MATCH NOTES

SOUNDERS FC GAME NOTES

SEATTLE FALLS TO COLORADO RAPIDS



Sounders FC fell 1-0 on May 22 to the Colorado Rapids at Dick's Sporting Goods Park. Jonathan Lewis scored the game's lone goal for the home side as Seattle saw its two-match winning streak snapped. It marked the end of a stretch of three matches in eight days for Sounders FC, who defeated Minnesota and Houston earlier in the week.

Colorado scored the game's lone goal in the 50th minute, when a Diego Rubio cross from the right flank was deflected by Stefan Frei into the body of Seattle defender Yeimar before Lewis poked it into the back of the net.

MATCH NOTES

- Sounders FC saw its two-match winning streak snapped and is now 4-6-1 in league play, ranking 12th in the Western Conference with 13 points.
- Seattle is now 22-8-4 all-time against Colorado (including postseason play), with a 8-6-3 record at Dick's Sporting Goods Park.
- Head Coach Brian Schmetzer deployed a 5-4-1 formation with two changes from Wednesday's match at Houston: Obed Vargas and Jackson Ragen replacing Nico Lodeiro and Alex Roldan.
- Lodeiro remained in Seattle following the birth of his child, while Roldan was suspended after receiving two yellow cards last Wednesday in Houston.

ALL-TIME VS. EXPANSION TEAMS

As one of the most successful expansion franchises in American sports history, Sounders FC has fared well in its first outing against expansion sides. The club is 5-2-4 with a 21-10 goal advantage all-time in its first match against expansion teams, beginning with a 2-0 win over the Philadelphia Union in 2010.

After drawing in its first-ever MLS matches against Cascadia rivals Portland and Vancouver, the Rave Green suffered their first loss to the Montreal Impact in 2012 before going unbeaten in the following four matches against New York City FC, Orlando City SC, Atlanta United FC and Minnesota United FC. Seattle dropped a 1-0 decision to expansion side LAFC in its opener in 2018, then defeated FC Cincinnati 4-1 in the 2019 season opener. The club then drew with Austin FC in 2021. Sounders FC did not face Nashville SC or Inter Miami CF in their respective expansion seasons.

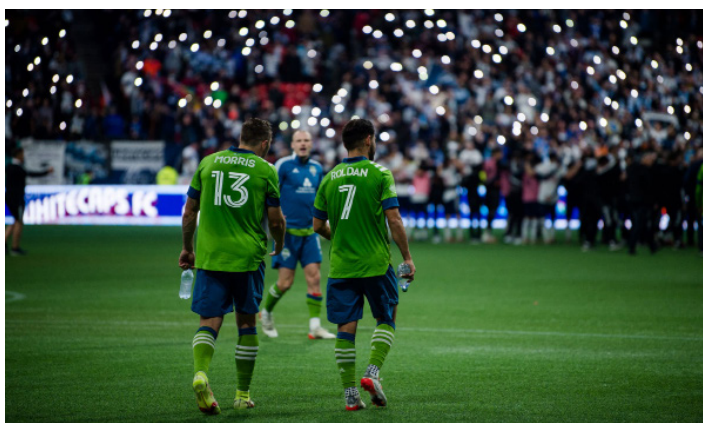

After recording his first clean sheet of the season on May 18 at Houston Dynamo FC, Sounders FC goalkeeper Stefan Frei now sits in sole possession of third place for most shutouts in MLS history with 87.

With only Nick Rimando (154) and Kevin Hartman (112) standing above him, Frei broke his tie with Joe Cannon with his performance against Houston.

Frei, who recorded 19 shutouts over the first six years of his MLS career with Toronto FC, joined Seattle prior to the 2014 season. He has since set club records in every goalkeeping category, leading the club to five major trophies.

MORRIS & ROLDAN NAMED TO USMNT



Sounders FC forward Jordan Morris and midfielder Cristian Roldan have been called up to the United States Men's National Team for the June FIFA window, which includes two international friendlies and two Concacaf Nations League matches. The USMNT is set to play friendlies against Morocco on June 1 in Cincinnati (4:30 p.m. PT / ESPN2, UniMás, TUDN) and Uruguay on June 5 in Kansas City (2:00 p.m. PT / FOX, Univision, TUDN), before launching 2022-2023 Concacaf Nations League action against Grenada on June 10 in Austin (7:00 p.m. PT / ESPN+, UniMás, TUDN) and El Salvador on June 14 in San Salvador (7:00 p.m. PT / FS1, Univision, TUDN).

Morris, 27, receives another call-up after making six appearances during the USMNT's successful World Cup Qualifying campaign. Morris has started 19 of his 46 career appearances for the Stars and Stripes since his debut in 2014, scoring 10 goals, including four during the Concacaf Nations League in late 2019. The Mercer Island native has five goals in 16 appearances for Sounders FC across all competitions in 2022.

