MEDIA GUIDELINES AND INFORMATION



TRAINING SESSION INFORMATION

Media who plan to attend a training session are encouraged to alert the MNUFC Communications team by 6:00 p.m. CT the evening prior to the session.

Media who have RSVP'd will be alerted to any changes in training field locations. MNUFC generally trains at the National Sports Center in Blaine, Minnesota (1700 105th Ave NE Blaine, MN 55449). (See Map 1)

Media should plan to park in Lot A next to the Sports Hall at the National Sports Center. Parking in the back lot (Lot B) is prohibited. Media will enter the practice field from the side gate and must stay in their designated area. (See Map 1)

Media will be allowed to photograph/film training for a minimum of 15 minutes either at the beginning or end of the session. MNUFC reserves the right to close a training session at any time.

The media workspace is located at the top of the stairs inside the NSC Sports Hall. Media are invited to stay following training to finish their work in this space.

The club will provide training footage and interviews on a weekly basis.

As per MLS Media Access Policy, the following actions may result in seizure of credential and/or ejection of its wearer from the training facility:

- Requesting autographs at any time
- Taking personal photographs with players/coaches
- Using credentials for family or friends of working media members
- Conducting unauthorized interviews
- Unprofessional behavior (cheering in the press box, consumption of alcoholic beverages, failure to abide by posted rules, etc.)

GAME DAY INFORMATION

A limited number of media members have received 2024 Full-Season credentials. Those without a full-season credential are to submit a request for single-game credentials via the form at mnufc.com/new/media-credential-request **no later than 48 hours prior to kickoff**. The above form must be submitted for every game credential.

CREDENTIALLED MEDIA ONLY

Only MNUFC staff can issue a credential to media/photo personnel. Credentialed media will have access to the Press Box on the third floor and the Press Conference Room on the service level.

Credentials can be picked up at the Media Entry (See Map 2) located at the southwest corner of Allianz Field **starting two hours prior to kickoff**. Please be prepared to provide photo identification upon arrival.

The press box and working areas are accessible via the elevators located near the media entrance. These areas will be open two hours prior to kickoff. The photo workroom is located by the locker rooms and adjacent to the Field Club. To access the photo workroom, please consult Map 3.

Television 'Liveshots' are permitted on the concourse level at either the NW corner inside the stadium, in front of the Black and Blue Team Store or from the SW corner next to the Wonderwall throughout pre-game, during the game and post-game.

Media must exit the stadium through the Media Entry.

As per MLS Media Access Policy, the following actions may result in seizure of credential and/or ejection of its wearer from the stadium:

- Requesting autographs at any time
- Taking personal photographs with players/coaches
- Using credentials for family or friends of working media members
- Conducting unauthorized interviews
- Unprofessional behavior (cheering in the press box, consumption of alcoholic beverages, failure to abide by posted rules, etc.)

PHOTO PERSONNEL

Photo bibs can be picked up at the Media Entry upon arrival beginning two hours prior to kickoff. Stools can be picked up in the SE Field Tunnel. Please be prepared to present photo identification upon arrival. MNUFC staff representatives at the check-in desk can help with any questions regarding access. (See Map 2)

The SE Field Tunnel is the only access point for photo and video personnel, unless granted extra privileges. There will be no other access points to the field of play. Media members are not to access the field from the player's tunnel located at half field on the west side of the stadium. (See Map 3)

- Bibs **MUST** be visibly worn at all times on the sidelines.
- Photographers must provide a name, media outlet and phone number to check out bibs.



- Footwear worn on-field should be Adidas or unbranded.
- **Bibs and stools must be returned to the Media Entry prior to leaving Allianz Field. Do not leave them in the Photo Workroom.**

Forest Green Photo Bib

Photographers must stay behind the 18-yard box (Green Zone – See Map 3) and outside of LED boards.

Non-rights holding videographers are allowed to shoot video for the first 15 minutes of each half.

White Photo Bib

MNUFC Staff will provide a white bib for team photographers and rights holders who have been granted extra privileges.

Photographers are allowed anywhere on the field during periods of non-play (pregame, halftime, postgame).

Photographers must otherwise stay behind all field boards while the ball is in play (See Map 3).

When working in front of pitchside seats, photographers/media must not interfere with fans or their viewpoints in any way.

PARKING

On-site parking at Allianz Field is not available, and while we recommend using public transportation, we understand that is not the best option for many media with equipment.

Below are off-site, paid parking options near Allianz Field:

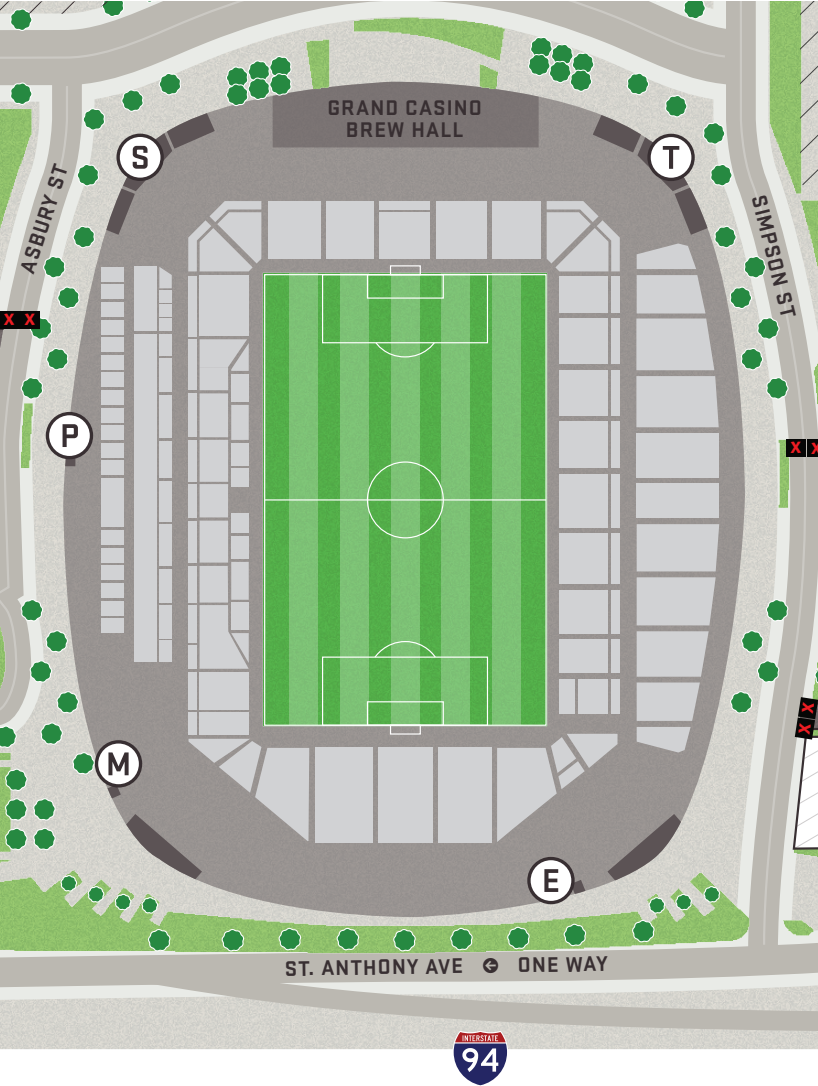

MAP 2: MEDIA AND STAFF ENTRY

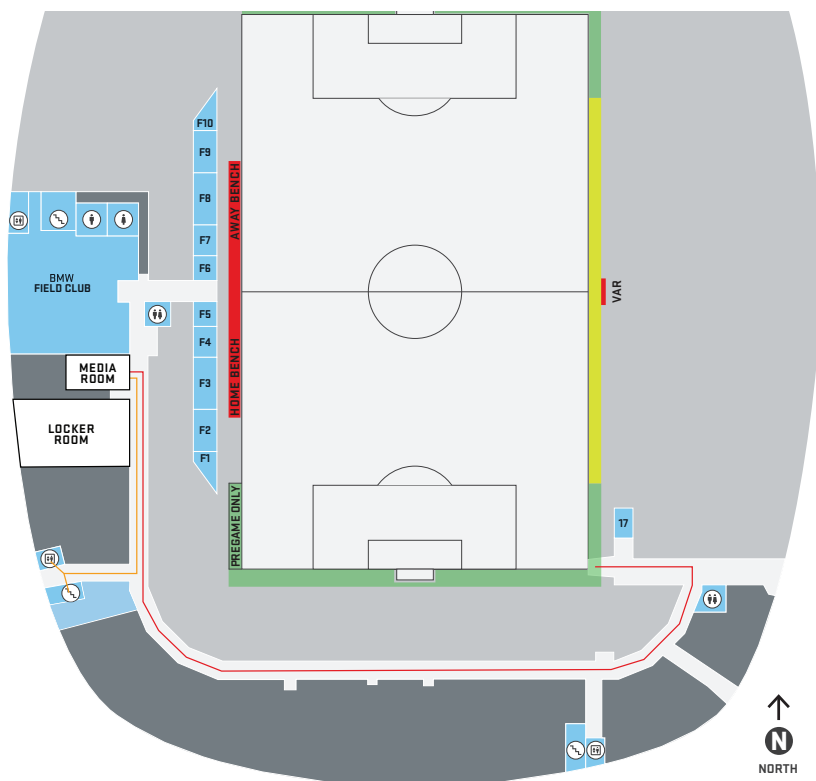

TEAM MANAGEMENT



DR. BILL MCGUIRE MANAGING PARTNER

Before Dr. McGuire purchased MNUFC, at the time known as Minnesota Stars FC, professional soccer in Minnesota was in jeopardy. After the NASL took over ownership of the team in 2011, it won the league's first championship, but was still on the verge of folding. Then, former league commissioner David Downs reached out to Dr. McGuire to save the team.

