MATCH NOTES

- This is the 35th regular-season matchup between the two sides and first of the season, with Seattle leading the series 15-11-8. Sounders FC is 3-2-0 in its last five matches against the Bay Area side.
- Sounders FC most recently lost 1-0 to Inter Miami CF last weekend. The club used a heavily rotated lineup from its last match, a 1-1 draw with NYCFC in the second leg of the 2022 Scotiabank Concacaf Champions League Semifinals. Defender Xavier Arreaga was the only player who remained in the starting XI from that match.
- San Jose is coming off of a 2-2 home draw with Nashville SC that saw Jeremy Ebobisee bag a brace. It was his fourth and fifth goals of the season, tied for the most in league
- The Earthquakes currently sit in last place in the Supporters' Shield standings with an 0-4-3 record, good for three points. The club's three draws came against Columbus, Austin FC and Nashville SC.
- Sounders FC advanced to the 2022 Scotiabank Concacaf Champions League Final after defeating New York City FC 4-2 on aggregate.
 Seattle is trying to become the first MLS team to hoist the SCCL trophy, which crowns the best team from North America, Mexico and the Caribbean.
- Sounders FC's U-17 squad won the 2022 U-17 Generation Adidas Cup last weekend, defeating Tigres UANL's U-17 team 2-0. It was the Rave Green's second consecutive U-17 GA Cup title, with goals coming from Chris Aquino and Etienne Veillard.
- Additionally, Sounders FC goalkeeper Wyatt Nelson was named Best Goalkeeper and midfielder Stuart Hawkins was named Most Valuable Player of the tournament.

SOUNDERS FC GAME NOTES

SFC ADVANCES TO SCCL FINAL



Sounders FC drew 1-1 with New York City FC on April 13 at Red Bull Arena in the second leg of the 2022 Scotiabank Concacaf Champions League Semifinals. With Raúl Ruidíaz scoring his first SCCL goal, the scoreline was good enough for a 4-2 aggregate win to send Seattle to the Concacaf Champions League Final for the first time in club history. The Rave Green will meet Liga MX powerhouse Pumas UNAM for a chance to be the first MLS team to hoist the SCCL trophy, with Seattle being only the fifth MLS side to ever reach the continental championship.

Seattle found the back of the net in the 28th minute, with Nouhou streaking down the left flank and delivering a cross that found the feet of Ruidíaz, who bagged the one-time finish to put the away side up a goal in the first half.

NYCFC leveled the match early in the second half in the 51st minute when Thiago Andrade took the ball to the edge of the area and slotted a pass that Valentín Castellanos dummied to a waiting Santiago Rodríguez, who rocketed a shot into the bottom corner of the net.

Sounders FC goalkeeper Stefan Frei notably recorded seven saves in the contest to help hold the lead, including a full-body, point-blank save against NYCFC's Talles Magno in the 73rd minute.

The first leg of the Final is being played in Mexico City on April 27 at 7:30 p.m. PT, with the Rave Green hosting the second leg at Lumen Field on May 4 at 7:00 p.m. PT.

In less than 24 hours, the lower bowl of Lumen Field had sold out as fans flocked to get tickets for the second leg in Seattle. Additional sections in the 300 level were opened up as a result, with thousands of those being sold as well more than two weeks before the contest.

MATCH NOTES

- Sounders FC becomes the fifth MLS team to reach the Scotiabank Concacaf Champions League Final and is set to face Liga MX side Pumas UNAM in the two-legged championship matchup. Previous MLS sides to reach the final are Real Salt Lake (2010-2011), CF Montréal (2014-2015), Toronto FC (2018) and LAFC (2020).
- No MLS club has won the current iteration of the Concacaf Champions League. The winner of the tournament goes on to represent the region as the top club side from North America, Central America and the Caribbean at the 2022 FIFA Club World Cup.
- This year's Champions League Final marks the first time Sounders FC and Pumas have met in competitive action. The Mexico City-based club has reached the SCCL Final on one other occasion in 2005 (then the Concacaf Champions Cup), falling to Saprissa 3-2 on aggregate.
- Raúl Ruidíaz scored his first goal of 2022 across all competitions, as well as his first career SCCL strike. The Designated Player has 62 goals across all competitions for Seattle since signing in 2018, second in club history behind Fredy Montero's 72.

