## **MASTROENI SEEKING CENTURY MARK WIN ::**

RSL boss **Pablo Mastroeni** arrives in Nashville seeking his 100<sup>th</sup> career coaching win, including the 2014-17 years with Rocky Mountain Cup rival Colorado Rapids ...

The former U.S. World Cup stalwart has now amassed 99 wins, 108 losses and 74 draws across all competitions for the Utah/Denver-based sides ... Last June in Kansas City, Mastroeni earned his 50<sup>th</sup> win across all competitions with RSL in a wild 4-3 road decision, with last week's 2-0 reg. season win over LA Galaxy marking his 50<sup>th</sup> MLS victory with RSL ...

## **BOUNCING BACK YET AGAIN ::**

For the third time in five opportunities across the first nine games across all competitions in 2025, RSL embodied one of the hallmarks of the Mastroeni era, displaying its ability to rebound from a loss, RSL dropping just 12 back-to-back scenarios across all competitions in Pablo's 148 overall games managed since August, 2021 ...

## **HOME DOMINANCE v GALAXY ::**

Last week at home against LA Galaxy, RSL improved to 37W-6L-12T when scoring first during the Mastroeni era, despite falling already this year against both Herediano and San Diego with early first-half scores ...

Last week, RSL snapped its two-game slide with an elite performance led by RSL playmaker and emerging U.S. Men's National Team starlet **Diego Luna**, who scored a pair of goals just five minutes apart midway through the first half to lead RSL to a comfortable 2-0 home win over the LA Galaxy ...

Luna's brace – just his second in MLS and his first since mid-July, 2023 – gives him three goals and an assist in his last three RSL matches, snapping a five-half scoreless run for the Claret-and-Cobalt ...

RSL earned its second clean sheet of the season in Saturday's 2-0 win, an identical scoreline to its home victory over Seattle back on March 1 ...

## **RSL IRON MEN, CABRAL & GLAD::**

Newcomer GK **Rafael Cabral** and Homegrown DF **Justen Glad** remain the lone two RSL players to have appeared in every minute of the Club's seven 2025 MLS contests, while Cabral also played all 180 minutes of RSL's Concacaf Champions Cup action to kick off the season ...

Saturday, Australian striker **Ari Piol** – controversially ejected in the 23<sup>rd</sup> minute of the Dallas loss on March 22 – returned to action, starting and playing 78 minutes after missing the 0-2 loss at Minnesota, while Spanish rookie **Jesus Barea** made his home MLS debut last weekend for the final 21 minutes after appearing in the final 45 minutes during the icy monsoon in St. Paul on March 29 ...

## **LUNA SHINING BRIGHTLY ::**

For the second time this season, RSL playmaker **Diego Luna** was recognized by Major League Soccer for his weekend heroics, again named to Matchday 7's fictional XI ...

Last Saturday afternoon in Sandy, Luna needed just five minutes midway through the first half to bag his second career brace, leading RSL to a 2-0 lead, one which would hold for the final result against the reigning MLS Cup champion LA Galaxy as the Claret-and-Cobalt snapped a two-game slide ...

Quite the eventful weekend culminated with the MLS honor for Luna, as the 21-year-old was recognized last Friday night by the Utah Sports Commission – an extension of the Governor's office as part of Utah's "State of Sport" proclamation – as the 2024 Male Professional

Athlete of the Year ... Luna – also the reigning 2024 MLS Young Player of the Year – earned an assist as well as the game-winning goal for RSL in its last win, a 2-1 victory on March 15 in Houston ...

### ***MORE LUNA ENJOYING LIMELIGHT ::***

With family from California and Texas in tow to both the Friday awards ceremony and Saturday's matinee, perhaps it was the presence of another guest – U.S. Men's National Team assistant coach Miguel D'Agostino, in town to watch Luna and January USMNT teammate **Emeka Eneli** ahead of this summer's Gold Cup – who provided additional inspiration for Luna, who now has three goals and two assists in his last three RSL matches ...

With the brace Saturday, Luna became the youngest player in RSL history (21 years, 208 days) to amass 15 goals AND 15 assists in his career on the Wasatch Front ...

The two-goal performance was Luna's second-ever, his first arriving back on July 15, 2023, against the New York Red Bulls just ahead of his departure to represent the U.S. in that summer's FIFA World Youth Championships in Argentina ...