Roldan, 26, has started 14 of his 31 career international caps, including five appearances during the USMNT's successful World Cup Qualifying run. The University of Washington product earned his first call-up in January of 2017 for a friendly against Ghana, before making his debut later that year in the Concacaf Gold Cup. Roldan has tallied three goals and leads Sounders FC with eight assists across all competitions in 2022.

RAVE GREEN WIN 2022 SCOTIABANK CONCACAF CHAMPIONS LEAGUE TITLE



Sounders FC defeated Pumas UNAM 3-0 on May 4 in the second leg of the 2022 Scotiabank Concacaf Champions League Final, securing a 5-2 aggregate result and becoming the first MLS team to hoist the continental trophy that crowns the best club team in North America, Central America and the Caribbean. After a 2-2 draw in Mexico City on April 27, the second leg result featured a brace from Raúl Ruidíaz and a goal from Nico Lodeiro to secure the title for Seattle. With the win, Seattle also clinches a spot in the FIFA Club World Cup, where the Rave Green will battle the confederation champions from each global region.

Ruidíaz opened the scoring for the home side in the 45th minute. Albert Rusnák crossed from the left flank that found the feet of Xavier Arreaga, who dropped a pass down to Ruidíaz, whose shot took a deflection off a Pumas defender and bounced into the back of the net. In the 80th minute after streaking up the right flank, Jordan Morris found Lodeiro at the top of the area for a deft pass to Ruidíaz before the striker finished his chance at the near post to complete the brace. Lodeiro sealed the game for Seattle in the 88th minute, finishing a point-blank effort after a Morris shot deflected off the post right to his feet.

The sellout crowd of 68,741 broke the all-time Concacaf Champions League Final attendance record for a standalone match. The Seattle fans that packed Lumen Field surpassed the crowd of 66,208 that watched the 2014-2015 Semifinal second leg between Club América and Herediano at Estadio Azteca. The Lumen Field crowd was also the largest of the 2022 Champions League tournament, breaking the mark of 56,094 set during the second leg of the Semifinals between Cruz Azul and Pumas, also at Estadio Azteca. Wednesday's attendance was the second-highest in Sounders FC history, coming in just behind the 69,274 that watched the Rave Green claim the 2019 MLS Cup on home turf. It marked the ninth time over 60,000 fans have packed Lumen Field for a Sounders FC match, with the club going 8-0-1 in those games.

MATCH NOTES

- Sounders FC becomes the first MLS side to win a Scotiabank Concacaf Champions League title. Four MLS teams previously had reached the final: Real Salt Lake (2010-2011), CF Montréal (2014-2015), Toronto FC (2018) and LAFC (2020).
- Goalkeeper Stefan Frei recorded his fourth shutout of the competition and was named both Goalkeeper of the Tournament and Player of the Tournament. In eight appearances in 2022 SCCL play, Frei allowed just five goals and recorded 26 saves.
- With his brace, Raúl Ruidíaz finished with three goals in 2022 SCCL play, tied for fourth in the tournament alongside teammates Jordan Morris and Fredy Montero. Ruidíaz has now scored against three Liga MX opponents for Sounders FC: Pumas in last night's CCL Final second leg, in addition to Tigres and Santos Laguna in last season's Leagues Cup.
- Nico Lodeiro's 88th minute strike gave him three goals across the two Final legs against Pumas, following his late brace in the first leg in Mexico City. Seattle's captain finished the tournament with five goals, second behind only Pumas' Juan Dinenno, who led the competitions with nine goals. He also finished tied for fifth with two assists in the tournament.
- Sounders FC is now 8-9-4 all-time against Liga MX opponents in SCCL and Leagues Cup play.
- Cristian Roldan led the 2022 SCCL tournament with five assists.
- This marks the eighth major trophy Sounders FC has won since entering MLS in 2009: four Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cups (2009-2011, 2014), one Supporters' Shield (2014), two MLS Cups (2016, 2019) and one Concacaf Champions League (2022).

SOUNDERS FC ANNOUNCES NEW TRAINING CENTER AT LONGACRES



In a landmark announcement, Seattle Sounders FC revealed on February 16 plans for the development of a new state-of-the-art home in Renton, Washington. Located on the site of Boeing's former corporate headquarters at the historic Longacres, the new home of the Rave Green is set to provide a world-class sporting facility for Major League Soccer's winningest team over the past decade, housing the club's entire soccer and business ecosystem for the first time in Sounders FC history.

Known as the Sounders FC Center at Longacres, the club is working in partnership with Seattle-based Unico Properties on the expansive project, with an expected opening in 2024. Inclusive of four full-size training pitches and 50,000 square feet of space for both the club's soccer operations and front office personnel, the facility ushers in a new era for Sounders FC as the club readies for its 50th anniversary in two years' time. Since entering MLS in 2009, the club has trained at Starfire Sports in Tukwila. The announcement was revealed earlier today at the club's new Longacres home in front of assembled media, with representatives from Sounders FC and Unico appearing alongside King County Executive Dow Constantine and Renton Mayor Armondo Pavone.