SFC FALLS TO INTER MIAMI CF

Sounders FC fell 1-0 at home to Inter Miami CF on last weekend at Lumen Field. Robbie Robinson scored the game's lone goal as the visitors earned three points and snapped Seattle's seven-match unbeaten streak (4-0-3) across all competitions.

After a short turnaround from a April 13 Scotiabank Concacaf Champions League road match at NYCFC, Head Coach Brian Schmetzer rotated his squad significantly. Deploying a 4-2-3-1 formation, Schmetzer made 10 changes to the lineup from Wednesday, with Xavier Arreaga as the lone holdover starter.

Inter Miami CF found the net in the 42nd minute when DeAndre Yedlin played a cross in from the left flank that found the body of Robbie Robinson, who was able to deflect it past the outstretched hands of Sounders FC goalkeeper Stefan Cleveland. It was a homecoming for Yedlin, who played in Seattle from 2013-2014 after signing as the club's first Homegrown Player.

SFC WINS U-17 GA CUP

Sounders FC Academy U-17s have now won back-to-back Generation adidas Cup titles, following a comprehensive 2-0 victory over Liga MX giants Tigres UANL last weekend behind goals from Chris Aquino and Etienne Veillard.

Back in 2019, Seattle became the first MLS team to win the top flight of GA Cup, which is the most prestigious youth soccer tournament in North America, by toppling international giants like Flamengo, River Plate, West Ham and Valencia. Two years later, and with a completely new crop of players, the Rave Green are back-to-back champions.

Facing a Liga MX powerhouse for the third time in the tournament, the young Sounders came flying out of the gates against Tigres. Seattle nearly grabbed the opening goal in the 21st minute when Alex Hall fired a shot from distance that nearly snuck into the bottom corner. One minute later, Sounders goalkeeper Wyatt Nelson produced a stunning save in the top corner to keep the match level

The Rave Green finally found the breakthrough in the 32nd minute when substitute Aquino's golazo from distance nestled into the side netting just two minutes and 48 seconds after entering the match. Seattle capitalized on the momentum just 25 seconds into the second half when Veillard burst down the right flank and slid his shot past the goalkeeper. Both goals were assisted by Alex Hall, who was playing as a central attacking midfielder after starring on the wing throughout the tournament.

Despite protecting a 2-0 lead, the U17s carved out several chances to extend their lead, with Antonio Herrera coming close after a clinical counter attack. Tigres piled on the pressure in the final 15 minutes, but the Rave Green maintained the clean sheet and emerged victorious.

DEFIANCE LOSES TO WFC2

Tacoma Defiance (1-2-1, 4 points) fell 2-1 to Whitecaps FC 2 (1-1-2, 6 points) on April 17 at Starfire Stadium. Tacoma's Eric Kinzner scored his first goal as a professional for the home side since joining the club in 2021, but it wasn't enough as Whitecaps FC 2 was able to find the late winner to earn all three points.

Whitecaps FC 2 opened the scoring in the 27th minute via Pepe Fernandez-Salvador, who was able to get his head on the end of a cross sent in by Simone Masi and strike the ball past Defiance goalkeeper Andrew Thomas. Tacoma quickly leveled the score in the 33rd minute when Kinzner scored on a header of his own, this time getting on the end of a free kick sent in by Marlon Vargas.

Whitecaps FC 2 took the lead late in the contest, scoring in the 86th minute via Emiliano Brienza, who got his body on a defected cross and knocked it into the back of the net to seal the match.