### ***LOONY RESULT AT ALLIANZ ::***

In its last road trip, Real Salt Lake fell, 2-0 at Minnesota in an icy monsoon, conceding goals on either side of halftime back on March 29 ... Two turnovers while pushing high saw RSL concede transition opportunities to the host Loons, whose victory snapped a six-game run of draws between the teams across multiple competitions in 2023 and 2024 ...

RSL boss **Pablo Mastroeni** made four changes at halftime, two tactical and two due to the hypothermic conditions in rain, wind and sleet in St. Paul ...

### ***FULL STRENGTH AFTER FIFA WINDOW ::***

Four RSL players – including playmaker **Diego Luna** (USA), winger **Dominik Marczuk** (Poland), FW **Zavier Gozo** (USA U-20) and MF **Aiden Hezarkhani** (USA U-18) – returned to Club duty at Minnesota two matchdays ago after being called in the most recent FIFA window ...

Luna did not play in the U.S. semifinal loss to Panama, but did register the assist on the lone U.S. goal in the Third-Place loss to Canada ...

Marczuk did not play in either of Poland's World Cup Qualifying wins over Lithuania and Malta over the window ...

Gozo was apparently bright in the USA U-20 camp in Spain, as was Hezarkhani in another Spain-based U-18 camp for the U.S. ...

### ***REELING FROM RED CARD ::***

Back on March 22, RSL fell in an 0-1 scoreline against visiting FC Dallas, with a 23<sup>rd</sup>-minute adjudication of an **Ari Piol** offense resulting in a red card, the Claret-and-Cobalt forced to play a man down for nearly 70 remaining minutes ...

In that time, it was Brazilian goalkeeper **Rafael Cabral** who came up big on several occasions, including the denial of 35<sup>th</sup>-minute penalty-kick attempt by former MLS MVP Lucho Acosta ... Unfortunately for RSL, it was Acosta that nodded home the game's only goal seven minutes into first-half stoppage, dooming the Utah side to a third home loss of the season, equaling last year's total ...

Dallas has now won in three of its last five visits to America First Field, seizing the 2022, 2023 and now 2025 meetings on Utah soil ... No Major League Soccer visitor has won more games on Utah soil than FC Dallas in the 20 previous seasons, with RSL posting only a 13W-10L-6T mark against Dallas in the Beehive State ...

### ***SEARCHING FOR ROAD FORM ::***

Nearly a month ago on the road, RSL snapped a nine-game road winless run against the Dynamo in Houston (dating back to 2018), posting a 2-1 victory that saw both of the Club's premier playmakers, **Diogo Gonçalves** and **Diego Luna**, score first-half goals on either side of the Houston equalizer ... Just 43 seconds into the match, Diogo found the back of the net with the fourth-fastest goal in RSL history, assisted by **Emeka Eneli** and Luna on a play started at midfield by striker **Ariath Piol** ...

Following a 17<sup>th</sup>-minute equalizer by Houston on a set piece, it was Luna scoring just before halftime in the 50+ minute, using his maskless head to redirect a far-post shot from winger **Dominik Marczuk**, seizing momentum and shocking the Dynamo faithful. A resolute RSL defense stood firm for the final 45-plus, with GK **Rafael Cabral** and several others demonstrating grit, guile and fortitude to see out the win, just the fourth-ever in RSL's nearly two-decades worth of trips to South Texas since 2007 ...



## ***ROAD WARRIOR MENTALITY ::***

The Minnesota loss dropped RSL's 2025 road mark across all competitions to 1-2-1 under the guidance of fifth-year Head Coach **Pablo Mastroeni**, with each of the last two seasons marking the Claret-and-Cobalt's best road campaigns in team history ... The 2023 side posted an 11W-8L-5T away mark across all competitions, a record which includes both that year's Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup Semifinal loss to Houston, and its road loss and elimination draw in the first and third games of the teams' 2023 Audi MLS Cup Playoff series on the Shell Energy Stadium turf ...

A year ago, Mastroeni's men registered the second-most road points in RSL history, with a 5W-4L-8T MLS reg. season mark, one which does NOT include its heartbreaking, multi-goal Leagues Cup elimination loss to the Dynamo following a home win over Atlas FC ...