Interested in seeing the squad for himself, Dr. McGuire attended several games, culminating in the home leg of the 2012 Soccer Bowl. Inspired by the atmosphere and excitement of the fans, he purchased the team following the 2012 season.

Dr. McGuire began setting the table for a successful soccer franchise, using inspiration from fans and a visit to Bayern Munich, one of Germany's top clubs. In March 2013, the team was rebranded as Minnesota United FC. Dr. McGuire went to work building it not only to survive, but to thrive, on and off the field, expanding the front office and building partnerships with local businesses and community members.

As the club's accomplishments began to pile up, Dr. McGuire started working toward building an MLS franchise. He brought together a largely local ownership group, comprised of Twins owner Jim Pohlad; Timberwolves owner Glen Taylor; and Carlson board member Wendy Carlson Nelson, in addition to other prominent Minnesota families. The group began to work with MLS to bring MNUFC to the highest level of the game in the U.S. and secure the future of soccer in Minnesota.

On March 25, 2015, MLS awarded Minnesota United the league's 23rd franchise. For Dr. McGuire, it was an emotional moment, having seen his team go from the brink of folding to the top league in the U.S. and Canada in just two years. The team's inaugural season featured historic moments, sellouts at TCF Bank Stadium and a burgeoning gameday atmosphere which ranks among the best in the league.

Dr. McGuire and the ownership group have continued to raise the profile of the club and its community by building a privately-funded, soccer-specific stadium, Allianz Field. The stadium was completed ahead of the 2019 season in the Midway neighborhood of Saint Paul.

Showing his commitment to the community, Dr. McGuire's philanthropic efforts include donations to the Guthrie Theater, Golden Medal Park and the Walker Art Center.



SHARI BALLARD

CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER

Shari Ballard is a seasoned executive with more than 25 years of deep retail experience. In August 2021, Shari chartered a path into the world of professional sports, taking over as Chief Executive Officer for Minnesota United FC. Prior to joining MNUFC, she was the president of multichannel retail for Best Buy Co. Inc., where she was responsible for all U.S. Best Buy stores, e-commerce, Best Buy Mexico and the company's real estate strategy until August of 2018. She continued to serve as an advisor until April of 2019.

After graduating with a bachelor's degree from the University of Michigan – Flint, Ms. Ballard was hired in 1993 to work in a local Best Buy store, beginning as an assistant store manager and rising to general manager. After a variety of retail leadership roles, she was promoted to executive vice president of human resources and legal.

In 2007, Ms. Ballard assumed responsibility for Best Buy stores in the United States, focusing her energies on deepening customer relationships and better utilizing the full range of talent and resources that reside within the company's stores to drive growth. She was promoted to president of Americas, U.S. and Mexico in 2010, and two years later, she was appointed president of international, overseeing business and the transformation efforts in Canada, China, Europe and Mexico. In 2014, Ms. Ballard assumed the role of president of U.S. retail and eventually began a dual role to include chief human resources officer. In 2017, she added e-commerce to her responsibilities.

Ms. Ballard serves on the board of directors for Ecolab Inc., the global leader in water, hygiene and energy technologies and services; PetSmart the leading specialty pet retailer; Allina Health; and the board of trustees for the University of Minnesota Foundation.

KHALED EL-AHMAD

CHIEF SOCCER OFFICER AND SPORTING DIRECTOR

Born in Lebanon to Lebanese and Czech parents and raised in Sweden, Khaled El-Ahmad took an interest in soccer at a young age. It all started when he played youth soccer for his hometown club, IK Sirius FK of Sweden's topflight, in 1998. He then made his way to the United States to play collegiately for the University of Wisconsin - Milwaukee from 2000-2004, where he had a prolific playing career at the university level.

El-Ahmad then graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee in 2005 with a Bachelor of Business Administration in Marketing. Additionally, he holds a Master of Business Administration and International Business from UW Milwaukee, along with a Sports Management Leadership Diploma from Örebro University, achieved in 2013.

With his playing days past him, El-Ahmad has climbed the ranks of a 15-year-long sporting executive career. Before joining Minnesota United, he was the Chief Executive Officer and Sporting Director at Barnsley F.C. in England from 2021-2023. There, he oversaw all aspects of sporting, including direct oversight of technical strategy, roster construction and management, coaching hires and development, as well as the club's business and commercial operations.

El-Ahmad was with City Football Group (CFG) from 2015-2021, where he served as the Concacaf and Scandinavia Scouting Lead for CFG as well as supporting roster construction and recruitment for New York City FC. During his six years with CFG, El-Ahmad created and led a strong global scouting and recruiting network, which helped the club produce consistently talented and high-performing teams, including the NYCFC squad that won the 2021 MLS Cup.

Preceding his time at CFG, he served as Head of Recruitment for Djurgården Elitfotboll AB of the Swedish Allsvenskan, the first division of soccer in Sweden. In his four years with the club, El-Ahmad helped the organization construct a talented roster and created a consistent level of success built through the relationships and management of his global scouting network - culminating in the team reaching the Swedish Cup Final in 2013. El-Ahmad also held various technical staff and sporting roles from 2008-2011 in the United States and other parts of Scandinavia & Europe, including assistant-coaching, recruiting/scouting, and data-analysis positions.

Outside of his sporting leadership experience, El-Ahmad has founded several business ventures, including Connect Management Group, a women's-soccer full-service agency representing players across the globe.

Khaled is married to Fenik Saleh and they have two daughters, Ella and Livia.

ERIC RAMSAY

HEAD COACH

Eric Ramsay was announced as the second head coach in the club's Major League Soccer history on February 26, 2024. He served as a first-team coach under current English Premier League's Manchester United manager Erik ten Hag.

Born in Shrewsbury, England, and growing up in Wales, Ramsay had a short stint as a player before focusing on his coaching career, playing youth soccer for both the Shrewsbury Town and The New Saints academies. Prior to heading to the university, Ramsay appeared in 14 matches for Welshpool Town in the JD Cymru Premier. Ramsay graduated with a first-class honors degree in Sports Science with Management from Loughborough University in 2013, where he also worked as an assistant coach for the university's football team. Ramsay would join Premier League side Swansea City following graduating for three-and-a-half years as coach for the club's U18 and U21 teams.

Ramsay returned to Shrewsbury, where he was named Interim First Team Manager of Shrewsbury Town in November 2018 and later a first-team coach from December 2018 to August 2019. He also managed his hometown's club academy in 2017. Ramsay then had experience coaching the U23 squad for Chelsea Football Club, another member of the English Premier League elite. He received his UEFA Pro License in 2019 – making him the youngest British coach ever to receive that designation.

In July 2021, Ramsay began his coaching role at Manchester United while the club was under the leadership of Ole Gunnar Solskjaer, serving as a set-piece coach with involvement in player development. As an integral member of the Manchester United staff from 2021-24, he helped lead tactical training sessions, developed young stars and worked with some of the most notable soccer players in the world including Cristiano Ronaldo, Marcus Rashford, Mason Mount, Casemiro, Bruno Fernandes, and Nemanja Matić. During his two-and-a-half years with one of the top clubs in global football, Ramsay and the Red Devils won the EFL Cup and reached the FA Cup final in 2023.

Ramsay's background also includes serving as an assistant coach with the Welsh National Team in 2023.

Eric and his wife Sioned have two children, Jack (2) and Lilie (7 months). He is fluent in English, Spanish, and French and conversant in other languages. Eric Ramsay will join the club pending receipt of his work visa.





INTERIM COACHING STAFF



CAMERON KNOWLES

INTERIM HEAD COACH

Cameron Knowles was named Minnesota United interim head coach ahead of the 2024 season. He managed MNUFC2, the club's MLS NEXT Pro side, for the past two seasons, where he led his squad to a 19-20-13 (W-L-D) record in the Western Conference.

Prior to joining Minnesota United in 2021 as a first-team video analyst, Knowles spent nine years as a coach with the Portland Timbers, beginning with the 2012 MLS season. In those nine years, six were spent as an assistant coach, winning an MLS Cup in 2015 and three years as head coach for the Portland Timbers 2 team in the USL Championship. During his time in Portland, Knowles oversaw the transformation of Timbers 2, reaching the playoffs for the first time in team history in 2018, his first year as head coach. Additionally, he provided professional opportunities for academy players and developed players for the Portland first team.

Knowles holds a USSF Pro License and has a Master's Degree in Psychology.



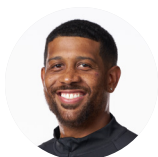
FANENDO ADI

INTERIM ASSISTANT COACH

Fanendo Adi was named to Minnesota's interim coaching staff ahead of the 2024 season after coaching the club's U19 Academy team since 2022.

