## WHAT TO WATCH FOR ${ }^{\text {AT }}$ FC CINCINNATI

## TEAM NOTES:

- The Revolution scoring two or more goals in a match for the eighth consecutive game across all competitions dating back to April 9.
- The Revolution building on their 3-1-0 MLS record against FC Cincinnati, and a 4-1-0 mark in all competitions including the Revs' $5-1$ win over the Orange and Blue on May 11 in the U.S. Open Cup Round of 32 .
- New England logging its fifth consecutive victory over Cincinnati in all competitions.
- The Revolution not allowing a goal away at FC Cincinnati for the third straight trip, having posted two shutouts in two prior trips to the Queen City.
- The Revolution, whose 18 away wins since 2020 lead MLS, registering their first away victory of the 2022 campaign.
- New England, 1-0-2 over the last three MLS games, extending its current unbeaten streak to four matches in league play and five games overall.
- The Revolution holding their place among MLS leaders in assists (3rd - 22), shots on target (5th-55), goals (T-7th-18), and total shots (T-7th- 148).


## ADAM BUKSA NOTES:

- F Adam Buksa tying a club record by scoring in a seventh consecutive game across all competitions, matching Wolde Harris' streak set in 2000.
- Buksa adding to his team-high six MLS goals and 10 tallies in all competitions, including a brace against Cincinnati in the U.S. Open Cup.
- Buksa building on his back-to-back braces after he recorded multi-goal games at Atlanta (May 15) and vs. Cincinnati (May 11).
- Buksa adding to his five goals and one assist against Cincinnati across three games played across all competitions.
- Buksa holding his place as the MLS leader in headed shots (1st- 18) and headed goals (1st-4) while continuing to rank among top players in touches in the opposing box (4th-57) and aerial duels won (5th-38) entering Week 12.
- Buksa (13) continuing to lead MLS in headed goals since arriving in New England in 2020.
- Buksa (0.58) closing the gap with Taylor Twellman (0.60) for the best goals-per-90 rate in club history.


## CARLES GIL NOTES:

- Reigning MLS MVP M Carles Gil registering an assist for the fifth straight MLS match and sixth across all competitions.
- Gil equaling the club record for consecutive MLS games with an assist, set by Steve Ralston in 2002 and equaled by Gil in 2021.
- Gil continuing to lead the league in successful crosses (1st - 38).
- Gil holding his position among league leaders in assists (T-2nd - 6 ), chances created (2nd-42), fouls won (T-2nd-33). and big chances created (T-6th-6).
- New England adding to its 25-2-10 record across all competitions when Gil registers an assist.


## MATT TURNER NOTES:

- GK Matt Turner, 1-0-2 through three games this season, remaining unbeaten in 2022 and building on his 3-0-0 career record against FC Cincinnati, which includes two clean sheets.
- Turner (71.9\%) closing in on Matt Reis' club-best saves percentage (72.3\%).


## BRUCE ARENA NOTES

- Bruce Arena building on his 18-12-12 away record with the Revolution.
- Arena (.602) staying ahead of Seattle's Brian Schmetzer (.602) for the best winning percentage in MLS history ( min .100 games coached).


## MORE INDIVIDUAL NOTES:

M Sebastian Lletget registering an assist in a third straight match for the second time in his career.

- D Andrew Farrell $(24,889)$ approaching 25,000 minutes played in MLS, all with New England.
D DeJuan Jones remaining among the top defenders in MLS in assists (T-3rd - 3), chances created (5th -16 ), and successful crosses (T-8th - 10).
D Brandon Bye continuing to rank among top defenders in goals scored (T-2nd - 2), successful crosses (4th - 19), and chances created (4th -21 ).

- FC Cincinnati Assistant Coach Kenny Arena is the son of Revolution Sporting Director and Head Coach Bruce Arena.
- FC Cincinnati Head Coach Pat Noonan played for the Revolution from 2003-07. Selected by New England with the ninth-overall pick in the 2003 MLS SuperDraft, Noonan tallied 37 goals over 119 appearances in a Revolution uniform.
- Noonan ranks tied for seventh in club history in goals scored (37) and ninth in assists (29).
- FC Cincinnati General Manager Chris Albright played for the Revolution during the 2008 and 2009 seasons.
- Revolution midfielder Tommy McNamara and FC Cincinnati defender Ronald Matarrita were teammates on New York City FC from 2016-18.
- Revolution goalkeeper Earl Edwards Jr. and FC Cincinnati midfielder Luciano Acosta were teammates at D.C. United in 2019.
- Revolution midfielder Matt Polster and FC Cincinnati goalkeeper Alec Kann were teammates on the Chicago Fire in 2015.
- Revolution defender A.J. DeLaGarza and FC Cincinnati defender Alvas Powell were teammates on Inter Miami CF in 2020.
- FC Cincinnati defender Geoff Cameron is a native of Attleboro, Massachusetts. Cameron also played under Bruce Arena with the U.S. Men's National Team.
- Revolution forward Jozy Altidore and defender Omar Gonzalez were teammates with Cameron on the U.S. Men's National Team for the 2014 FIFA World Cup in Brazil.

## BUKSA AMONG MOST DOMINANT FORWARDS IN MLS

Since signing with New England in 2020, forward Adam Buksa has shown his dominance by tallying 28 goals in 63 regular season games, with two more goals in five postseason matches. The Polish striker has tallied in five straight league games for New England, matching the longest such streak of his MLS career, and six straight games in all competitions after his two-goal performances on May 11 vs. FC Cincinnati in the U.S. Open Cup and on May 15 at Atlanta United in MLS action.