## ***MORE MASTROENI ::***

During each of Pablo's previous three full seasons at the RSL helm, the Club has increased its annual point total (47 in 2022, 50 in 2023 and 59 last year), while increasing its Western Conference table position as well (7<sup>th</sup> in 2022, 5<sup>th</sup> in 2023 and 3<sup>rd</sup> last year) ... The 2025 campaign features RSL's pursuit of a Conference-best fifth consecutive postseason berth, a seventh in the last eight seasons and its 15<sup>th</sup> in the last 18 years ...

Mastroeni earned his 50<sup>th</sup> win across all competitions with RSL in a 4-3 decision last June at Kansas City, with his 3<sup>rd</sup> reg. season win this season marking his 50<sup>th</sup> with RSL ... During his entire MLS coaching career – which includes the 2014-17 years at Colorado – former U.S. World Cup stalwart Mastroeni has amassed 99 wins, 108 losses and 74 draws across all competitions for the Rocky Mountain clubs ...

This season, Real Salt Lake returns nearly 21,000 collective minutes played from last year's roster, as the Club looks to build upon a record-setting 2024 campaign, as last year saw RSL advance to the MLS Cup Playoffs for a fourth consecutive occasion, the sixth time in seven seasons (2020 the lone exception), and for the 14<sup>th</sup> time in the last 17 seasons since first qualifying in 2008 (2015, 2017 the other outliers) ... The 2024 MLS regular season reached an all-time high of 59 points for RSL, which finished third in the Western Conference and sixth overall in the 29-team MLS shield race, while also establishing a new all-time scoring high of 65 goals ...

## ***EARLY-SEASON ROLLERCOASTER ::***

Following last weekend's matinee, RSL travels for seven of its next 10 starting next weekend in Nashville ... Upcoming road trips over the next month-plus include games at Nashville, San Diego, Vancouver, Dallas, Colorado, Austin and LA Galaxy before June 1 ...

In each of its last five games played around the Houston win, across both CONCACAF Champions Cup and MLS reg. season – all played at home – RSL owns two wins and three losses, despite scoring first in three matches prior to Dallas ... Outscored 4-6, three of the concessions overall and two of the opposing game-winners have come in second-half stoppage, with RSL pushing forward for the full three points on Feb. 26 v Herediano and March 8 v San Diego ...

Prior to last week's 2-0 win over LA Galaxy, the lone clean sheet for RSL at home in this stretch was the 2-0 win over Seattle, with the Claret-and-Cobalt rearguard also posting a zero in the first competitive game of 2025 at Herediano in the Estadio Nacional de Costa Rica back on Feb. 19 ...

All 810 minutes played in goal this year have seen the Club's Brazilian No. 1 – newcomer **Rafael Cabral** – between the pipes ...

RSL's pair of strikers – **Forster Ajago** (2 goals) and **Ari Piol** (1 goal) – found the back of the net in the three games prior to Houston, along with a Nouhou own goal on March 1 v Seattle ...

Several clear-cut chances have gone wanting by the duo, however, while winger **Dominik Marczuk** and playmakers **Diogo Gonçalves** and **Diego Luna** each failed to convert goal-scoring opportunities that would have changed games, prior to the trio's excellent display in the 2-1 win at Houston ...

## ***MLS CUP PLAYOFF GOALS ::***

The 2025 campaign features RSL's pursuit of a Conference-best fifth consecutive postseason berth, a seventh in the last eight seasons and its 15<sup>th</sup> in the last 18 years ...

## ***LUNA THE STAR OF THE SHOW ::***

Real Salt Lake playmaker **Diego Luna** returned last week from U.S. Men's National Team Head Coach **Mauricio Pochettino**'s 23-player roster in 2025 Concacaf Nations League ...

March 15 in Houston, Luna ditched the mask protecting his once-shattered nose, triggering the play that led to RSL's 43-second score by **Diogo Gonçalves**, earning the

secondary assist after combinations with **Ari Piol** and **Emeka Eneli** en route to RSL's fourth-fastest goal ever ...

Late in the first half, it was Luna who rescued a ball out of the corner, recycling the play and ultimately heading home the game-winning goal five minutes into first-half stoppage, redirecting a **Dominik Marczuk** laser to the far post ...