Adi's prolific playing experience spanned 12 years on both an international and Major League Soccer level. The two-time MLS Cup champion began his career in MLS with the Portland Timbers, followed by a stint with Columbus Crew. He finished his playing career in Minnesota following the 2021 season. Adi notably scored 56 goals in regular-season action across all three clubs, earning his way into winning MLS Cup championships with both Portland and Columbus.

Internationally, Adi has competed in both Concacaf and UEFA Champions League contests. The Lagos, Nigeria native currently holds a USSF B Coaching License.



JEREMY HALL

INTERIM ASSISTANT COACH

Jeremy Hall was named to Minnesota's interim coaching staff ahead of the 2024 season, following three years as the assistant coach for MNUFC2.

The Tampa-native is a former MLS veteran, having played with New York Red Bulls, Portland Timbers, FC Dallas and New England Revolution and played for Sacramento Republic FC of the USL. Hall was chosen to lead the West Team during the MLS NEXT All-Star Game in 2022 during MLS' All-Star Week held in Minnesota in August 2022.

Internationally, Hall was a part of the U17 U.S. National Team and played in the U17 World Cup, but made his senior debut with the Puerto Rico National Team in 2016. The former MLS defender began his coaching career with the Toronto FC Academy in 2019 and holds a USSF National B Coaching License.



CRISTIANO COSTA

INTERIM GOALKEEPER COACH

Cristiano Costa was named to Minnesota's interim coaching staff ahead of the 2024 season and will work alongside Cameron Knowles, Fanendo Adi and Jeremy Hall. He joined the MNUFC Academy staff in July 2022 as the Head Academy Goalkeeper Coach and Assistant Coach.

Before his role at MNUFC, Costa served as a director of goalkeeping for four soccer clubs in the Chicagoland area. He has served as a Goalkeeper Coach at IMG Academy in Florida and as the Head Women's Soccer Coach at Chicago State University for five years (2017-2021).

Costa's 13-year playing career began at Clube de Regatas Vasco da Gama, where he spent nine years before transitioning to ABC in Natal and Botafogo PB, where he played two more years professionally.

He currently has his USSF B Coaching License and is working on his Master's in Tactical Periodization by Vitor Frade. He also holds an EXOS Formerly Athletes' Performance - Phase 1 License, along with other certifications in football and performance. Costa earned his BA in Business Administration with a minor in Accounting from Judson University in 2011.



AMOS MAGEE

VICE PRESIDENT, YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

Magee was named Vice President of MNUFC Youth Development in October of 2022. Magee manages the coaching staff, oversees the Academy and develops the infrastructure of the Pro Player Pathway—a path for players to move from youth soccer to the Academy, MNUFC2, and the first team. He fosters collaborative relationships throughout the Minnesota youth soccer community, with the goal of growing membership and assisting with elite player development.

Saint Paul native Magee has been with Minnesota United since 2016. In his previous role as Director of Player Personnel, Magee worked closely with former Technical Director Mark Watson in developing the Loons' sporting vision as it pertains to strategic growth and player recruitment. Additionally, Magee helped build the analytics department, scouted players from across the globe and worked with the coaching staff to construct a competitive roster representing the club's technical vision and community values.

Magee played high school soccer at Saint Paul Academy, and college soccer at Wesleyan University, where he is still the school's all-time leading scorer. He spent most of his professional career with the Minnesota Thunder, where he was their all-time leading scorer. Magee also played for the Tampa Bay Mutiny and Chicago Fire in MLS. He retired as a player in 2004 and returned to the Thunder from 2006-08 as the club's Head Coach. In December 2007, he was selected to coach the U.S. Maccabi team in the 2007 Pan American Maccabi Games in Buenos Aires, Argentina, where he helped lead the team to the gold medal.

In 2009, Magee was named Director of Soccer Development for the USL Portland Timbers FC. In 2011, he helped oversee the Timbers' move to MLS as a part of the first team coaching staff and head coach of the reserve team. Magee joined D.C. United in 2014, where he was a first-team assistant coach and coach of the club's U23 side, before joining Minnesota United in 2016.

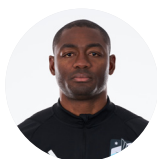


JONATHAN BARBER

Jonathan Barber is entering his third year as the goalkeeper coach for MNUFC2.

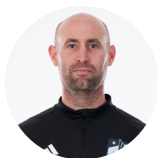

ABOUT JORDAN ADEBAYO-SMITH

Minnesota United signed New England Revolution II forward Jordan Adebayo-Smith to a three-year contract with a club option for 2027 on January 15, 2024. Prior to signing Adebayo-Smith, MNUFC traded \$125,000 in 2024 General Allocation Money (GAM) to the New England Revolution, and in exchange, acquired his Affiliate Priority Player Rights. New England could receive up to \$50,000 in additional GAM if certain performance-based conditions are met.

Adebayo-Smith joins Minnesota United after playing 30 games for New England Revolution II of MLS NEXT Pro during the 2023 campaign, where the 22-year-old forward scored 12 goals and provided six assists in almost 2,400 minutes played for Revs II this past season.

Prior to his time in New England, Adebayo-Smith featured for the Tampa Bay Rowdies of the USL Championship, which had loaned the forward to the New York Red Bulls II in 2022. In New York, he logged over 2,400 minutes and netted seven goals while providing three assists across 33 appearances. Adebayo-Smith scored four goals and recorded one assist with the Rowdies in 2021. Eligible to represent the United States, Nigeria, and England at the international level, the East London native developed at East Soccer Base in South East London before joining Lincoln City Football Club in 2018.

ABOUT KERVIN ARRIAGA

The Honduran international joined Minnesota ahead of the 2022 season from CD Marathón of the Liga Nacional de Fútbol Profesional de Honduras after playing his entire professional career in his homeland. In 2023, Arriaga made 20 appearances and 11 starts, scoring two goals. He scored his first MLS and MNUFC goal against the Chicago Fire on April 23, 2022, and this past season, notched his first goal of the 2023 season against the Fire on April 8, 2023. He has been a consistent piece in the central midfield, especially through the 2023 Leagues Cup tournament, until he suffered a lateral meniscus tear in his right knee after the second match. The Honduran returned to the pitch on September 23, 2023 to finish out the season.

Arriaga has made over 100 domestic appearances between Marathón and Club Atlético Platense, where he made his professional debut. The defensive midfielder scored 19 goals in league play and has five Concacaf League appearances, most recently in the 2021-2022 tournament, where Arriaga played in four games and scored one goal.

He married his now-wife, Daniella, at Allianz Field in April 2023.

INTERNATIONAL: Arriaga is a member of the Honduras National Team with 23 caps, including 12 World Cup Qualifier matches. He has two goals and two assists with the senior team since making his debut in October of 2020.

ABOUT MICHAEL BOXALL

New Zealand international Boxall joined MNUFC on July 12, 2017 after representing his country at the 2017 FIFA Confederations Cup in Russia. As a seven-year veteran, he adds experience and leadership to the backline and has been a key piece of the Minnesota defense since the club's inaugural season.

Boxall has made 201 appearances across all competitions, the most of any Loon since joining MLS, and has scored six MLS goals with MNUFC, his last coming in the final match of the 2023 season on 'Decision Day' against Sporting Kansas City on October 21, 2023. On September 19, 2020, 'Boxy' surpassed Miguel Ibarra on the club's all-time appearance list, finishing the season with 95 career Minnesota appearances. Since joining Minnesota United, Boxall has worked with and volunteered at the local non-profit organization ACES (Athletes Committed to Educating Students), selecting them as his Man of the Match organization for the past seven seasons and being an e-mentor to several students throughout the years. Additionally, Boxall has his own business and is the founder of Mesa, a wellness company that sells high-quality CBD products for overall health and wellness.

INTERNATIONAL: Boxall has made 44 appearances for the New Zealand National Team since making his debut in 2011. He has featured in World Cup Qualifying and the 2017 Confederations Cup. He got his first international assist on October 11, 2016 against the United States, tying the game at 1-1 late in the second half.

ABOUT HASSANI DOTSON

Dotson became the first second-round MLS SuperDraft pick in MNUFC history to sign a professional contract with the Loons after being selected as the 31st pick in the 2019 MLS SuperDraft. The midfielder signed a three-year contract ahead of the 2022 season, looking to solidify his spot as a starting defensive midfielder. Dotson started the first seven games of the 2022 season, scoring one goal and adding two assists before tearing his ACL in April and missing the remainder of the 2022 season. Dotson made his return to the pitch in the 2023 season opener against FC Dallas. He would go on to make his 100th MLS regular-season appearance, reaching 112 appearances by the end of the season. The Washington native played in all 34 regular-season matches (the most of any player in 2023) and scored three goals.

In his five seasons with Minnesota, Dotson has made 128 appearances for MNUFC across all competitions, scoring 12 goals and providing 13 assists. He became a must-have on the gameday roster with his versatility, stepping up all over the field by playing defensive midfielder, wingback, fullback, and winger.

The 26-year-old was a revelation in his rookie season for Minnesota, making 24 appearances in 2019. He contributed to seven clean sheets and scored four goals, including the tally that clinched the Loons' first playoff berth in franchise history. He made five appearances in the club's U.S. Open Cup run and provided two assists. His rookie performance earned recognition from the league, appearing twice on the bench of the MLS Team of the Week and as a finalist for MLS Rookie of the Year.