Buksa has been rewarded for his MLS production with multiple call-ups to the Qatar-bound Poland Men's National Team, including for June's upcoming UEFA Nations League matches. Buksa has scored five times ins even caps since September 2021, including his first career hat trick against San Marino in World Cup Qualifying action.

Standing taller than 6-foot-3, Buksa has been dominant in the air since his arrival in MLS. From April 16 through May 7, Buksa scored a header in four consecutive MLS matches. Buksa leads all MLS forwards in duels won, aerials duels won, headed shots, and headed goals since arriving in MLS:

Since the start of 2020, Buksa leads all MLS players with 24 goals scored from open play, two ahead of the LA Galaxy's Chicharito. Buksa's 28 goals in league play are tied for third most overall.

Bou is not far behind, ranking tied for 12th with 20 goals scored since the start of 2020. Inclusive of the MLS Cup Playoffs, Bou's 19 goals from open play are tied for sixth most since the start of 2020.

## BUKSA'S EPIC SCORING RUN NEARS CLUB RECORD

In 2021, Buksa finished tied for fifth in the Golden Boot race with 16 goals. With the Polish striker on pace to surpass that total this year, Buksa has again found himself entrenched in the MLS Golden Boot race, tied for fifth in MLS so far this season and just three goals off the top spot:

Over the past month, Revolution striker Adam Buksa has been in peak goal-scoring form, tallying eight goals over his last six matches across all competitions. In MLS play, Buksa has scored six times in his last five regular season contests, the longest such streak in MLS this season, including his fourth-career multi-goal game on May 15 at Atlanta.

While Buksa still has a way to go to reach the MLS record for consecutive games with a goal (15, Josef Martinez), the Polish striker is one game shy of matching the club record of seven straight games with goal, set in August 2000 by Wolde Harris, who scored in seven straight league matches for New England.


With Buksa's next goal, he will also find himself in a three-way tie for tenth on the club's all-time scoring list with Gustavo Bou and Kelyn Rowe. Buksa is seeking to become just the tenth 30-goal scorer in Revolution history.

Buksa's blistering scoring pace puts him in position to challenge another club record. Buksa owns a rate of 0.58 goals per 90 minutes played, just behind Taylor Twellman's club-best mark of 0.60 goals per 90, which has been the standard for more than a decade. Twellman is New England's all-time leading scorer with 101 regular season goals to his credit.

## HOMEGROWN HISTORY: TICO TALLIES IN FIRST MLS START

On April 30 against Inter Miami CF, Revolution Homegrown midfielder Damian 'Tico' Rivera, 19, made MLS history becoming the third player to score in the first minute of his first career league start, tallying the game-winning goal 56 seconds into New England's 2-0 win. Rivera joined Real Salt Lake's Matias Mantilla (2007) and FC Dallas' Aaron Pitchkolan (2005) as the only three players to tally inside the first minute of their first MLS start.

The Cranston, R.I. native, who signed as the seventh (of eight) Homegrown Player in Revolution history back in 2019, is no stranger to scoring goals, having done so consistently at every level throughout his development in the Revolution Academy system. Tico joined the Revolution Academy at the age of 12 and amassed 41 goals in 90 appearances across all age levels.

Since signing as a Homegrown Player, Rivera has suited up 41 times for Revolution II since the developmental team launched in 2020, tallying a team-record 11 goals in USL League One and MLS NEXT Pro. Rivera began the 2022 campaign with Revs II, scoring three times over his first two games, including a brace in the season opener, before getting the call-up to the MLS side. Rivera is one of three Homegrown Players currently on the Revolution roster, alongside Justin Rennicks (23) and Noel Buck (17).

Rennicks scored his first MLS goal and second tally across all competitions for the first team back on April 9 at Inter Miami. The South Hamilton, Mass, native has 14 career MLS appearances with five starts and an additional 36 appearances for Revolution II over the past three years.

The latest Homegrown Signing, Noel Buck, still awaits his MLS debut, though he has been playing professionally with Revolution II since 2021. The Arlington, Mass. native signed his first professional contract with Revs II last June and inked a Homegrown Player contract over the offseason. Buck made 28 appearances for Revolution II a year ago in USL League One, and has earned valuable minutes again this season with the second team. Buck has developed in the Revolution Academy since 2017, scoring 11 goals over 66 appearances across all age levels and playing at several positions as both a midfielder and forward.

## SUPER SUB: BOATENG SPARKS REVS OFF THE BENCH

Revolution midfielder Emmanuel Boateng is proving himself to be one of the most effective players in MLS. Last year, in his first season, Boateng recorded two goals and five assists, including one game-winning goal and an additional winning assist. So far this season, the Ghanaian midfielder has picked up where he left off in 2021, recording a goal and a pair of assists. Since signing with New England, Boateng is the MLS leader in assists per 90 minutes (min. 500 minutes) while teammates Carles Gil sits just behind him in second:

## GUSTAVO BOU A CONSISTENT ATTACKING THREAT

Forward Gustavo Bou has been one of Major League Soccer's top attacking players since entering the league in 2019. Bou enjoyed an electric season in 2021, scoring 15 goals to rank second on the Revolution, along with nine assists.

Since arriving in MLS in July 2019, Bou's 49 combined goals and assists are third most in the league. Including the MLS Cup Playoffs, Bou's 32 goals since July 2019 are alos third best league-wide.

The 2021 MLS All-Star was recognized for his blistering scoring pace with his first selection to the MLS Best XI. Bou's 15 goals in 2021 ranked tied for ninth-most in MLS while his 24 combined goals and assists ranked fourth in the league last season.