At 21 years of age, Luna – the reigning MLS Young Player of the Year, coming off an eight-goal, 12-assist campaign for RSL last season – is one of six MLS-based players who were part of the 2025 January Camp receiving the initial invite for the March matches ... Luna is also one of just three players, joining Patrick Agyemang (Charlotte) and Brian White (Vancouver), who also take part in their first USMNT camp during a FIFA international window and for an official competition ...

The annual January Camp has a long history of providing opportunities for MLS-based players to get an extended look from the coaching staff and make an impact ... Dating back to 1999, 30 players who have debuted or earned their second cap during the USMNT's first camp of a calendar year have gone on to make a FIFA World Cup roster ...

## ***FOR CLUB AND COUNTRY ::***

In January, Real Salt Lake saw two of its 2024 standouts – attacker **Diego Luna** and versatile Captain **Emeka Eneli** – amongst the 23 MLS players selected by Pochettino in this year's January's USA camp, including a 3-1 win over Venezuela in Ft. Lauderdale on Jan. 18 and a 3-0 win over Costa Rica on Jan. 22 in Orlando ...

Both Luna and Eneli played the final 27 minutes of the Venezuela win, with the RSL duo starting against Costa Rica, each player notching an assist ... Luna set up the game-winning Brian White goal on his first touch after a broken nose early in the contest, while Eneli also added an assist of his own on the second goal, late in the match ...

Despite having both nostrils filled with gauze, blood streaming down his face and looking like an extra from the famed David Fincher movie "Fight Club," Luna dominated the first half for the States, none of his creations more incisive than his 21<sup>st</sup>-minute throughball to O'Brian White, giving the home side a 1-0 lead ...

Luna played the first 45 only, setting up a game-high SIX big chances on either side of his battered and bloodied facial incident ...

Post-game, Luna was praised by Pochettino for his "big balls" refusal to exit the match ...

## ***SAN DIEGO SHOCK ON UTAH SOIL ::***

After a shock loss to San Diego in its previous home game on March 8, Real Salt Lake now owns a 9-4-3 (W-L-T) all-time mark against expansion sides making their initial visits to the Sandy venue over the previous 15 seasons, with only St. Louis, Cincinnati and LAFC able to grab the full three points at what is now known as America First Field prior to last week's stunning San Diego shocker ...

LAFC handed RSL its worst-ever home loss in March, 2018, a 5-1 win in that year's RSL home opener ... St. Louis won at America First Field in 2023 during its first-ever visit, as did Cincinnati later that season (although the FCC trip did not come in their inaugural year) ...

After three losses in four home games already this year across multiple competitions, next Saturday against LA Galaxy affords the Claret-and-Cobalt yet another opportunity to seek a return to fortress-like protection of home soil, where a year ago RSL lost just three home games across all competitions, posting an impressively dominant 12-3-5 / 40-point mark in 2024 ...

## ***ELIMINATED FROM CCC ::***

Back on Feb. 26, RSL's elimination game against Herediano was RSL's fifth consecutive loss in knockout contests, and its seventh in its last nine overall since the 2023 U.S. Open Cup Semifinal run ...

At home, RSL had won its last three elimination matches on Utah soil prior to Feb. 26, last winning a shootout against Houston in the second leg of its 2023 Audi MLS Cup Playoff series ...

Earlier in 2023, RSL also defeated Liga MX power Leon that August, winning 2-1 after conceding the first goal in a Leagues Cup Round of 32 contest ... Two months prior, RSL won its Open Cup Quarterfinal match, also at home, against the LA Galaxy by a 3-2 margin to avoid elimination ...

In 2022, RSL dropped a Round of 32 Open Cup match at America First Field against a lower-division opponent, Hailstorm FC, in just the fourth home knockout contest of 17 overall elimination matches during the Mastroeni era ...

That number jumps to 18 if you include the 2021 "Decision Day" must-win "Damiracle" at Sporting Kansas City, RSL with the game-winning goal at 94:38, mere seconds from full-time, to advance to the postseason in Pablo's first year as manager, which saw RSL progress all the way to the West Final ...

## ***MIDWEEK DEBUTANTS x5 ::***

Five RSL players made their Club debuts with the midweek continental fixture just over a month ago, as GK **Rafael Cabral**, DF **Kobi Henry** and FW **Forster Ajago** each started for Head Coach **Pablo Mastroeni**, while DF **Sam Junqua** and MF **Tyler Wolff** entered the match as substitutes ...