Dotson played his college soccer at Oregon State, where he was named to the USC Second Team All-Far West Region, the Second Team All-Pac-12 Conference, and was a Pac-12 Conference Academic Honorable Mention in his senior year.

In 2022, Dotson married his longtime girlfriend Petra, and the couple welcomed their first child, a daughter named Gia Valentina. Dotson proposed to Petra on the field after a Minnesota United home game at Allianz Field in 2021.

INTERNATIONAL: Between 2019 and 2021, Dotson was called up several times to the U.S. U23 Men's National Team for international friendlies ahead of Olympic Qualifying. He was named to the US23 Olympic Qualifying team and made his USYNT scoring debut with a pair of goals only five minutes apart in the USYNT 4-0 win over the Dominican Republic in Olympic Qualifying.

ABOUT FRANCO FRAGAPANE

Fragapane joined Minnesota United in May of 2021, following two seasons at Talleres in Argentina. He scored in his MNUFC debut, a 1-1 draw at FC Dallas. He went on to have a four-game goal-contribution streak (two goals, three assists). He finished the 2021 season tied for third in team goals with five and second in team assists with nine, and had five MLS Team of the Week appearances, the second most on the team. 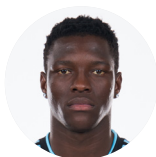
ABOUT CARLOS HARVEY

ABOUT BONGOKUHE HLONGWANE

Hlongwane joined Minnesota United ahead of the 2022 season as a U22 player after spending his professional career in South Africa with Maritzburg United. He put on quite the show during the 2023 season, especially in the 2023 Leagues Cup tournament. Hlongwane was the runner-up to Lionel Messi (Inter Miami CF) for the Golden Boot after notching seven goals. He secured a brace in both matches of the Group Stage against Club Puebla (LIGA MX) and Chicago Fire FC, another against Columbus Crew in the Round of 32, and a single goal against Deportivo Toluca. Coupled with his scoring streak in Leagues Cup, Hlongwane scored eight goals in the regular season, just behind Teemu Pukki, the team's leading scorer. He scored two goals in the 2023 U.S. Open Cup, as well.

In 2022, "Bongi" was a part of the attacking quartet that had the Loons on a 13-game scoring streak from June 19 through August 27. He scored his two goals of the year in that timeframe, knocking his first one in at the Houston Dynamo, earning him an MLS Team of the Week appearance. The 23-year-old scored his second goal the following game, a 4-4 draw at Allianz Field against the Portland Timbers. He finished the season third in assists for the Loons, with four. Hlongwane missed the final games of the regular season due to injury but returned to the Loons starting lineup for the club's 2022 MLS Cup Playoff game at FC Dallas.

He made his professional debut at age 18 and scored eight goals and provided seven assists in four seasons. The attacker scored his first professional goal in June 2019 against Tshakhuma Tsha Madzivhandila. Hlongwane was nominated for the South American Premier Division Player of the Season award for the 2020-21 season.

INTERNATIONAL: The South African international made his national team debut in 2019 and has scored four goals in 15 appearances. He scored his first international goal in 2021 against Uganda and scored the game-winning goal against Ghana in a World Cup Qualifier.

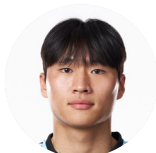

ABOUT CLINT IRWIN

Irwin joined MNUFC after five seasons with the Colorado Rapids. The MLS veteran has over 200 league appearances—including eight playoff appearances and 37 shutouts—in his ten-year career in Major League Soccer. In 2023, he made four appearances in the regular season and started all three of the club's matches in the Open Cup tournament, where he made key saves in the penalty shootout to send Minnesota United into the Round of 16 against the Houston Dynamo.

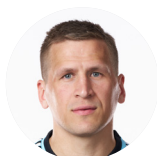

ABOUT SANG BIN JEONG

Jeong signed with the Loons a month into the regular season as a U22 initiative signing and is the only active South Korean national in MLS. Prior to Jeong's arrival, there had been a total of five Korean-born players to compete in MLS. Kim Moon-hwan was the most recent Korean to score in MLS—scoring on June 26, 2022, against Vancouver—until the Minnesota forward scored his first MNUFC/MLS goal against the Whitecaps on May 5, 2023. With the Loons, Jeong made a total of 23 appearances and nine starts, tallying one goal and an assist.

The 21-year-old joined Minnesota after being on loan from the Wolverhampton Wanderers to Grasshoppers Club Zürich in Switzerland, where he scored two goals during the 2022-23 Swiss Super League season. Jeong is a product of the Suwon Samsung Bluewings academy, where he signed his first professional contract in 2020. During the 2021 season, Jeong played in 30 matches and tallied six goals and two assists. He made 33 appearances in two seasons with the Bluewings before being transferred to the Wolverhampton Wanderers of the English Premier League.

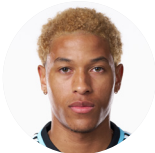
Lod joined the Loons in the middle of the 2019 season. In his five seasons with Minnesota United, he and Emanuel Reynoso are club leaders in MLS regular-season goals scored with 22. Lod sits third behind Darwin Quintero and Emanuel Reynoso (27) and Kevin Molino (26) in goals scored across all competitions with 24. In 2023, Lod made 10 appearances, all starts, and provided two assists in the regular season. His 2023 campaign was cut short after suffering a torn meniscus in his right knee against the Houston Dynamo on May 17, 2023, placing him on the season-ending injury list.

2020 was a breakout season for Lod, starting 18 games and scoring seven goals, second in the team for the season. Lod notched his first brace as a Loon in a 4-0 win over Real Salt Lake on September 6 and recorded a "Gentlemen's Hat Trick" in the regular season final game, providing three assists in a 3-0 win over FC Dallas. The Finnish winger converted to a false-nine in the 2020 MLS Cup Playoffs and scored his first playoff goal in the first round against the Colorado Rapids.

Lod was a mid-season transfer from Sporting de Gijón, where he first played in 2018, making his debut with the Liga 2 side on August 26 and scoring his first goal against Tarragona. During his time with Sporting de Gijón, Lod played 1,212 minutes across 77 games and scored four goals. Lod began his senior club career playing for Klubi-04 before making his league debut for HJK at age 18 in 2011. He helped HJK win the Veikkausliiga during his second season with the club, then proceeded to help the club win three successive Veikkausliiga titles, the Finnish Cup and the Finnish League Cup. Across four seasons with HJK, Lod played in 120 games, scoring 21 goals and contributing 17 assists before earning Player of the Year honors for the 2014 season. Ahead of the 2015-2016 season, Lod joined Panathinaikos of the Greek Superleague, where he played for three years, scoring eight goals and 4,773 minutes across 68 games before signing with Sporting de Gijón in 2018.

Lod and his wife, Janni, spend their offseasons in their home in Finland. The two have a daughter named Louisa, who enjoys scoring goals in front of the Wonderwall at Allianz Field, and recently welcomed their son Leon Lewis to the family in October 2023. Before the start of the 2022 season, Lod completed his military requirements as a Finnish citizen.

INTERNATIONAL: Lod currently represents Finland on the Finland National Team. Lod made his international debut in 2013 at age 20 and has more than 60 caps, six goals, and 10 assists for the national team, including an appearance in the 2018 FIFA World Cup Qualifiers. He helped Finland qualify for the UEFA European Championship for the first time during the 2020 qualifying campaign and played in every UEFA Euro 2020 match for Finland.

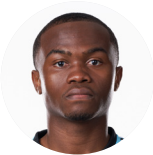

ABOUT TANI OLUWASEYI

Oluwaseyi joined the Loons as the club's 2022 MLS SuperDraft selection. In his first season with Minnesota, the forward saw playing time with MNUFC2 in MLS NEXT Pro action, making 10 game appearances, five starts, and scoring two goals while providing a single assist. He was sidelined for a large portion of the season due to injury. During the 2023 season, Oluwaseyi appeared in two regular-season matches and one Open Cup match before being loaned to San Antonio FC.

With the USL Championship side, the 23-year-old scored 16 goals and provided 7 assists through 25 regular-season matches. On July 30, 2023, Oluwaseyi put away four goals against Hartford Athletic, helping the team to a 5-2 victory. Just one week earlier, he scored a hat-trick against Memphis 901 FC in a 4-0 shutout win. San Antonio qualified for the USLC Playoffs, and the St. John's alum played in two matches, notching one goal.

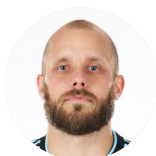

ABOUT DEVIN PADELFORD

ABOUT TEEMU PUKKI

The Finnish forward joined Minnesota United after five seasons with Norwich City. Pukki was a standout goal scorer in the English Premier League and the EFL Championship with Norwich. There, Pukki appeared in 210 matches, scoring 88 goals and recording 29 assists; his 88 goals scored would make him the fourth-all-time leading goal scorer in the club's 120-year history. In his final season with Norwich City, he tallied 10 goals and eight assists through 3,054 minutes played across 43 overall matches. He made his professional debut at 15 years old with FC KTP during the Finnish Cup in June 2005. Pukki also had stints in three top soccer leagues (the German Bundesliga, Scottish Premiership and Danish Superliga) and two Spanish leagues (LaLiga 2 and Segunda Federación).