The Revolution have lost only once when Bou scores a goal and on just two occasions when he records an assist. Bou has been known for his late-game heroics with New England going unbeaten on seven occasions when he finds the back of the next after the 85th minute. Since 2020, New England's splits with and without Bou show just how vital the Argentine is to the Revolution attack:

## KING OF THE GIL: CAPTAIN CARLES LEADING THE WAY

Carles Gil, the reigning MLS Most Valuable Player, signed a multi-year contract with the Revs in May 2021. His consistency since arriving in MLS in 2019 continues into his fourth season with the Revolution. Gil ranks among the top five in virtually all of the key attacking categories after pacing the league in many of these same areas during his MVP season:


While Gil is adept at finding the back of the net himself, his chance creation for others is what sets him apart. Gil's chance creation during the 2021 campaign was historic, as New England's captain registered 130 chances created, the most in league history since Opta began tracking the statistic in 2011:

Since entering the league in 2019, and despite missing a nearly the entire 2020 season due to injury, Gil has still managed to collect five of the top 10 single-game totals for chances created in MLS, including the second-most chances created in a single game since Opta began recording the stat in 2011 (12 - July 10, 2020 vs. MTL).

Gil holds the top six single-game totals for chances created in Revolution history. Since Opta began tracking chances created as a statistic in 2011, only two other Revolution players have registered at least eight in a single game, while Gil has hit the mark six times.

## CARLES, THE CREATOR: GIL HITTING HIS STRIDE

In 2021, Revolution captain Carles Gil became the second player in club history to take home the Landon Donovan Major League Soccer Most Valuable Player award. Gil, who earned MLS Player of the Month for June, an MLS All-Star selection, and the MLS Comeback Player of the Year award, recorded 18 assists on the season - one shy of the club record.

Since his arrival in MLS in 2019, Gil has transformed the New England attack through his chance creation and attacking prowess. Despite missing most of the 2020 campaign, Gil has compiled the most assists in MLS since the start of the 2019 season across both the regular season and playoffs:

Gil ranks tied for second in MLS this season with six assists, including helpers in four straight league contests and five straight matches across all competitions after tallying three goals and an assist in the U.S. Open Cup Round of 32. Gil has matched his career best mark for consecutive games with an assist, set from May 16 through June 23 of 2021 when the midfielder picked up eight assists over five matches - tying the longest streak in club history set by Steve Ralston from July 6 through July 27, 2002.

Gil is among the league leaders in combined goals and assists this season, tied for fifth in MLS this season three goals and six assists - the latter of which ranks tied for second in league play. Teammate Adam Buksa sits tied for seventh with eight combined goals and assists:

## TURNER'S SHOT-STOPPING RATES ARE HISTORIC

The 2021 Allstate MLS Goalkeeper of the Year and an MLS Best XI selection, Revolution goalkeeper Matt Turner ranked atop the charts in several advanced and traditional statistical categories, including goals allowed minus expected goals allowed. On Feb. 11, 2022, the Revolution agreed to terms for Turner to join Arsenal of the English Premier League in a summer transfer.

For his MLS career, Turner has totaled -26.62 goals saved above expected, the best total in MLS since the statistic began being tracked by American Soccer Analysis in 2013. Turner's impressive total comes despite him playing only four of the nine seasons during that span and seeing approximately 10,000 fewer minutes than the three next-closest players.

In both MLS and international circles, Turner has also become notorious for his heroics on penalty kicks. In the 2021 MLS All-Star Game, Turner stopped two penalties in a shootout to give the MLS All-Stars a win over the Liga MX All-Stars and earn All-Star Game MVP honors. He was also capped 13 times by the United States Men's National Team, a record for most appearances by a goalkeeper in their debut year, and set a new USMNT mark with nine clean sheets in a calendar year.

## TAKE IT OUTSIDE: BYE \& JONES TOP FULL BACK DUO IN MLS

New England recently re-signed defenders Brandon Bye and DeJuan Jones to three-year contract extensions through the 2024 MLS season.

Bye, selected by New England with the eighth-overall pick in 2018 out of Western Michigan, has established himself as one of the league's premier right backs with his athleticism and playmaking offensively coupled with superior aerial ability. In New England's first match of the 2022 season, Bye matched a career high winning nine of his 13 aerials. Since 2020, Bye ranks fourth among MLS defenders in aerials won with 186:

Jones, selected 11th overall in 2019 out of Michigan State, was the only outside back to finish in the top five of 2021 MLS Defender of the Year voting. Jones played a crucial role in the Revolution's backline throughout the 2021 Supporters' Shield-winning campaign, tallying three goals and five assists while more than doubling his previous career high with 2,546 minutes played and 38 chances created.

Drafted by New England with the 11th-overall pick in the 2019 MLS SuperDraft, Jones has brought an attacking mentality to his defensive position. ## ARENA SETS MLS WINS RECORD

Bruce Arena, who won his MLS-record fourth Supporters' Shield title in 2021, continues climbing the MLS record books as he enters his 18th season as an MLS head coach. With New England's win over FC Dallas on March 5, 2022, Arena became the league's all-time leader in regular season wins, passing the late Sigi Schmid (240). Arena was already the winningest coach in the history of the MLS playoffs ( 35 wins) and the U.S. Men's National Team program.

Arena owns 278 combined regular season and postseason wins in MLS, more than any other coach. Arena's all-time regular season record currently stands at 243-141-115 (41-20-26 with New England). His . 619 winning percentage with New England is the best mark in club history.

## ROAD WARRIORS: REVS ARE A FORMIDABLE AWAY TEAM

The Revolution finished the 2021 season with a road record of 10-3-4 on the year, a new club record for away wins. The Revs ended the year winning eight of their last 10 road games. In its history, the club has three four-game winning streaks away from home, two of which came in 2021.