A trio of late-summer 2024 acquisitions also started that Wednesday, as Portuguese Designated Player **Diogo Gonçalves** was named by CONCACAF as the game's Michelob Ultra Player of the Match ... Diogo was joined by Polish winger **Dominik Marczuk** and Australian attacker **Lachlan Brook** to provide creativity ahead of RSL's staunch "Iron Man" pivots, **Braian Ojeda** and **Emeka Eneli** – both of whom led RSL in minutes last year. Eneli wore the Captain's armband for the second time in his RSL career on Feb. 26, the youngest to ever do it ...

Fourth-year homegrown DF **Bode Hidalgo** started on the right with centerback **Brayan Vera** next to Henry and in front of Cabral, while left back **Alex Katranis** was removed from the match in the 19<sup>th</sup> minute after taking a close-range shot to the back of his head ...

Replaced by MLS veteran Junqua, other subs included the debutant Wolff, homegrown FW **Zavier Gozo** as well as the first appearance in 354 days by MF **Pablo Ruiz**, who played just three games last year after a meniscus injury in August, 2023, and an ACL setback in the opposite knee last March ...

With the Feb. 26 elimination, RSL's all-time record in CONCACAF Champions tourney games is now 11-6-7 (W-L-T), including a home mark of 8-2-2 (the lone previous home loss coming in the 2010/11 final to Monterrey) ...

## ***COACHELLA VALLEY WRAP-UP ::***

RSL concluded its 21<sup>st</sup> preseason seven weeks ago on **Wed., Feb. 12** at the Coachella Valley Invitational with a pair of friendlies, RSL coming from behind to draw New York Red Bulls, 3-3, with its presumptive starting XI, while the depth squad defeated Orange County SC, 3-1, in the second half of that day's doubleheader ...

FW **Forster Ajago** scored twice in the CVI match against New Jersey's MLS side, opening the game with a 10<sup>th</sup>-minute breakaway – assisted by new RSL GK **Rafael Cabral** – and also scoring the 81<sup>st</sup> minute equalizer by pouncing on a loose ball in the box ...

RSL saw DP playmaker **Diogo Gonçalves** cut the 3-1 Red Bull lead in half 10 minute prior to Ajago's equalizer, the Portuguese metronome also seizing upon a deflected ball at the top of the box to find the back of the net for the first time in his first full preseason with RSL ...

## ***PERFECT v USL COMP ::***

In the 3-1 win over Orange County, RSL saw second-half goals by homegrown DF **Tommy Silva**, recent college draft selection **Jesus Barea** and Australian newcomer **Ari Piol** ...

The now completely-healthy **Pablo Ruiz** started the goal-scoring sequences with exquisite left-footed switches to spring RSL forward, while the interplay between Piol and Barea freed each other on dangerous sequences ...

Earlier in the Coachella Valley tourney, RSL saw goals from **Noel Caliskan**, **Zavier Gozo** and **Tyler Wolff** in a 3-0 win over Las Vegas (USL Championship), while a stunning left-footed curler from Aussie **Lachlan Brook** earned RSL a 1-1 draw with St. Louis on Feb. 8 ...

## ***INTERNATIONALLY KNOWN ::***

In that final preseason tune-up, played exactly one week ahead of its CONCACAF Champions Cup opener in Costa Rica, RSL saw 10 nationalities represented in its presumed first-choice starting XI, lining up in a 4-2-3-1 formation without the ball:

## ***SANTA BARBARA TRIP ::***

In the preseason segment concluding on **January 29** in Santa Barbara, Calif., RSL earned a 1-1 draw with Minnesota United over the course of 120 minutes played ... Despite going down 0-1 in the 15<sup>th</sup> minute, RSL FW **Forster Ajago** equalized in the 90<sup>th</sup>, off an assist from right winger **Bode Hidalgo** ...

## ***TURNOVER OVERSTATED? ::***

Eight of RSL's 11 starters from its 2024 Audi MLS Cup Playoffs First Round Leg Two at Minnesota return for this year, with changes in goal (**Rafael Cabral** in place of the injured Zac MacMath) and up top (**Forster Ajago** replacing the departed Anderson Julio) ...