In his first season with the Loons, Pukki was the leading goal scorer of the 2023 season with 10 goals. Pukki scored his first MLS/MNUFC goal in his first start with Minnesota United against the Houston Dynamo on July 12, 2023. On October 7, 2023, he became the first Minnesota United player to score four goals in a single game since the club joined MLS in 2017. In the Leagues Cup tournament, Pukki played in all five matches and recorded two assists.

Pukki is joined by his wife Kirsikka and two daughters Olivia and Ella, and son, who was born in February 2024.

INTERNATIONAL: Pukki is the all-time leading goal scorer for Finland with 39 goals through 118 appearances since his debut in 2009 and is second in appearances. The 33-year-old has also tallied 16 assists, two of which he tallied during the European Qualifiers in June 2023. He is teammates with midfielder Robin Lod.

ABOUT EMANUEL REYNOSO

Reynoso joined Minnesota United in September 2020 as a Designated Player from legendary club Boca Juniors after spending his entire career playing in Argentina.

Since Reynoso joined the club in 2020, the Loons are 31-6-11 across all competitions in games in which he contributes a goal or an assist. He is the club leader in assists, setting his teammates up 45 times across all competitions.

In 2023, "El Rey" scored six goals and tallied five assists through eighteen matches. The Argentine made history during the summer months of 2023. In a match against the 2022 MLS Cup Champions, LAFC, 'Rey' scored Minnesota's 300th regular-season goal in the 24th minute to earn a 1-1 draw against the Black & Gold. On August 30, 2023, he tied Darwin Quintero for the most goals scored (27) across all competitions since joining the MLS in 2017. His two goals that evening also tied him with Robin Lod for most goals scored in the regular season (22). Lastly, he secured the record for the most multi-goal regular season games in club history with six. On 'Decision Day' against Sporting Kansas City on October 21, 2023, he made his 100th MNUFC appearance across all competitions.

In 2022, Reynoso led the team in goals scored with 10 this season. During the summer stretch when the Loons went on a 13-game scoring streak from June 19 through August 27, going 8-3-2, the No. 10 tallied eight goals and provided six assists. In Week 21, Reynoso was named Player of the Week for the first time after his performance against D.C. United on July 16, where he scored his second brace of the season.

Having only played 13 regular-season games in 2020, Reynoso provided seven assists and one goal while only playing in one loss. The Argentine made MLS history in the 2020 MLS Cup Playoffs, providing three assists in back-to-back playoff games for the first time in MLS Cup history. Reynoso played a role in all eight goals the Loons scored in the postseason, assisting in seven and scoring one off a free kick against Seattle in the Western Conference Final. Reynoso continued his success from his debut season in 2021, finishing the season leading the team in assists with ten and scoring five goals.

The 27-year-old began his professional career with his hometown team, Club Atlético Talleres, in Cordoba, where he made 52 appearances from 2014-2017. He joined Boca ahead of the 2017-18 season, where he contributed seven goals and 12 assists across all competitions, including three goals in the Libertadores and two with eight assists in Superliga play. Across his career, Reynoso has made key appearances in major competitions such as the Copa Libertadores, Copa Argentina, and the Copa Superliga.

Rosales initially joined Minnesota United in August 2021 on loan from CA Independiente of the Liga Panameña de Fútbol. He earned a permanent transfer to MNUFC following the conclusion of the 2022 season.

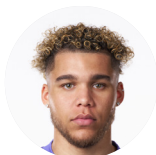
The 24-year-old scored his first MLS/MNUFC goals last season; Rosales bagged his first MNUFC goal against the Philadelphia Union in the U.S. Open Cup on May 9, 2023, followed by his first MLS goal against Austin FC on May 31, 2023. He put away another during the Leagues Cup tournament to open the scoring against Deportivo Toluca in the Round of 16. Rosales showed his versatility within the roster during the 2023 season, playing in three different positions throughout 25 appearances in all competitions: winger, central midfielder, and fullback.

In 2022, Rosales provided depth in the central midfield position, making 24 game appearances throughout the season. He made his first MNUFC start on April 10 at Austin FC and went on to start eight MLS matches and two of the club's three U.S. Open Cup matches in 2022. Rosales also made one game appearance with MNUFC2 in 2022. During his initial 18-month loan with Minnesota, Rosales made 34 game appearances with ten starts.

Prior to 2021, Rosales spent three seasons with CA Independiente, where he made 37 game appearances, notching two goals, including five appearances in the Concacaf Champions League.

During the 2023 season, Rosales married his partner, Yensy, on June 2, 2023.

INTERNATIONAL: Rosales currently plays for the Honduras Men's National Team. He was called up for the senior team during the March international window and made his senior team debut in the World Cup Qualifying match against Jamaica. He made four appearances with the national team in 2022. Prior to his senior debut, Rosales played with the U23 Men's National Team and was a part of the squad that played against Hassani Dotson and the U.S. U23 team in the 2020 Olympic Qualifying Tournament, and qualified for the 2020 Tokyo Olympics. Honduras won one game in Group B, a 3-2 victory over New Zealand.

ABOUT DAYNE ST. CLAIR

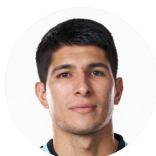
St. Clair joined the Loons as the selection from the first round of the 2019 MLS SuperDraft from the University of Maryland. After five seasons with MNUFC, St. Clair is the club leader in wins with 32 across all competitions and has recorded the most shutouts (22). St. Clair surpassed two of Bobby Shuttleworth's records in the 2023 season: most regular-season saves (259) and most saves across all competitions (296). He notably provided his second-ever assist, passing into the feet of Franco Fragapane to find the equalizing goal against the New England Revolution in the 93rd minute. He appeared in 30 matches, all starts, and started all five matches in the Leagues Cup tournament. The 26-year-old came up with major saves in the tournament during matches against Columbus Crew and Deportivo Toluca in penalty shootouts.

The Canadian international secured the starting goalkeeper position in the club's third game of the 2022 season after a standout performance at the New York Red Bulls earned him MLS Player of the Week in Week 3. St. Clair was selected for the 2022 MLS All-Star Team and was named the 2022 MLS All-Star MVP in front of his home fans at Allianz Field.

In 2020, St. Clair began the season on loan to San Antonio FC and was recalled that September to provide depth to a goalkeeper crew struggling through injuries. St. Clair made his MLS debut and earned his first win and shutout in a 4-0 win over Real Salt Lake. A revelation, he maintained the starting goalkeeper role through the remainder of the season, earning six wins, six shutouts, and 12 goals allowed. St. Clair started all three 2020 MLS Cup Playoff games for the Loons, maintaining back-to-back clean sheets against the Colorado Rapids and Sporting Kansas City.

In 2019, St. Clair was a part of the Minnesota United draftee class that included midfielder Hassani Dotson and former Loon Chase Gasper. During his rookie season, St. Clair featured in three international friendlies during 2019, playing against Hertha Berlin, Aston Villa, and CF Pachuca. He went on loan to Minnesota's USL affiliate, Forward Madison, where he made five appearances.

INTERNATIONAL: St. Clair accepted an invite for the Canadian senior national team camp in January 2021, and he made his senior national team debut in the World Cup Qualifiers with a 7-0 shutout win over Aruba. St. Clair was named the backup goalkeeper for the Canada Men's National Team for the 2022 FIFA World Cup. He appeared once again for the national team during the 2023 Gold Cup Group Stage against Cuba and in the Quarterfinals against the United States.

ABOUT MIGUEL TAPIAS

The Mexican center-back joined Minnesota United after four years at CF Pachuca. In his four seasons at Pachuca, Tapias made over 70 game appearances, scoring two goals, in both the Copa MX and Copa MX Apertura contests. Tapias was on the roster for the international friendly between Pachuca and Minnesota United in September of 2019.

ABOUT DJ TAYLOR

Taylor joined the Loons in 2021 after four seasons with former USL Championship side North Carolina FC. He continued to succeed in his fullback role throughout the 2023 season, providing an explosive and dynamic option down the touchline and helping to permeate the opposition's final third through overlapping runs. He appeared in 30 matches and made 29 starts, providing defensive consistency for the Loons.

After spending his first season with Minnesota as a depth piece, Taylor shined in 2022, making 26 appearances, starting 23 games, and providing three assists down the right flank. Taylor started the 2022 season playing with MNUFC2, making two game appearances before earning his starting position with the first team for the majority of the season. Taylor made his MLS debut on July 3, 2021, against the San Jose Earthquakes, and his first start the following weekend at the Colorado Rapids on July 7. He scored his first MLS goal in a 2-1 win at FC Dallas.

The North Carolina native is a product of the North Carolina FC youth academy. He began his professional career in 2015 with CF Torre Levante of the Spanish Tercera División but returned to North Carolina during the 2017 season. Taylor established himself as the starting right back for North Carolina FC in 2018 and was named Defensive Player of the Year in 2019. Internationally, Taylor represented the U.S. U18 National Team in 2015, appearing in two matches and scoring a goal at the Copa Chivas Tournament.

Taylor married his longtime girlfriend Mercedes during the offseason ahead of the 2023 season. Additionally, Taylor is the founder of his own clothing line, Venci, a luxury fashion line inspired by urban youth in America.