RAVE GREEN ANNOUNCE 2022 BROADCAST SCHEDULE

Seattle Sounders FC announced on February 25 its complete regional broadcast details for the 2022 Major League Soccer season. Fans of the club can continue to follow the Rave Green through one of the most diverse slates in Major League Soccer, as Seattle maintains its relationships with all of its existing regional television, streaming and radio partners.

In regional television, the club's home remains FOX 13 (KCPQ Channel 13) and FOX 13+ (KZJO cable 10 / Channel 22), seeing FOX 13+ return as the primary television home for regional broadcasts of the Rave Green throughout Western Washington for the fifth straight season. All home and away Sounders FC matches for non-nationally televised broadcasts are available to in-market fans, with FOX 13 carrying four contests and FOX 13+ carrying the remainder of the schedule. FOX 13 and FOX 13+ continue to provide both a 30-minute pre-match show and 30-minute post-match wrap-up following each game.

FOX 13 is also carrying several Sounders FC specials during the 2022 season, including a Sounders FC Matchday program airing on FOX 13+ at 4:00 p.m. PT Sunday, February 27 ahead of the club's opening MLS Regular Season match vs. Nashville SC. Addition-



ally, FOX 13 is profiling the team during its weekly Seattle Sports Live sportscast, which airs Sundays at 11:00 p.m. PT on KCPQ following the flagship FOX 13 News at 10. Dating back to the first year of the partnership between the Rave Green and KCPQ in 2014, Sounders FC's regional broadcast ratings have led Major League Soccer each season, a hallmark of the continuing relationship between the two organizations.

Prime Video continues as Seattle's official video streaming home in 2022, following a landmark agreement in 2020 that saw Sounders FC become the first professional soccer club to team up with the streaming service, as well as just the second sports franchise for which Prime Video secured regional broadcast rights (following Major League Baseball's New York Yankees).

Prime Video is the exclusive streaming destination for the Rave Green, with all regionally televised Sounders FC MLS matches available on Prime Video to fans with a Prime membership throughout the entire state of Washington at no additional cost. Sounders FC's regional broadcast territory extends throughout the entirety of Washington State – inclusive of the traditional Seattle-Tacoma-Everett television DMA and key population centers like Spokane, Yakima, Tri-Cities and Vancouver, Washington – allowing fans everywhere in the Evergreen State the opportunity to watch the Rave Green via Prime Video. Stream from the web or using the Prime Video app on your smartphone, tablet, set-top box, game console, or select smart TV.

New in 2022, fans accessing Sounders FC matches through Prime Video can watch the games in native 1080p / full HD resolution streaming content, the highest standard in the broadcasting and streaming industry.

Additionally, fans accessing the Rave Green through Prime Video can find club-specific content available via the dedicated Sounders FC team page, which houses live and archived regional Sounders FC matches, highlights, player interviews, press conferences and more.

Keith Costigan, Kasey Keller and Steve Zakuani all return to the booth in 2022, reprising their roles from past seasons. In his seventh year with Sounders FC, Costigan is once again set to call regional matches for the Rave Green, while maintaining his national duties with FOX Sports. Former MLS Sounders Keller and Zakuani return to their analyst duties, as the former United States Men's National Team goalkeeper and the 2009 first overall SuperDraft selection are set to work alongside a choice selection of rotating pre-match, halftime and post-match talent. Among this group are former Sounders Brad Evans, Marcus Hahnemann, James Riley and Lamar Neagle, as well as fan favorite and former FOX 13 sports reporter Michelle Ludkta, who returns this season to host home match coverage.

In radio, Sounders FC continues its flagship partnership with iHeartMedia Seattle for the fifth-consecutive season. All home and away Sounders FC MLS matches are being carried on Sports Radio 950 KJR AM or 1090 KJR AM, including a dedicated 30-minute pregame and 30-minute postgame show surrounding each contest. Additionally, the station is continuing its hour-long Sounders Weekly program, hosted by Jackson Felts and airing at 7:00 p.m. PT every Tuesday evening throughout the season, while Head Coach Brian Schmetzer joins Dave "Softy" Mahler and Dick Fain every Tuesday evening live at 5:45 p.m. PT.

