On Earth Day, the first team players joined forces with Whitecaps FC Girls Elite players to visit Admiral Seymour Elementary and lead students in a community clean up. They also collaborated with Ocean Wise and TELUS employees in June to collect over 100 kilos of trash from the shoreline along Spanish Banks beach, as part of the MLS Greener Goals program.

Attacking midfielder Ryan Gauld and his fiancé Kat are passionate supporters of Covenant House Vancouver and its mission to alleviate youth homelessness in the city. They made a donation to Covenant House in June and toured the facility to learn about the latest initiatives designed to support vulnerable youth.



In September, the first team players – along with mascot Spike and Club staff – made a return to BC Children's Hospital in the first visit since the pandemic. There they distributed Spike dolls, signed autographs, and played soccer with patients and their family members, in an effort to spread cheer and optimism.

Our second annual Vaisakhi Match celebrating the South Asian community and the Solar New Year was an explosion of bright colour and local talent, featuring:


- March to the Match led by the Sikh Motorcycle Club

INDIGENOUS PEOPLES CELEBRATION MATCH

Our third annual Indigenous Peoples Celebration Match was delivered in partnership with the Host Nations and featured:

- A pre-match soccer jamboree with 75 participants from Musqueam Nation, Squamish Nation, Tsleil-Waututh Nation, Katzie First Nation, and shishalh Nation Youth Soccer
- An Indigenous Artists' Market on Terry Fox Plaza
- Host Nation performance of the Coast Salish anthem
- Performances by DJ O Show, Tsatsu Stalqayu (Coastal Wolf Pack), and Madelaine McCallum









COMMUNITY SOCCER EXPERIENCE CLINICS

The Community Soccer Experience (CSE) brings quality soccer programming to children and youth that face barriers to participation in organized sport. The program sends certified coaches to community centres, youth groups, and after-school programs to deliver high quality, grassroots soccer instruction at no cost to the participants.

Participants build new social connections through a shared love of soccer and develop new skills in a safe, fun, and inclusive environment.

In 2023, the CSE delivered over 150 free community soccer sessions around BC, impacting over 20,000 participants. The program also supplied 25 organizations with soccer equipment kits, which included 20 soccer balls, 100 cones, 50 jerseys, five ball pumps, four mini-goals, and two ball carrying bags.

'CAPS SCHOOL PROGRAM

STUDENTS OF TODAY, LEADERS OF TOMORROW

The School Program combines soccer coaching and community-based education to equip students with the skills that are foundational for leadership, both on and off the pitch.

INTRODUCTION TO SOCCER

Through 30 minute in-person sessions, our dedicated team of grassroots soccer coaches helps students develop physical literacy, sportsmanship, teamwork, respect for others, and appreciation for an active lifestyle.

The soccer clinics focus on core skill development, including ball control, passing, dribbling and shooting. Every student is equipped with soccer drills to practice at home, with family members encouraged to join.