ABOUT WIL TRAPP

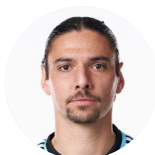
Minnesota United signed midfielder Wil Trapp as a free agent in January 2021, following a single season with Inter Miami CF in their expansion season. The deep-lying midfielder has provided leadership for the Loons since joining the club, co-captaining the club for the last two seasons.

The Ohio native has 98 game appearances with MNUFC across all competitions, with one goal and four assists. Trapp continued in his role as a mainstay in the midfield, playing in 30 regular-season matches in 2023.

In total, Trapp made 204 appearances for the team, registering two goals and 13 assists. In his seven seasons with Columbus, he helped guide the team to the playoffs four times.

Trapp, his wife Beth, and their two sons, Theo and Charlie, split their offseason between Minnesota and their home in Columbus. Both Trapp boys enjoy taking the field post-game at Allianz Field alongside fellow Loons children.

INTERNATIONAL: Trapp has made 18 appearances for the United States Men's National Team since January 2018, appearing in the 2019 Concacaf Gold Cup and international friendlies. He originally made his debut for the senior team in 2015, appearing in a friendly against Chile. His second international appearance came a year later, in an international friendly against Canada. At the youth level, Trapp represented the U.S. U18, U20, and U23 teams. Notably, he appeared in both the 2013 Concacaf U-20 Championship and the 2013 U-20 FIFA World Cup. The team finished as runners-up in the 2013 Concacaf U20 Championship, as Trapp played all 120 minutes of the final.

ABOUT ZAREK VALENTIN

Valentin joined MNUFC after three seasons with the Houston Dynamo, where he started 50 matches and provided four assists. The fullback spent the majority of his career with the Portland Timbers, starting more than 80 MLS games and tallying four assists across four seasons. Valentin was a regular starter on the squad that went to the 2018 MLS Cup Final against Atlanta United.

With the Loons, Valentin played in 20 regular-season matches, made 15 starts, and assisted two goals. He was a proven leader, as seen in his composure and decision-making on the pitch.

INTERNATIONAL: Valentin is a member of the Puerto Rico National Team. Despite playing for the U.S. at a variety of youth levels, Valentin chose to represent Puerto Rico in October 2020 ahead of the 2022 FIFA World Cup Qualifying Tournament. He scored his first international goal in a Concacaf Nations League match against the Cayman Islands and, to date, has four caps for Puerto Rico.

MINNESOTA'S SOCCER HISTORY

AN ERA BEGINS

In 1976, professional soccer came to the North Star State with the arrival of the Minnesota Kicks. The club played in the North American Soccer League (NASL). They shared the Metropolitan Stadium in Bloomington with the Minnesota Twins and Vikings and started hot, winning the Western Division title, placing second in the Soccer Bowl, and posting an average attendance of 23,121 in its first season.

For the next four years, the Kicks were dominant, winning their division each year and peaking with an average attendance of 32,775 in 1977. The team's standout star was Alan Willey, an incisive English striker known as "The Artful Dodger," who finished his career as the NASL's third-leading scorer. But just five years after their first season, the Kicks were forced to fold due to financial difficulties.

In 1984, soccer returned to Minnesota when the NASL's Fort Lauderdale Strikers were relocated and rebranded the Minnesota Strikers. The next year, the NASL folded and the Strikers joined the Major Indoor Soccer League. They played at the Metrodome until 1988, at which time the team returned to Fort Lauderdale.

THE THUNDER ROLLS

In 1990, Minnesota once again became home to professional soccer when the Minnesota Thunder joined the United States Interregional Soccer League after competing for four years as an amateur team. Playing their matches at the National Sports Center in Blaine and run by Buzz Lagos, the team won its division and reached the finals in each of its first two seasons.

Over the next decade and a half, the team hit many highs, including their first victory over an MLS side when they defeated the LA Galaxy in the fourth round of the U.S. Open Cup in 2004. Following the 2009 season, the Thunder left the USL to become a part of the reinstated NASL, but were forced to fold before the next season could begin.

THE STARS SHINE

Following the dissolution of the Thunder, the National Sports Center decided to start its own second-division team. The team was christened the NSC Minnesota Stars, and their first match as members of the provisional USSF D2 came against the Vancouver Whitecaps on April 11, 2010. In 2011, the team was purchased by the NASL and joined that league, eventually knocking off the Tampa Bay Rowdies and the Carolina RailHawks on the way to winning the NASL Soccer Bowl with the smallest payroll in the league. The team that nobody wanted had just won the cup.



They ended their next season unsure of their future, but impressed by the passion of the fans and the atmosphere at NSC, Dr. Bill McGuire purchased the club in late 2012. The team would be reborn as Minnesota United FC in March of 2013.

THE LOONS BEGIN THEIR JOURNEY

More than just a new name, Minnesota United carried with it a clear mission: to pull together all the legacies of professional soccer in the state and become a rallying point for the sport to the diverse communities of Minnesota.

The new badge incorporated elements integral to the identity of the state: the North Star, the blue stripe of the Mississippi, the grey of the Iron Range and, of course, the loon.

In 2014, MNUFC captured the Spring Season Championship and finished with the best overall record in the NASL. The club notched victories over Mexico's U21 national team and Swansea City of the English Premier League in international friendlies played in front of record crowds at NSC. Then, on March 25, 2015, Minnesota United announced it would become the 23rd team in MLS. The Loons would play their first MLS match on March 3, 2017 against the Portland Timbers.

THE JOURNEY CONTINUES IN MLS

A major component of Minnesota United's move to MLS was the promise of a soccer-specific stadium, and in late June 2017, initial work began at the site of what would become the new permanent home for MNUFC in 2019 — Allianz Field in the Midway neighborhood of Saint Paul. With an initial capacity of 19,400 — a number already exceeded by the team's average attendance at TCF Bank Stadium in its first two years in MLS — Allianz Field has become a beacon for soccer throughout the region and was the first stadium in Minnesota built without a direct public subsidy.

If the last four decades of soccer in Minnesota have shown anything, it's that long journeys don't have just one starting point — they begin again and again. Yet through all the twists and turns, a foundation was laid. MNUFC is building on that foundation and elevating the sport and its culture not only on the pitch, but within the community.

MLS NEXT PRO



Established in 2021, MLS NEXT Pro began competition in its inaugural season beginning in March 2022. MLS NEXT Pro aims to complete an integrated player pathway from MLS NEXT through to MLS first teams. The league offers young players and experienced professionals the opportunity to develop and showcase their talents while competing for an MLS NEXT Pro championship. Clubs are separated into two conferences – the Western Conference and the Eastern Conference. Within the conferences, teams are placed into smaller divisions – Northeast, Central, Frontier and Pacific. Eight teams, the top-four from each conference, qualified for the playoffs in the inaugural season.

During its first season, the league brought unique differences to the sport, most notably the shootout following a draw. The team that won the shootout took an extra point. Columbus Crew 2 earned the most points in regular-season action with 55 and eventually defeated St. Louis CITY2 by a score of 4-1 in the first-ever MLS NEXT Pro Cup, becoming the first team to claim the title in the new league. Among regular-season awards and honors, MLS NEXT Pro selected its Best XI lineup, where former MNUFC2 midfielder Aziel Jackson was among the 10 other players chosen and was the Loons' lone representative in the regular-season honor.

In 2023, MLS NEXT Pro featured seven new teams, increasing the total teams participating in the league to 27. MLS NEXT Pro also introduced the "pick-your-opponent" playoff format in the first two rounds. The two No. 1 seeds from each Conference would earn a first-round bye, automatically advancing to the Conference Semifinals. The next two teams from next Conference (No. 2 and No. 3 seeds) would choose their opponents and host the match. The remaining teams not selected would play each other, with the higher team hosting. In the Conference Semifinals, The No. 1 seeds would choose their opponents from the remaining two lowest-seeded teams and host the match. Other rules introduced in 2023 included the Off-field Treatment Rule, Red Card Suspension Rule and the TImed Substitution Rule. Expansion side Austin FC II was crowned the 2023 MLS NEXT Pro Cup champions after defeating the defending Cup Champion Columbus Crew 2.

The 2024 MLS NEXT Pro Season kicks off on March 15 and will feature two new independent teams: Carolina Core FC and Chattanooga FC. The Western Conference will have 14 teams split between the Pacific and Frontier Division, while the Eastern Conference will have 15 teams divided between the Northeast and newly reconfigured Southeast Division. The MLS NEXT Pro Cup Playoffs are also enhanced with a total of 16 teams (eight from each conference) will qualifying for the postseason.

ABOUT FRED EMMINGS

A product of the MNUFC Academy, Fred Emmings signed as Minnesota United's first Homegrown Player in club history ahead of the 2020 season. While with MNUFC's first team, Emmings saw the majority of his playing time with MNUFC2 during both the 2022 and 2023 campaigns. In January 2024, he signed a one-year MLS NEXT Pro contract, that includes a club option, with MNUFC2.

To-date, the Saint Paul native has made 37 game appearances (all starts) for MNUFC2, playing over 3,300 minutes in the net while making 132 total saves in MLS NEXT Pro regular-season action. Notably during the 2023 game at home against Austin FC II, Emmings recorded four (4) shootout saves, setting the league record for most shootout saves in a single game, both regular season and playoffs. For Minnesota United's first team, Emmings has appeared in two international friendlies – first as a substitute against SC Paderborn 07 in 2022, then against FC Kaiserslautern in 2023.