"We couldn't be prouder to continue bringing Sounders FC fans yet another season of club programming on Sports Radio KJR," said Rich Moore, Senior Vice President of Programming for iHeartMedia Seattle. "The Rave Green's supporters are unmatched in their passion for the club, and we're excited for them to continue listening to all the action on 950 KJR AM, 1090 KJR AM and the iHeartRadio App."

Introduced last season and continuing in 2022, match action audio for regionally televised games is being simulcast between television and radio, with radio listeners able to take advantage of the exceptional crew that the Rave Green has in Costigan, Keller and Zakuani. For nationally televised matches, the trio is calling Sounders FC games exclusively for the radio broadcast. As mentioned above, dedicated pregame and postgame shows continue to bracket every radio broadcast, with Jackson Felts leading those efforts and working alongside Pete Fewing, Danny Jackson and Diego Arrioja.

The club also continues its partnership with El Rey 1360 AM as the Spanish-language home for Sounders FC matches in 2022. With play-by-play voice "Zuper" Mario Rodríguez alongside Carlos Tapia and Felipe Maqueda on the call, El Rey 1360 AM is set to carry all 34 Sounders FC matches during the 2022 regular season. El Rey 1360 AM also offers 30-minute pre-match and post-match shows as part of its matchday coverage, as well as a 30-minute weekly radio show, Somos Sounders FC. The latter is hosted by Felipe Maqueda, and he is joined by Carolina Antipolo, Carlos Tapia and Marlo Vilela, airing Saturday mornings at 10:30 a.m. PT

In addition, Sounders FC is in active conversations with longtime partner Univision-Seattle (KUNS-TV) to air a select number of match broadcasts and Sounders FC Fútbol en Vivo programs throughout the year. More information will be released in the coming weeks.

SOUNDERS FC ANNOUNCES NEW TRAINING CENTER AT LONGACRES



In a landmark announcement, Seattle Sounders FC revealed on February 16 plans for the development of a new state-of-the-art home in Renton, Washington. Located on the site of Boeing's former corporate headquarters at the historic Longacres, the new home of the Rave Green is set to provide a world-class sporting facility for Major League Soccer's winningest team over the past decade, housing the club's entire soccer and business ecosystem for the first time in Sounders FC history.

Known as the Sounders FC Center at Longacres, the club is working in partnership with Seat-tle-based Unico Properties on the expansive project, with an expected opening in 2024. Inclusive of four full-size training pitches and 50,000 square feet of space for both the club's soccer operations and front office personnel, the facility ushers in a new era for Sounders FC as the club readies for its 50th anniversary in two years' time. Since entering MLS in 2009, the club has trained at Starfire Sports in Tukwila. The announcement was revealed earlier today at the club's new Longacres home in front of assembled media, with representatives from Sounders FC and Unico appearing alongside King County Executive Dow Constantine and Renton Mayor Armondo Pavone.

As part of the club's March to the 50th – Sounders FC's official celebration of its 50th anniversary in 2024 – the Rave Green also announced plans to recognize its heritage and vision for the future during today's proceedings. Sounders FC's fans are at the heart of everything the club does – from

the original naming of the organization to voting on the team's General Manager every four years – and over the coming weeks, fan outreach is taking place to explore the club's brand identity with the next 50 years in mind. Fully grounded in the club's ethos of Democracy in Sports, further details of this process are outlined below.