In RSL's 4-2-3-1 defensive shape, a game model which switches to a 3-2-4-1 with the ball, the Matt Crooks minutes will end up at the feet of **Diogo Gonçalves**; if 2024 MLS Young Player of the Year **Diego Luna** is unable to go due to his nasal reconstruction following the shattered nose from U.S. camp, Aussie attacker **Lachlan Brook** will replace him ...

Yes, nearly 70% of last year's goals are gone, with the Andrés Gómez summer sale and the offseason departures of Chicho Arango, Anderson Julio and Matt Crooks ...

However, 20,000+ minutes do return for 2025 RSL, which has gotten deeper along the back line with left-sided MLS vet **Sam Junqua** and U.S. Youth International **Kobi Henry** added to the **Justen Glad**, **Brayan Vera**, **Philip Quinton**, **Bode Hidalgo** and **Javain Brown / Tommy Silva** mix ...

RSL is also deeper in the midfield with the **Pablo Ruiz** return to health alongside **Braian Ojeda**, **Emeka Eneli**, **Nelson Palacio** and **Noel Caliskan** ...

Wingers **Dominik Marczuk** and Brook combine creatively with Luna and newcomer **Tyler Wolff**, while homegrown USA U-18 **Zavier Gozo**, Piol and Ajago add to the attack ...

Soon, Spanish rookie **Jesus Barea** – coming off a strong preseason, now awaiting the conversion from his student visa to a full-blown P-1, which will allow him to work in the U.S. – will be available to add his attacking versatility and flair to the attacking mix as well ...

## ***CUP COMPETITIONS ABOUND ::***

With Real Salt Lake's CONCACAF Champions Cup tournament ended early in the 2025 campaign, the Claret-and-Cobalt will now look ahead to its participation in the third edition of Leagues Cup, hosting three Liga MX sides – Club América, Atletico San Luis and Queretaro – in

Phase One at America First Field from July 30 – Aug. 6, with the knockout stages being played Aug. 19-31 ...

For the first time since 2015, RSL's reserve team – Real Monarchs SLC – flew the RSL flag in the 111-year-old Lamar Hunt U.S. Open Cup, suffering a 120-minute loss to Bay Area amateur side El Farolito at Zions Bank Stadium ... The AET game-winner was a penalty kick in the 115<sup>th</sup> minute, with the “Burrito Boys” adding another deep into stoppage ...

The only RSL regular to feature was 20-year-old centerback **Kobi Henry**, who received his second yellow card in the 90<sup>th</sup> minute ...

## ***AJAGO'S CCC BRACE IN 2024 ::***

While with Nashville a year ago, an undrafted rookie out of Duke University, Ghanaian striker **Forster Ajago** scored twice in Nashville's 4-0 win over Dominican side Moca FC in last year's Champions Cup ...

The 22-year-old striker hadn't played a minute of professional soccer going into the match, but was given the start in Nashville's first-ever home match in continental competition ... Two goals and a dominant performance was quite the introduction in front of the Nashville SC faithful ...

“Initially, coach kind of told me it might be on the bench and we'll see how things go. But as to whether I was starting, it was yesterday,” Ajago said after the match. “Obviously, I didn't expect it to be like this. But coming into the game, I knew confidence-wise I was there. The guys got my back and I got nothing to lose.”

He certainly played like he had nothing to lose. Ajago, who wasn't even eligible to play for Nashville SC in MLS due to a lack of available international roster slots, became just the 10<sup>th</sup> player in Nashville's seven-year history to score on his debut ...

It could have been even better ... In addition to his two goals, both incredibly well taken for such a young player, Ajago hit the woodwork twice and saw a penalty kick saved ... It was nothing short of a dominant performance, albeit against inferior opposition, one that had fans clamoring for more involvement with Nashville's first team ...

Ajago only added to his rapidly-growing fan support with a memorable celebration after both goals, running to the corner flag and clawing at the air ... While certainly eye-catching on the pitch, the celebration has a deeper meaning to Ajago, one that gives a glimpse into his long journey from Navrongo, Ghana, to Nashville, Tenn. ...

“I gain the name ‘bear’ there from the celebration,” Ajago grinned. “It's kind of like a bear. And it's like claws. For me, it kind of has a story of coming through from the beginning. It's been tough and for me everything seems

to be, I have to grab it. So it's kind of like the aggressive mode of me taking out the weeds and clearing the way."