As part of the club's March to the 50th – Sounders FC's official celebration of its 50th anniversary in 2024 – the Rave Green also announced plans to recognize its heritage and vision for the future during today's proceedings. Sounders FC's fans are at the heart of everything the club does – from

the original naming of the organization to voting on the team's General Manager every four years – and over the coming weeks, fan outreach is taking place to explore the club's brand identity with the next 50 years in mind. Fully grounded in the club's ethos of Democracy in Sports, further details of this process are outlined below.

"Today is one of the most important moments in our club's history, as we begin this new partnership with Unico Properties and take our first steps into the future of Seattle Sounders FC," said Sounders FC Majority Owner Adrian Hanauer. "Our organization has invested a great deal of time and thoughtfulness into the process of both selecting the ideal site for a new home and reimagining what that home represents, for our team and the greater community. With Longacres, we've found a location brimming with Pacific Northwest history where the Sounders – a team that brings its own deep roots, growing since 1974 – can plant our flag and create a home for our next 50 years. We're excited to work with terrific partners in Unico and the City of Renton as this project comes to life, and our club fully embraces the stewardship of managing an important historical site like Longacres."

Hanauer continues, "I would also like to thank Starfire Sports and the City of Tukwila. Sounders FC has always been a community club, and, over the years, that has been exemplified by team's place at Starfire, a true hub and gathering place for soccer in our region. We're grateful to Starfire – and the welcoming spirit of Tukwila – for serving as the home of the Rave Green and seeing us through some incredible successes. While the time has come for Sounders FC to move into its own facility, Starfire Sports and Tukwila will always be close to our hearts and a part of our history."

"We are excited by the opportunity to anchor this storied property with the Seattle Sounders," said Unico Properties Chief Investment Officer Ned Carner. "We could not be more excited to partner with a group like the Sounders that shares in our mission to create a project that builds up the surrounding community, while also enhancing the lives of the people that choose to live and work at Longacres for years to come."

As part of the club's commitment to sustainability within Sounders FC's Social Justice Framework, best-in-class environmentally friendly building systems and infrastructure are being utilized throughout the Sounders FC Center at Longacres. The design process is headed by Kansas City-based Generator Studio, a leading firm in the sports design and architecture world. Recently, Generator oversaw the creation of the Seattle Kraken's Community Iceplex in Northgate, in addition to recent projects for the NWSL's Kansas City Current, the Tampa Bay Lightning and St. Louis Blues of the NHL, along with the NBA's Brooklyn Nets.

"The Sounders' legacy and fandom is unequalled in MLS, and our office is ready for the challenge of helping the club elevate what a modern MLS training center means," said Generator Studio co-founder Tom Proebstle. "The Sounders FC Center at Longacres will provide space for operations and training to be under one roof, bringing players, staff and community together."

Generator Studio co-founders Proebstle and Mike Kress have been working on Seattle sports venues since 1998, beginning with the design of Lumen Field while at their former architecture firm AECOM. Following their work on Lumen Field, Proebstle and Kress were instrumental in the design and construction of the Virginia Mason Athletic Center for the NFL's Seattle Seahawks while at Crawford Architects. Since founding Generator Studio, multiple sports projects have culminated in the grand opening of the Kraken Community Iceplex, providing the first sheet of ice in the city of Seattle in modern times.

Central to the combined vision of Sounders FC, Unico and Generator Studio is a team-first design layout that is truly built around the holistic needs of the entire Rave Green organization. In the coming months, further specifics of the design process will be publicly shared, with amenities that showcase Sounders FC's new home as one of the top sporting facilities in North America, and one that allows for deeper connection with the club's fans, supporters and partners.

With 2024 on the horizon, the club is not only opening the Sounders FC Center at Longacres that year, it is also celebrating its 50th anniversary as part of the greater Puget Sound community. A major milestone for the organization, the club's March to the 50th is intended as a two-year rallying cry for both celebrating that unique history while also casting an eye to the future.

Sounders fans named the original 1974 North American Soccer League team, again choosing the same team name in 2008 prior to the club's launch in Major League Soccer, winning by an overwhelming majority via write-in option. Since joining MLS, the club has worked shoulder-to-shoulder with its Alliance Members – as Sounders FC season ticket holders are known – working on everything together from the club's General Manager vote, Alliance Annual Business Meetings and kit designs for the players. This Democracy in Sports ethos runs throughout the entire organization, and as the club prepares for its future and explores its brand and visual identities, Sounders FC is beginning the process of reaching out to its fan base to begin an open dialogue.

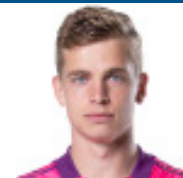

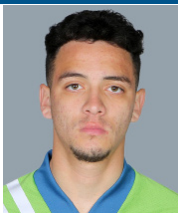