INTERNATIONAL: Emmings has been invited to train with two youth national teams. He was first invited by the U.S. U15 national team to training camp in January of 2018. In 2019, Emmings spent two weeks with the U16 Luxembourg national team. With dual Luxembourg/United States citizenship, the opportunity to play both European and American soccer places him in a unique pool of players who are called up for international duty by their home countries throughout the season.

ABOUT MOLIK JESSE KHAN

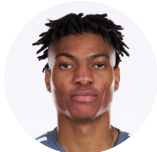

In the inaugural season in 2022, the midfielder made five appearances (two starts). Due to international duty and a season-ending hip injury, his minutes on the pitch in 2022 were limited. Khan signed a new, one-year MLS NEXT Pro contract in January of 2024 that also includes a club option for 2025.

INTERNATIONAL: Khan has been called up to play for the Trinidad and Tobago senior and youth national squads. Most recently, the attacking midfielder was called up twice in 2023, including during the 2023 Gold Cup, in which he made a senior-team appearance as a substitute against Jamaica on June 29, 2023. In 2022, he received a call up with both the senior and U-20 national teams during the June international window. With the senior team, Khan made four substitute appearances in Concacaf Nations League B, Group C matches against the Bahamas, Nicaragua and St. Vincent and the Grenadines. MNUFC ACADEMY



Minnesota United has reimagined its role in youth soccer in the state and the region with the MNUFC Youth Development Program, presented by Allina Health, which launched in 2020. The program is designed to be collaborative with local youth clubs and function within the region's unique soccer culture to develop professional-level soccer players with the goal of playing for Minnesota United's first team. The MNUFC Youth Development Program will raise the level of the game across the state and region by bringing the highest level of youth soccer competition to the area and making it accessible to players regardless of social or economic situation.

Players in the MNUFC Academy will compete in MLS NEXT, the MLS developmental league, at the U15, U17 and U19 levels. They will additionally have potential opportunities to train and play with the club's second team, MNUFC2, in MLS NEXT Pro, providing an integrated pathway to the first team. Minnesota United will also be actively engaged in youth development from U8 to U14 providing training access, coaching resources and competitive opportunities.

The MNUFC Youth Development Program will be overseen by Vice President of Youth Development Amos Magee, formerly the club's Director of Player Personnel. The Saint Paul native has been with Minnesota United since 2016 and has over 30 years of professional soccer playing, managing and sporting staff experience.

The MNUFC YDP is designed to develop the most talented and committed players regardless of social or economic situation into first team players for Minnesota United through the MLS NEXT system of player development. Through the creation of a Pro Player Pathway, this program aims to raise the level of soccer in Minnesota. While setting players up for success on the Pro Player Pathway is the goal of our academy, our staff also works to find the best soccer solution for each individual player once they leave our academy.

Producing first team players from Minnesota for MNUFC means creating a program that serves the needs of Minnesota players. Minnesota is unique in soccer and our programming responds to our state's diversity, climate, soccer calendar, current systems for development and our geographical isolation. We're building a system that is right for Minnesota.



PRO PLAYER PATHWAY

Prior to entering the MNUFC Academy as a full-time player, MNUFC will create pools of the best players to promote competition. Players will be encouraged to play with their local clubs as well, promoting leadership and further development.

U8 to U14

MNUFC will foster development in these age groups with seasonal training pools for the best, most committed players. These programs are designed to work in conjunction with local clubs NOT to replace Minnesota youth club programming.

Part-time players will also be added to the U15, U17 and U19 rosters, training with Academy teams while playing club and high school soccer at appropriate intervals.

Working with Clubs

Collaboration is an essential element of success in this model. MNUFC will work with local clubs to improve the soccer experience for everyone through shared resources, ideas and competition.

ABOUT MLS NEXT

MLS NEXT features 677 teams competing in nearly 11,000 matches over a ten-month calendar. Top players from the country's leading 143 clubs, including all 29 MLS Academies, will field teams in up to six age groups: U13, U14, U15, U16, U17, and U19.

MLS NEXT's fourth season as a program will allow the top prospects in the U.S. and Canada to compete in a ten-month regular season and a chance to become MLS NEXT Champions by winning the MLS NEXT Cup Playoffs in June 2024.

Additionally, the 2023-24 MLS NEXT calendar will feature five premier events: MLS NEXT Fest (December 2023), Generation adidas Cup (March and April 2024), MLS NEXT Flex (May 2024), MLS NEXT Cup Playoffs and the MLS NEXT All-Star Game (July 2024).

A NEW HOME FOR SOCCER IN MINNESOTA

Inspired by the rippling waters of the land of 10,000 lakes, Allianz Field, the home of Minnesota United FC, is a dynamic icon for the City of Saint Paul and the state as a whole. Drawing from international stadium design, the venue's 360-degree canopy and 2,920-seat, pyramid-shaped supporters' section makes for one of the most intimidating atmospheres in Major League Soccer.

The club unveiled stadium renderings for the new stadium in February 2016, and broke ground on December 12, 2016. Construction was completed in February of 2019.

On July 25, 2017, Minnesota United and Allianz Life Insurance Company of North America (Allianz), a leading provider of retirement and protection solutions, announced a multi-year naming rights sponsorship agreement for the team's new soccer stadium in Saint Paul, Minnesota.

Allianz Field joins seven other Allianz-sponsored stadiums located in some of the most dynamic cities around the world. As the newest landmark in the greater Minneapolis/Saint Paul area, Allianz Field is among the most state-of-the-art soccer stadiums in North America and a place where members of the Twin Cities community can gather for a variety of events, ranging from MLS and global exhibition matches to youth soccer and community celebrations.

CAPACITY

Allianz Field holds approximately 19,600 fans with avenues for expansion in the future. Included in the seating plan is safe standing space in a dedicated Supporters Section along with a variety of suites, club seats, loge boxes and general seating.

360-DEGREE CANOPY

Fan sections are covered by a 360-degree canopy that serves two purposes: to keep the noise of the crowd contained within Allianz Field and to protect fans from the elements throughout a match. Approximately 85% of the crowd is protected from inclement weather by a translucent polymer mesh rainscreen.

INTIMATE SEATING

Allianz Field was built with fans as the top priority. As such, every seat in the stadium provides fantastic sight lines to all the action on the pitch. The closest seat is 17 feet away from the pitch, while the farthest seat from the sideline is just 125 feet away — providing one of the most intimate settings in all of professional sports. The steep rake (33.4 degrees in the upper bowl and 34.75 degrees in the Supporters Section) puts fans right on top of the action.

FIELD HEATING SYSTEM

Like Target Field, Allianz Field will use a hydronic field heating system to keep the grass in optimal shape even during early spring and late fall games. The comprehensive climate control system for the grass includes an advanced drainage system that will harness and re-use stormwater, minimizing discharge.

LED LIGHTING

LED lighting outside Allianz Field allows it to change colors, light intensity and patterning to reflect the festivities inside as well as shift to represent initiatives and ideas of the club. The elegant “flow” design concept will dazzle soccer fans and Minnesotans alike as it simultaneously blends in and stands out in a reinvigorated Midway neighborhood.

DISTRIBUTED ANTENNA SYSTEM

Never miss a call, never miss a moment — Allianz Field allows fans to follow along online and post their favorite moments of the game flawlessly on social media platforms.

LOCATION

Whether walking, driving, biking or taking public transportation, getting to Allianz Field is easy and convenient. Centrally located on a major light rail and bus rapid transit lines as well as highway access, you can arrive from anywhere with ease.

GREEN SPACE

For celebrations pregame, postgame and throughout the week, Allianz Field lends itself to soccer fans and all Minnesotans. The stadium is designed to revitalize a 34-acre site, including a 1.5-acre green space surrounding the stadium to bring a touch of nature to Midway. Allianz Field is designed to be bird-safe, with energy efficient and sustainable features.

COMMUNITY

Allianz Field is helping to revitalize a historic Saint Paul neighborhood. The stadium is built on the former location of Metro Transit’s bus barn — a long vacant area. A plan to restore the neighborhood around the stadium will bring new jobs and more visitors to the region while providing easy access to fans of the diverse soccer culture of Minnesota.

Allianz Field plays host to all Minnesota United home games, and has the ability to be used for concerts, youth soccer games and other sporting events.



FUNDING

Allianz Field is privately funded by the Minnesota United ownership group without any taxpayer-supported subsidies. Minnesota United is the first professional team in Minnesota to construct a stadium without a direct public subsidy and is dedicated to providing fans with a dynamic gameday facility with natural grass that is accessible to all people and communities. To support the site, the city of Saint Paul provided \$18 million in infrastructure improvements surrounding the stadium.

Private Commitments to the Community:

- Purchase the MLS expansion franchise (at a cost of \$100 million dollars)
- Make annual rent payments to the Met Council worth a total of \$29 million over the course of 50+ years
- Build a first-class MLS soccer facility through private funding (estimated at \$250 million)
- Coordinate development opportunities around the stadium

TRANSPORTATION

Allianz Field in the Midway neighborhood of Saint Paul offers unique opportunities for fans to ride or walk to games. Located just 7.5 miles from downtown Minneapolis and 5 miles from downtown Saint Paul, Allianz Field is centrally located to reach fans throughout the Twin Cities area.