New England's 34 points and 10 victories away from home in 2021 rank second in MLS history behind the 1998 LA Galaxy ( 13 wins, 37 points). Forwards Adam Buksa and Gustavo Bou led the charge for New England, finishing tied for second in MLS last season with nine road goals each.

The league's most formidable away team dating back to Bruce Arena's arrival in New England on June 2, 2019, the Revolution lead MLS in road victories over that span with 21 across the regular season and playoffs. Since the start of 2020, the Revs' 18 away wins are four more than any other club.

## THE PICK IS IN: REVS' A HIT IN MLS SUPERDRAFT

The New England Revolution have been among the most effective teams in MLS building through the SuperDraft. Several of New England's regular starters along the backline were first-round selections by New England
in DeJuan Jones, Brandon Bye, Andrew Farrell, and Henry Kessler, while defenders Omar Gonzalez and A.J. DeLaGarza were both drafted by Bruce Arena to the LA Galaxy out of the University of Maryland.

While New England continues to emerge as a prominent player in the global transfer market, with a bevy of homegrown talent also rising through the club's pro pathway, New England continues to find value in the SuperDraft. The current 29-player roster boasts 13 players who arrived in MLS via the SuperDraft, including six selected by the Revolution. That list does not include Tajon Buchanan, who the club selected ninth overall in 2019 before selling him to Club Brugge last August for a record transfer fee.


The Revs' 13 draft picks are the second most on any MLS roster behind Nashville (16). The Revs have six of their own SuperDraft picks on the roster, tied for seocnd most in MLS behind San Jose (9).

## THREE IF BY AIR: REVOLUTION'S AERIAL ATTACK CLICKING

New England's attack has taken on a new look this season with the Revolution looking to establish their aerial dominance on both ends of the field. In the attack, forward Adam Buksa has proven to be one of Major League Soccer's most dangerous players in the air, pacing all MLS forwards in aerials won, headed shots, and headed goals since entering the league ahead of the 2020 season. All four of Buksa's goals in the 2022 MLS season have been headers.

In other areas of the field, center backs Henry Kessler and Omar Gonzalez both stand tall at 6-foot-4, while right back Brandon Bye ranks fourth among MLS defenders in aerials won with 178 since 2020.

With playmaking fullbacks Bye and DeJuan Jones providing service, alongside reigning MLS MVP Carles Gil, New England has shown the potential to exploit opponents with the aerial advantage. New England ranks first in MLS this season in crosses attempted (310), successful crosses (89), headed shots (40), and headed shots on target (22). New England's crossing accuracy is also tied for first in MLS this season:

The Revolution's aerial success has been catalyzed by having three of the league's top-20 players for crosses (including corners) in MLS this season -- Gil (1st, 108), Bye (12th, 58), and Jones (19th, 49). Since the start of last season, Gil leads MLS with 125 successful crosses. Gil, Bye, and Jones have combined for eight assists so far this season.

The trio ranks among the top three in MLS in crosses attempted from open play as well, with Bye (55) atop the league and Jones (49) and Gil (49) ranked tied for fifth. Bye also leads the league with 19 successful crosses from open play, while Gil (14) and Jones (10) also crack the top six.

## OPEN CUP HISTORY: REVS REWRITE CLUB RECORD BOOK

For the first time since 2019, New England is taking part in the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, the oldest national soccer competition in the United States. Entering the competition in the Round of 32, New England hosted FC Cincinnati. The Revolution claimed a 5-1 victory, rewriting history in the process.

The match marked the first time two Revolution players recorded multigoal games in the same U.S. Open Cup match since June 27, 2001 against the Mid-Michigan Bucks, with Carles Gil (3) and Adam Buksa (2) providing the scoring. Gil registered the first U.S. Open Cup hat trick in Revolution history and the first multi-goal game for New England in Open Cup play since Teal Bunbury bagged a brace on June 11, 2019.

The hat trick was the eleventh in club history and the first for New England since Kei Kamara did so on Sept. 2, 2017. For Gil, it was just his second multi-goal game in Revolution colors, his first since March 17, 2019. The contest was also the first five-goal outburst at Gillette Stadium since March 25, 2017 against Minnesota United (W, 5-2).

## REVS UTILIZE U-22 INITIATIVE TO SICN DYLAN BORRERO

The New England Revolution acquired 20-year-old midfielder Dylan Borrero from Clube Atletico Mineiro, the reigning Campeonato Brasileiro Série A champions, and signed him to a three-year MLS contract with a one-year club option. Borrero is New England's first acquisition under Major League Soccer's U-22 Initiative, aimed to promote further investment in young players approaching the primes of their soccer careers.

Borrero arrives in New England with 50 professional appearances across all competitions for Atletico Mineiro and Colombian first-division side Independiente Santa Fe. Primarily a winger, Borrero helped Mineiro win the 2021 Brasileiro Série A and Copa do Brasil titles in his first season with the club. On the international stage, Borrero collected seven appearances at the $\mathrm{U}-17, \mathrm{U}-18$, and $\mathrm{U}-20$ levels for his native Colombia, scoring three goals.

Borrero marks the sixth Brazilian-based player under the age of 22 to arrive in New England since the start of 2020. Previously, New England signed five Brazil natives to the Revolution II roster -- Maciel, Michel,
Jose Ítalo, Ryan Lima, and Marcos Dias. Maciel became the first of the group to ascend to the MLS roster and the first Revolution II graduate to appear for the first team in 2021.

## QATAR BOUND: POLAND, USA PUNCH TICKET TO WORLD CUP

New England Revolution forward Adam Buksa and the Poland Men's National Team have qualified for the 2022 FIFA Men's World Cup in Qatar. Poland clinched its bid as one of 32 teams competing in the premiere global tournament, set to kick off in Qatar on November 21, with a 2-0 win over Sweden in a UEFA World Cup Qualifying playoff final on Tuesday.