"Today is one of the most important moments in our club's history, as we begin this new partnership with Unico Properties and take our first steps into the future of Seattle Sounders FC," said Sounders FC Majority Owner Adrian Hanauer. "Our organization has invested a great deal of time and thoughtfulness into the process of both selecting the ideal site for a new home and reimagining what that home represents, for our team and the greater community. With Longacres, we've found a location brimming with Pacific Northwest history where the Sounders – a team that brings its own deep roots, growing since 1974 – can plant our flag and create a home for our next 50 years. We're excited to work with terrific partners in Unico and the City of Renton as this project comes to life, and our club fully embraces the stewardship of managing an important historical site like Longacres."

Hanauer continues, "I would also like to thank Starfire Sports and the City of Tukwila. Sounders FC has always been a community club, and, over the years, that has been exemplified by team's place at Starfire, a true hub and gathering place for soccer in our region. We're grateful to Starfire – and the welcoming spirit of Tukwila – for serving as the home of the Rave Green and seeing us through some incredible successes. While the time has come for Sounders FC to move into its own facility, Starfire Sports and Tukwila will always be close to our hearts and a part of our history."

"We are excited by the opportunity to anchor this storied property with the Seattle Sounders," said Unico Properties Chief Investment Officer Ned Carner. "We could not be more excited to partner with a group like the Sounders that shares in our mission to create a project that builds up the surrounding community, while also enhancing the lives of the people that choose to live and work at Longacres for years to come."

As part of the club's commitment to sustainability within Sounders FC's Social Justice Framework, best-in-class environmentally friendly building systems and infrastructure are being utilized throughout the Sounders FC Center at Longacres. The design process is headed by Kansas City-based Generator Studio, a leading firm in the sports design and architecture world. Recently, Generator oversaw the creation of the Seattle Kraken's Community Iceplex in Northgate, in addition to recent projects for the NWSL's Kansas City Current, the Tampa Bay Lightning and St. Louis Blues of the NHL, along with the NBA's Brooklyn Nets.

"The Sounders' legacy and fandom is unequaled in MLS, and our office is ready for the challenge of helping the club elevate what a modern MLS training center means," said Generator Studio co-founder Tom Proebstle. "The Sounders FC Center at Longacres will provide space for operations and training to be under one roof, bringing players, staff and community together."

e at their former architecture firm AECOM. Following their work on Lumen Field,

Generator Studio co-founders Proebstle and Mike Kress have been working on Seattle sports venues since 1998, beginning with the design of Lumen Field while at their former architecture firm AECOM. Following their work on Lumen Field, Proebstle and Kress were instrumental in the design and construction of the Virginia Mason Athletic Center for the NFL's Seattle Seahawks while at Crawford Architects. Since founding Generator Studio, multiple sports projects have culminated in the grand opening of the Kraken Community Iceplex, providing the first sheet of ice in the city of Seattle in modern times.

Central to the combined vision of Sounders FC, Unico and Generator Studio is a team-first design layout that is truly built around the holistic needs of the entire Rave Green organization. In the coming months, further specifics of the design process will be publicly shared, with amenities that showcase Sounders FC's new home as one of the top sporting facilities in North America, and one that allows for deeper connection with the club's fans, supporters and partners.

With 2024 on the horizon, the club is not only opening the Sounders FC Center at Longacres that year, it is also celebrating its 50th anniversary as part of the greater Puget Sound community. A major milestone for the organization, the club's March to the 50th is intended as a two-year rallying cry for both celebrating that unique history while also casting an eye to the future.

Sounders fans named the original 1974 North American Soccer League team, again choosing the same team name in 2008 prior to the club's launch in Major League Soccer, winning by an overwhelming majority via write-in option. Since joining MLS, the club has worked shoulder-to-shoulder with its Alliance Members – as Sounders FC season ticket holders are known – working on everything together from the club's General Manager vote, Alliance Annual Business Meetings and kit designs for the players. This Democracy in Sports ethos runs throughout the entire organization, and as the club prepares for its future and explores its brand and visual identities, Sounders FC is beginning the process of reaching out to its fan base to begin an open dialogue.