- Car – The stadium is located along I-94, which cuts through Minneapolis and Saint Paul. Fans from across the state can hop on the highway and drive directly to Allianz Field.
- Bus – Metro Transit A Line service and local bus Route 16 allow transportation options most of the day for commuters along the University and Snelling routes.
- Light Rail – The Green Line light rail transit line has a stop at the stadium site.
- Bike – Live within biking range of the proposed site? Perfect! Allianz Field is designed to store bikes safely and encourage green travel to and from the facility.
- Park-and-Ride – Minnesota United is committed to making access to the stadium as easy as possible. On Minnesota United game days, fans can access a shuttle between the State Fair parking lots and the Allianz Field before and after games.

ABOUT MLS

MAJOR LEAGUE SOCCER

Minnesota United FC plays in North America's top professional soccer league, Major League Soccer (MLS). The league features 29 teams from across the United States and Canada.

After a successful bid to host the World Cup in 1994, the United States Soccer Federation (USSF) founded MLS to bring a top-level soccer league back to the country for the first time since 1984, when the original NASL folded. The league was set to begin play in 1996 with 10 teams: Colorado Rapids, Columbus Crew, D.C. United, Dallas Burn (FC Dallas), Kansas City Wiz (Sporting Kansas City), Los Angeles Galaxy, New England Revolution, NY/NJ MetroStars (New York Red Bulls), San Jose Clash (Earthquakes) and Tampa Bay Mutiny. The league's first match was played on April 6, 1996 as the San Jose Clash played D.C. United in front of 31,000 fans at Spartan Stadium. The league drew large crowds in its opening season, in part because of attracting several star players from the 1994 World Cup.

Today, the league has expanded to 30 teams, with San Diego FC entering the league in 2025.

As MLS has grown, more clubs have moved from playing in shared American football venues into soccer-specific stadiums. Columbus Crew SC was the first team to move into a soccer-specific stadium by opening MAPFRE Stadium in 1999. There are currently 22 soccer-specific stadiums in MLS, with the most recent debut being CITYPARK in St. Louis.

LEAGUE FORMAT

The league is split into two conferences: East and West. Each team plays 34 games during the season, 17 at home and 17 on the road. With the addition of St. Louis CITY SC to the Western Conference in 2023, there are 15 teams in the Eastern Conference and 14 teams in the Western Conference.

MLS Schedule Construction

The 15 Eastern Conference teams will play:

- Two games vs. each intra-conference opponent (28 games)
- One game vs. six different cross-conference opponents (6 games)

The 14 Western Conference teams will play:

- Two games vs. each intra-conference opponent (26 games)
- One game vs. 1 or 2 additional intra-conference opponents (1-2 games)
- One game vs. 6 or 7 different cross-conference opponents (6-7 games)

LAMAR HUNT U.S. OPEN CUP

HISTORY AND FORMAT

Founded in 1914, the Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup is the oldest soccer tournament in America and the third-longest-running open soccer tournament in the world. The tournament follows a single elimination knockout format and consists of clubs from MLS, USL, and many amateur teams from across the country. The tournament lasts nine rounds, running from March to September.

The 2024 iteration of the tournament will be the 109th edition of the Cup and will have over 100 teams participating from all levels of American soccer. Houston Dynamo FC was crowned the 2023 Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Champion, defeating Inter Miami CF 2-1 at DRV PNK Stadium.

More teams are added from higher up the soccer pyramid as the tournament progresses, starting with adult club teams in the preliminary rounds. Teams qualifying from national amateur leagues, like the National Premier Soccer League (NPSL) and USL League 2, will join the qualifying teams from the preliminary rounds in the First Round. Teams from USL Championship, USL League One and the National Independent Soccer Association (NISA) will join in the Second Round, followed by the 29 U.S.-based MLS teams in the Third Round and Round of 32.

Twelve MLS teams, Concacaf Champions Cup qualifiers and the top four non-qualifiers in each conference, receive a bye to the Round of 32. The remaining 11 teams will join in the Third Round.

The champion receives a \$300,000 prize and a berth in the Concacaf Champions Cup. The runner-up is awarded \$100,000 and the team that advances the furthest from each division, besides MLS, will receive \$25,000.

The 2019 Open Cup featured 84 teams from across the U.S. Soccer ranks, from amateur teams up to MLS. MNUFC made a historic run in the tournament, becoming the first Minnesota-based team to reach the final, besting three MLS teams and one USL Championship team on the way. Minnesota's Darwin Quintero went on to lead the competition with six goals, followed closely by Angelo Rodriguez's four that tied him for second. Rodriguez scored the club's first-ever U.S. Open Cup hat-trick in a 6-1 quarterfinal win over New Mexico United. The Loons fell 1-2 in the final game to Atlanta United.

In 2023, MNUFC defeated Detroit City FC from the USL Championship division in the Third Round. They then beat the Philadelphia Union 7-6 in penalties in the Round of 32 following a 3-3 draw before falling to Houston Dynamo FC 0-4 in the Round of 16.

Chicago Fire FC, Seattle Sounders FC and Sporting Kansas City have the most titles of teams currently in operation, with four each. The all-time record belongs to Bethlehem Steel and Maccabee Los Angeles, who won five cups each while they were active.

LEAGUES CUP

HISTORY AND FORMAT

First played in 2019, Leagues Cup is a single-elimination knockout tournament featuring teams from MLS and Mexico's Liga MX. The competition featured the top four teams from each league based on their previous season who did not qualify for the Concacaf Champions League. Cruz Azul won the first title, besting Tigres UANL 2-1 in the Final in Las Vegas, Nevada.

In 2023, Leagues Cup expanded to include all MLS and Liga MX clubs. The new format included all 47 first division teams from Canada, Mexico and the United States competing in a World Cup-style tournament. The 2023 edition saw Inter Miami CF win its first title in club history.

Leagues Cup 2024 will begin on Friday, July 26, with the final taking place on Sunday, August 25.

Leagues Cup Format: In 2024, the tournament introduced a tiered Leagues Cup Ranking system, as well as hubs for the highest-ranked LIGA MX clubs. The Leagues Cup ranking will be strictly based on combined MLS and LIGA MX club performance based on points in the last 34 regular season matches. MLS teams will be ranked based on the 2023 MLS Supporters' Shield standings, while LIGA MX clubs will be ranked based on the cumulative 34 matches in the 2023 Clausura and Apertura tournaments.

All participating clubs - except the two Leagues' champions - are divided into three tiers based on the Leagues Cup Ranking (1-15, 16-30, 31-45), forming 15 groups of three clubs each, one club from each tier, prioritizing geographical and competitive balance among the 45 clubs. For 2024, Leagues Cup will be played in two regions, East and West, with seven groups in the East and eight groups in the West, regionalizing travel for all participating clubs. Like the 2023 format, both LIGA MX and MLS Cup champions, Club America and Columbus Crew respectively, receive an automatic bye to the Round of 32. The two champions are not included in the Leagues Cup Ranking.

The LIGA MX Champion and the three top-ranked LIGA MX clubs will be granted hub privileges. The hub privileges, which will minimize LIGA MX club travel and reward them by playing in pre-determined venues as the home team, are based on the Leagues Cup Ranking. Club America (League champion with a bye) will have hosting privileges through the semifinals, C.F. Monterrey (No. 1 rank) through Round of 16, Chivas Guadalajara (No. 4 rank) through Round of 32, and Tigres (No. 6 rank) throughout the Group Stage, rewarding the clubs according to their 2023 Apertura and Clausura performances.

This new format, based on the Leagues Cup Ranking, was a joint collaborative effort of the Leagues Cup Organizing Committee, comprising representatives from Leagues Cup, and both MLS and LIGA MX leadership. Considerations included rewarding regular season results and geographical regions while



addressing learnings from 2023.

Group Stage: Every team will play two matches in the Group Stage, with the top two teams from each group, as determined by points, advancing to the Knockout Stage Round of 32.

No matches in the Leagues Cup Group Stage will end in a tie. Each team receives one point if the game is tied after 90 minutes. The winner of the subsequent penalty kicks will earn an additional point. Regulation wins count as three points.

Knockout Rounds: Following the Group Stage, the advancing 30 teams will be joined by LIGA MX and MLS cup champions (Columbus Crew and Club America, respectively) and will be placed in a fixed bracket to compete in the single-game elimination Knockout Rounds beginning with the Round of 32 (16 matches), followed by Round of 16 (eight matches). The eight advancing teams will compete in the Quarterfinals (four matches) before the two Semifinal matches.

Leagues Cup Final and Third-Place Game: Leagues Cup 2024 Third Place and Final will determine the three 2025 Concacaf Champions Cup qualified clubs.

Global Distribution

Fans in over 100 countries and regions will be able to watch all 77 Leagues Cup matches on MLS Season Pass on the Apple TV app, the subscription service from Apple and Major League Soccer that is available on smart TVs, streaming devices, Apple devices, set-top boxes, game consoles, and the web at tv.apple.com. In addition, TelevisaUnivision, TV Azteca, FOX Sports (FS1), TSN and RDS will be the linear broadcast home for selected group stage matches in Mexico, United States and Canada.