Buksa registered an appearance as a substitute in Tuesday's win, picking up his seventh career cap to go with five career international goals with Poland since he debuted in 2021. The 25-year-old striker is one of two players among the top-20 UEFA goal scorers represent a non-European club, alongside compatriot Karol Świderski (MLS - Charlotte FC).

The United States Men's National Team secured its place in the 2022 FIFA World Cup, its first appearance in the tournament since the 2014 iteration in Brazil. A pair of Revolution players have played pivotal roles for the USMNT during the qualifying cycle, with goalkeeper Matt Turner and midfielder Sebastian Lletget both seeing extensive action with eight and four qualifying appearances each, respectively.

Additionally, defender DeJuan Jones earned an invitation to the U.S. National Team January Preparation Camp, his first participation in a national team program at any age level. Other Revolution players who may be in the hunt for a World Cup roster spot include center back Henry Kessler and forward Jozy Altidore. Kessler featured as a substitute for the U.S. in their 2021 Concacaf Gold Cup Final victory over Mexico last August and played 90 minutes in a December friendly against Bosnia \& Herzegovina. Altidore is an established figure in the national team conversation since his 2007 debut, ranking third all-time in USMNT history with 42 goals.

- New England Revolution II (4-1-2, 15 pts.) defeated Toronto FC II (3-4-1, 10 pts.), 1-0, at BMO Field on Saturday evening. Brazilian forward Marcos Dias tallied his first goal of the season while goalkeeper Jacob Jackson notched his third straight clean sheet in MLS NEXT Pro.

Dias led Revolution II with four shots and two on target, including a bicycle kick attempt in the 25th minute that missed just wide of the top-left corner. The forward broke the stalemate in the 47th minute after fellow Brazil native Michel sent a cross into the center of the box. Dias drove it home with a right-footed shot into the right side of the net for his first goal with New England and the game's lone score.

Jackson returned to the net and continued his dominant play for New England's second team as he made two saves and logged his third consecutive clean sheet. The rookie goalkeeper's most notable stop came in the 32 nd minute as he made a one-on-one denial of a Toronto attacker following a turnover in the penalty area. With the victory, Revolution II Head Coach Clint Peay picked up his 20th league win with the club.

- New England Revolution II (3-1-2, 12 pts.) fell to Columbus Crew 2 (5-1-0, 15 pts.), 4-0, at Gillette Stadium on Sunday evening. The loss was New England's first of the season as Revolution II saw its fivegame unbeaten streak ended. Goalkeeper Djordje Petrović made four saves in his club debut, while Brazilian forward Marcos Dias made his first professional start after debuting as a sub last week.

Columbus scored four times in the first half, with two goals coming from Noah Fuson in the 17th and 43rd minutes. New England's defense was resolute in the second half, but the two teams played to a scoreless stalemate in the final 45 minutes as Revolution II logged their first loss of the season.

Esmir Bajraktarevic returned to the starting lineup for his fourth appearance of the season after an April stint with the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team. Trevor Zwetsloot started in place of Sean O'Hearn at center back, and Ben Reveno made the start at right back.

## BRUCE ARENA

## SPORTING DIRECTOR \& HEAD COACH

- Named the Revolution's sporting director and the club's eighth head coach on May 14, 2019.
- Won record five MLS Cup titles (1996, 1997, 2011, 2012, 2014), four MLS Coach of the Year honors, and four MLS Supporters' Shields.
- Winningest head coach in MLS regular season (240), MLS playoff (35), and U.S. Men's National Team history. Managed the U.S. Men's National Team through two separate stints (1998-2006, 2016-17) and two FIFA Men's World Cups in 2002 and 2006, and won three Gold Cup titles.
- Reached the MLS Cup final in seven of 17 seasons as an MLS head coach.
- Built a dynasty over 18 seasons as head coach at the University of Virginia, winning five NCAA Division-1 National Championships and six ACC titles.

Bruce Arena is in his fourth season as Sporting Director and Head Coach of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on May 14, 2019. The five-time MLS Cup winner is the eighth head coach in club history and oversees all soccer operations for the New England Revolution, including head coaching duties, roster management, scouting, and the oversight of Revolution II and the Revolution Academy.

In his first three seasons at the helm in New England, Arena has revived the Revolution by leading the side to three consecutive MLS Cup Playoff appearances. His . 634 winning percentage with New England entering 2022 is the best of any manager in the club's history. Last season, Arena won his record fourth Supporters' Shield, the first in Revolution history, after guiding the team to 22 wins, 73 points, and 2.15 points per game - all MLS records. For his efforts, Arena was awarded with his league-leading fouth MLS Coach of the Year honor.

In 2020, his first full season in New England, Arena led the Revolution to the Eastern Conference Final. Arena's impact in New England was immediatley evident upon his arrival in Foxborough. Arena made his return to the MLS postseason in 2019 by leading one of the most remarkable turnarounds in league history. After a 2-8-2 start had the Revolution sitting in last place in MLS, Arena went unbeaten in his first eight games at the helm and helped New England reach the postseason, ending a three-year drought for the club. The team's historic renaissance came despite Arena only making one in-season addition to the roster, bringing in Argentine striker Gustavo Bou via a club-record transfer in July

The Long Island, N.Y. native joined the Revolution with one of the most decorated coaching careers in American soccer history that has spanned more than 40 seasons at the collegiate, professional, and international levels. Arena's MLS resume includes a record five MLS Cup titles, four Supporters' Shields, seven conference championships, one U.S. Open Cup title, and one Concacaf Champions' Cup. He has reached the MLS Cup final in seven of his 16 seasons coaching in the league. Arena has earned three MLS Coach of the Year selections, tied for the most all-time, first winning the honor in 1997 with D.C. United before being recognized in 2009 and 2011 with the LA Galaxy.

