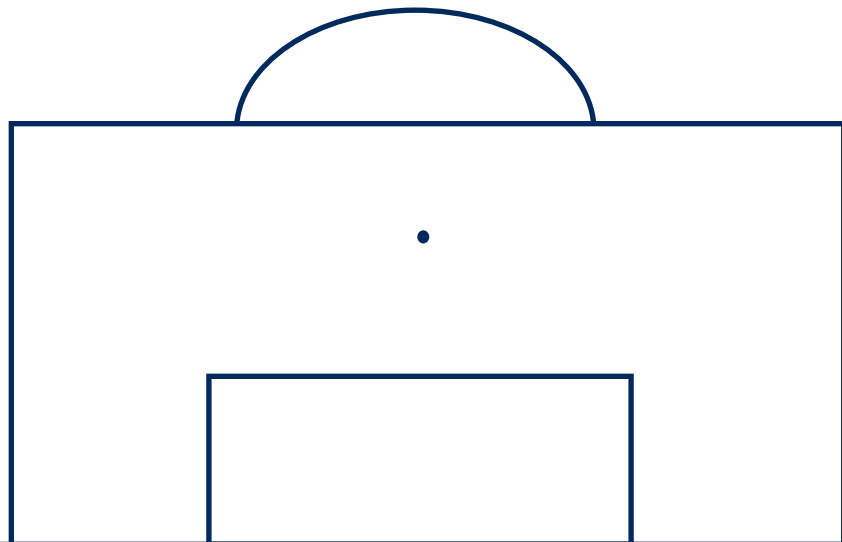