With 275 combined regular season and postseason wins in MLS entering the 2022 season, and a regular season record of 240-136-112 (.607), Arena is the league's winningest active head coach and owns the second-best winning percentage in MLS history. Arena is the league's all-time leader in MLS Cup Playoff games coached with 55 (35-13-7), while his 35 playoff wins are also the most in league history.

On the international stage, Arena, 70, coached the U.S. Men's National Team over two separate stints from 1998-2006 and 2016-17, amassing the most wins in the program's history with a record of 81-35-32. He led the Stars and Stripes to a Quarterfinal finish in the 2002 FIFA Men's World Cup - the country's best showing since 1930 - as well an appearance in the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. Arena also guided the U.S. Men's National Team to more Gold Cup titles than any other coach, capturing the continental trophy three times in 2002, 2005, and 2017.

Before his time in the professional ranks, Arena began his head coaching career with one season at the University of Puget Sound (1976), before being named the head coach at the University of Virginia in 1978. During his decorated 18-year tenure at Virginia, he led the Cavaliers to five NCAA Division-1 National Championships, including four in a row from 1991-94, as well as six ACC Men's Soccer titles (1988, 1991-95). While at Virginia, Arena coached a number of American soccer legends, including Claudio Reyna, John Harkes, and current D.C. United Head Coach Ben Olsen.

In 1996, Arena received an offer to lead the United States Under-23 Men's National Team in the 1996 Summer Olympics in Atlanta. Shortly after the Olympics, he assumed the head role with D.C. United, where he led the Black-and-Red to a 61-35 record, including the first two MLS Cup titles in 1996 and 1997 , and the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup title in 1996.

Following the 1998 FIFA Men's World Cup in France, the United States Soccer Federation turned to Arena, who helped the team qualify for the 2002 FIFA Men's World Cup. In the tournament, Arena's team recorded an impressive win over powerhouse Portugal and topped Mexico, $2-0$, in the Round of 16 en route to the nation's first appearance in the Quarterfinals in a 72-year span. That same year, Arena led the USMNT to the Concacaf Gold Cup title, one of his three triumphs in the competition.

In 2005, Arena won his second Concacaf Gold Cup ahead of the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup in Germany. In the 2006 tournament, the United States earned a 1-1 draw against Italy, but a 2-1 defeat to Ghana sent the USMNT home early.

The next season, Arena took charge of the New York Red Bulls, where he spent the end of the 2006 season and all of the 2007 campaign. In 2008 , Arena joined the LA Galaxy for what would be an incredible nine-year tenure that included three MLS Cups in a four-year span and two Supporters' Shields in 2010 and 2011.

Following his decorated career with the Galaxy, Arena rejoined the U.S. Men's National Team in November 2016. In his second run as head coach, he lost only two out of 18 games at the helm, though the United States fell short of qualification for the 2018 FIFA Men's World Cup. A 2010 National Soccer Hall of Fame inductee, Arena was named the 2015 Werner Fricker Builder Award recipient, earning U.S. Soccer's highest honor for his more than 40 years of service to the game.

A talented lacrosse player, Arena grew up on Long Island and would go on to attend Nassau Community College, where he played both lacrosse and soccer. Arena then transferred to Cornell University in 1971, where as a goalkeeper, he led his team to the 1972 NCAA College Cup Final Four and earned the tournament's Most Valuable Defensive Player award. During the 1973 season, Arena contributed as an assistant coach with Cornell, before then accepting a head coaching position at the University of Puget Sound.

Off the field, Arena has authored a number of books and is a member of the NJCAA Lacrosse Hall of Fame, after receiving induction in 2008. He and his wife, Phyllis, live in Boston. Arena's son, Kenny, was an assistant coach under his father with the LA Galaxy from 2014-16 and is now an assistant coach with FC Cincinnati.


## RICHIE WILLIAMS <br> ASSISTANT COACH

Richie Williams is in his fourth season as an assistant coach for the New England Revolution after joining Bruce Arena's staff in June 2019. Williams brings 16 years of coaching experience in Major League Soccer, USL Championship, and the United States Men's National Team to New England. He most recently served as the first ever head coach of USL Championship side Loudoun United FC.

During the 2020 season, Williams coached the Revolution through three unbeaten games in August 2020 in place of a suspended Bruce Arena, leading New England to a 1-0-2 mark.

A native of MIddletown Township, N.J., Williams has previously served as either an assistant coach or head coach for seven different teams over the course of his coaching career. Prior to managing Loudoun United in 2019, he served as an assitant coach for the United States Men's National Team from 2017-18. In addition, he has served as an assistant for Real Salt Lake in 2016, the U.S. U-17 MNT from 2012-15, the U.S. U-18 MNT from 2011-12, the New York Red Bulls from 2006-11 -- where he also completed two stints as interim head coach in 2006 and 2009 -- and the University of Virginia from 2005-06.

Williams enjoyed a successful playing career prior to entering the coaching ranks. He played under Bruce Arena at multiple stops during his career, including at the University of Virginia from 1988-91, D.C. United from 1996-98, and the United States Men's National Team from 1998-2002. Together, Arena and Williams won an NCAA Championship at the University of Virginia in 1991, before helping D.C. United to three consecutive MLS Cup appearances, including championships in 1996 and 1997.

The former midfielder also earned 20 international caps with the USMNT under Arena, highlighted by a CONCACAF Gold Cup title in 2002. He also spent time with the Richmond Kickers in 1993 and 2004-05, Scottish side Ayr United FC from 1993-94, and the New York/New Jersey MetroStars in 2001 and 2003.


## KEVIN HITCHCOCK <br> ASSISTANT COACH

Kevin Hitchcock is in his fourth season as Assistant Coach for the New England Revolution after joining the cub's staff in April 2019. Hitchcock brings nearly two decades of professional coaching experience in the top flights of England, Qatar, and India, as well as a decorated 18-year playing career in England, to New England.

Hitchcock, who owns a UEFA 'A' Goalkeeper License and UEFA 'B' License, spent the previous 18 years as a first-team goalkeeper coach with several top-flight clubs. His experience includes stints with Watford FC (200104), Blackburn Rovers FC (2004-08), Manchester City FC (2008-10), Fulham FC (2011), Queens Park Rangers (2012-15), Al Arabi Sports Club (2015-16), and Birmingham City FC (2016-18). Most recently, Hitchcock spent one year as the goalkeepers coach for Indian Super League side Chennaiyin FC.

Hitchcock has coached and developed a number of elite professional goalkeepers, including Joe Hart, Kasper Schmeichel, Shay Given, Robert Green, Júlio César, and Mark Schwarzer, among others.

Prior to entering the coaching ranks, Hitchcock registered nearly 300 appearances across an 18-year playing career in England, highlighted by two FA Cups, one League Cup, one Cup Winners Cup, and one Super Cup with Chelsea FC. In total, he recorded 96 appearances for The Blues from 19882001, also completing loan assignments to West Ham United FC (1993) and Northampton Town FC (1990) during his time with the club. Prior to joining Chelsea, Hitchcock began his professional career with Mansfield Town FC, where he made 168 appearances from 1984-88. At the youth level, he played with both Nottingham Forest FC and Barking F.C.


## DAVE VAN DEN BERGH <br> ASSISTANT COACH

Dave van den Bergh is in his fourth season as Assistant Coach for the New England Revolution after joining the club's staff in June 2019. Van den Bergh, 44, arrived in New England following nine years as a coach with various United States Youth National teams.

The Amsterdam native served as assistant coach for the United States Under-20 Men's National Team in 2019 and from 2010-16, head coach of the United States Under-19 Men's National Team in 2018, and head coach of the United States Under-15s from 2016-18. Van den Bergh recorded a 6-0-4 record as head of the U.S. U-15s, and helped guide the U-20s to consecutive Quarterfinal appearances in the 2015 and 2019 FIFA U-20 World Cups.

Van den Bergh enjoyed a decorated playing career from 1995-2009, featuring extensively in the Dutch Eredivisie, La Liga, and Major League Soccer. He began his career with Dutch powerhouse Ajax in 1995 after spending 10 years in the club's academy. Van den Bergh made 12 appearances across three seasons for Ajax - highlighted by a league title in the 1995-96 season - before moving to Spanish side Rayo Vallecano, where he logged 47 appearances from 1997-2000. He returned to the Eredivisie in 2000, joining FC Utrecht. The winger scored 29 goals across 184 games played for Utrecht, and led the club to consecutive Dutch Cup wins in 2003 and 2004, as well a Dutch Super Cup title in 2004.

Van den Bergh signed with the Kansas City Wizards of Major League Soccer in 2006. After one season with Kansas City, he joined the New York Red Bulls, where he played under Bruce Arena in 2007. Following two seasons with New York, Van den Bergh featured for FC Dallas in 2009. On the international stage, Van den Bergh collected two caps with the Netherlands in 2004.

## SHALRIE JOSEPH

ASSISTANT COACH
Shalrie Joseph is in his first season as an Assistant Coach of the New England Revolution on Bruce Arena's technical staff following two seasons as a coach with the Revolution Academy.

A native of St. George's, Grenada, Joseph returns to the Revolution to the Revolution organization in 2020 as a Head Coach for the Revolution Academy Under-15 team. He remains closely involved with the club's youth teams. During his first season at the helm, Joseph guided the Revolution U-15s to the semifinals of the inaugural MLS NEXT Cup Playoffs in June 2021. Joseph continued coaching the 2006 age group in 2021-22, moving up to coach the Revolution U-17 side.

Joseph his managerial debut as head coach of the Grenada National Team from 2018-19. He previously earned 20 international caps with the national team from 2002-08. As Grenada's head coach, he helped the side qualify for the 2021 Concacaf Gold Cup and earn promotion to League A in the 2019-20 Concacaf Nations League after an unbeaten 4-0-2 record in League B group play.

Joseph, 42, entered the coaching ranks following a decorated playing career that saw him record the second-most minutes played in Revolution club history. Selected 14th overall by the Revolution in the 2002 MLS SuperDraft, Joseph played for the club from 2003-2012 before returning in 2014. A general in the central midfield, Joseph led New England to three straight MLS Eastern Conference titles from 2005-07. In addition to his seven consecutive MLS AllStar selections (2005-11) and four MLS Best XI nods, both club highs, Joseph was recognized as a finalist in 2009 MLS MVP voting. For all of his contributions, Joseph was recently named to the club's All-Time Team in 2020.


## JARRYD PHILLIPS DIRECTOR OF SPORTS PERFORMANCE

Jarryd Phillips is in his fourth season as Director of Sports Performance for the New England Revolution after joining Bruce Arena's staff in June 2019. He brings seven years of experience as a sports science and performance coach to the position, including time spent in MLS, USL, NASL, and the NCAA.

Phillips arrived in New England after spending nearly three years as Director of Performance \& Sports Science for Minnesota United FC. He established and directed all facets of the performance department for Minnesota's first team and academy beginning in July 2016, as the club prepared to ascend from the NASL to MLS in 2017. In his role with the Loons, he oversaw all nutritional aspects of the squad, administered strength and fitness programs, and participated in daily training sessions.

Prior to joining Minnesota, Phillips spent nearly two seasons as a performance coach with Seattle Sounders FC from January 2015 through July 2016. Before entering the professional coaching ranks, he worked as an assistant coach at the University of Mary in North Dakota from 2013-14. Phillips began his coaching career with the Premier Development League's Thunder Bay Chill in 2012.

Phillips earned his undergraduate degree at the University of Maine before attending graduate school at the University of Mary in South Dakota, where he received a master's degree in kinesiology and exercise science. He holds USSF and UEFA coaching licenses and is an NSCA Certified Strength and Conditioning Specialist (CSCS).


## REMI ROY

## DIRECTOR OF SCOUTING \& PRO PERSONNEL

Remi Roy is currently in his 13th season with the New England Revolution and his fifth as the club's Director of Scouting \& Player Personnel, named to the position in January 2018. Roy has been with the club since 2010, previously serving as an assistant coach with New England for eight seasons.

In his current role, Roy focuses on scouting and talent identification in players at the collegiate, national, and international levels. He works closely with the Revolution technical staff in player evaluation and has a role in all soccer-related aspects of the club, including communication with agents and facilitating MLS communication and compliance.

Roy was heavily engaged in the Revolution's scouting operations throughout his tenure as an assistant coach, contributing to the club's domestic and international scouting efforts. As an assistant coach, first under Steve Nicol and then for six seasons on Jay Heaps' staff, he worked primarily with the Revs' first-team goalkeepers and also provided additional training for the Revolution Academy goalkeepers.

During his time on the Revs' coaching staff, Roy mentored several talented goalkeepers and helped them each achieve success in the professional ranks. In addition to coaching former Revs goalkeeper Matt Reis in his pursuit of MLS longevity and success, Roy also mentored Bobby Shuttleworth and Brad Knighton.

Roy joined the Revolution after 10 years as the assistant coach/goalkeepers coach for both the men's and women's soccer teams at the University of Mobile in Alabama, his alma mater. During his tenure in Mobile, Roy served as the Puerto Rico national team's goalkeepers coach in its preparations for the 2010 FIFA World Cup.


## CURT ONALFO <br> TECHNICAL DIRECTOR

Curt Onalfo is in his fourth season as Technical Director of the New England Revolution after his appointment to the position on June 2, 2019. In his role, Onalfo works closely with Sporting Director Bruce Arena managing the club's day-to-day soccer operations, including oversight of Revolution II, the Revolution Academy and the scouting department.

The Sao Paulo, Brazil native and Ridgefield, Conn. product joins the Revolution following an extensive coaching and playing career in Major League Soccer and with the United States Men's National Team. Onalfo has won MLS Cup as both a player and a coach, including one as a member of D.C. United in 1999, and three as an assistant coach with the LA Galaxy in 2011, 2012, and 2014.

Onalfo owns 12 total years of MLS coaching experience, highlighted by stints as head coach of D.C. United (2010), the then-Kansas City Wizards (2007-09), and the LA Galaxy (2017). While continuing as an assistant with the Galaxy, he also served as the inaugural head coach of USL Championship side LA Galaxy II from 2014-16, where he led the club to a Western Conference title in 2015. When he departed "Los Dos" to take over head coaching duties with the Galaxy first team, his overall record with the developmental side finished at 46-29-20.

On the international level, Onalfo spent six years as an assistant coach for the United States Men's National Team under Bruce Arena. He served as an assistant for the USMNT from 2002-07 - including at the 2002 and 2006 FIFA Men's World CupTM - and also worked as an assistant with the U.S. Under-23 MNT in 2002. Prior to joining the Revolution, he most recently assisted the U.S. Under-20 Men's National Team from 2018 through May 2019, including in Poland at the FIFA U-20 Men's World CupTM, and briefly served as acting head coach of the U-19 side for a training camp in January 2019.

Onalfo, 50, entered the coaching ranks an assistant with D.C. United in 2000 following his retirement. He remained with the Black and Red until September 2002, briefly serving as interim head coach in 2001. After his time in the U.S. Men's National Team setup, Onalfo was appointed head coach of the Kansas City Wizards shortly after the 2006 FIFA Men's World Cup. He led Kansas City for two-and-a-half seasons, compiling a 27-29-22 record, and helped the club reach the postseason twice, including a Western Conference Finals appearance in 2007. In December 2009, Onalfo was named head coach of D.C. United, where he would remain for eight months before departing the club.

After starring for Ridgefield High School, Onalfo played collegiately for Bruce Arena at the University of Virginia from 1987-1990. In four seasons with the Cavaliers, he earned a pair of All-ACC First Team selections and helped the team win the 1988 ACC Championship. He began his professional career with French side La Ciotat in 1991, before featuring for the Connecticut Wolves of the USISL from 1994-95, and Mexican second division side Tampico Madero in 1995.

Onalfo was selected by the LA Galaxy in the inaugural MLS Draft and would make 13 appearances for the club in 1996, helping it reach the first ever MLS Cup. The defender went on to register 23 appearances across four seasons in MLS, spending additional time with San Jose (1997) and D.C. United (1998-99). He recorded one international cap with the U.S. Men's National Team and featured extensively at the youth level, including the 1989 FIFA World Youth Championship, the 1991 Pan American Games, and the 1992 Summer Olympics.

Onalfo's journey took a detour soon after the 1992 Olympics, when a diagnosis of stage three Hodgkin's disease at the age of 24 disrupted his career and nearly ended his life. After surviving his arduous battle with cancer, Onalfo resumed his playing career with Connecticut and then Mexican side Tampico FC, before joining the Galaxy for the inaugural MLS season.