"I'm the man here, I'm the lion, I'm the bear," he added. "It's kind of like a struggle out, clearing out the weeds and the weak ones, and showing I'm the strong one."

## ***2025 DEPARTURES ::***

RSL's most "striking" roster changes for its 21<sup>st</sup> season happen up top, as former No. 9s **Chicho Arango** and **Anderson Julio** – who combined for 27 of the Club's all-time team-record 65 goals last season – have moved on from Utah ... Former captain Arango – who won RSL's 2024 Golden Boot with 17 goals in 2024, all prior to his mid-July suspension – was traded to Western Conference rival San Jose Earthquakes on January 13, while Julio – who scored a career-high 9 goals last season – was traded on Dec. 20 to FC Dallas ...

In January, MF **Matt Crooks** returned to the English Championship after one season on the Wasatch, while teenage GK **Gavin Beavers** was sold to legendary side Brøndby in the Danish First Division ...

RSL has also said goodbye to long-time Homegrown DF **Andrew Brody**, waived three weeks ago as one of just two players in the Club's last 10 seasons to appear in 100+ matches for both RSL and Real Monarchs ...

### ***ELIAS, WE HARDLY KNEW YA ::***

Former New York Red Bull striker **Elias Manoel** was acquired on Dec. 20 to compete for a role in leading RSL's revamped 2025 attack, the Brazilian demonstrating danger and guile during his MLS career ...

However, RSL recently sold Manoel to Copa Libertadores champion and Brazilian power Botafogo – former home of one-time RSL attacker Jefferson Savarino – on the eve of the Club's home opener for the 2025 MLS season ...

Manoel – with his U.S. work visa sponsored by RSL and his green card process maintained by the Utah club – never reported to preseason, seeking new contract and more money after initially welcoming the trade from NYRB ...

## ***NEW ARRIVALS ::***

MF **Tyler Wolff** (Atlanta), DF **Sam Junqua** (Dallas) and FW **Forster Ajago** (Nashville) were also obtained in December via MLS trade/waiver mechanisms, while RSL also added eight players with collegiate experience in the 2025 MLS SuperDraft just prior to Christmas ...

In the January window, RSL also executed a loan agreement for young American DF **Kobi Henry** from French side Reims, with multiple other incoming transfers – including Brazilian GK **Rafael Cabral** and Australian FW **Ariath Piol** – were signed pending work visas prior to the

team's late January departure for stage two of its 2025 training camp in Santa Barbara, Calif. ...

## ***RETURNING TO THE MIX ::***

Veteran RSL midfielder **Pablo Ruiz** is back to 100% health to kick off the 2025 season after suffering a pair of severe injuries in both August 2023 and April 2024, limiting the burgeoning Chilean international to just three MLS games played since an Aug. 6 Leagues Cup match at LAFC ...

After rehabbing the non-contact meniscus injury suffered in the 9<sup>th</sup> minute of that road match, Ruiz returned to play the first three matches of 2024 – at Miami and St. Louis, and at home in the "snowmageddon" match against LAFC – before suffering a season-ending ACL tear in a training collision in Herriman just a few days later ...

The versatile Ruiz – a deep-lying playmaker, often serving as RSL's metronome in 2022 / 23 – enters 2025 looking to play himself into "Comeback Player of the Year" consideration ...

Other RSL players looking to rebound from injury this year included 2024 MLS SuperDraft pick **Kevin Bonilla** – who suffered multiple injuries in his right knee last preseason, unfortunately suffering an Achilles injury in his 2025 preseason – and **Zack Farnsworth**, the former RSL Academy man who has spent the last four years coming back from ankle injuries suffered in the 2021 preseason, logging significant Monarchs minutes last year ...

## ***DRAFT DAY DEALINGS ::***

As a by-product of the **Elias Manoel** deal, RSL also acquired all of the New York Red Bulls' 2025 SuperDraft picks, while also moving up in the first round with General Allocation Money (GAM) trades for picks from both the Columbus Crew and LA Galaxy ... RSL ended up taking eight players out of the college acquisition mechanism, with 7 of the 8 picks reporting to this year's combined RSL / Monarchs first stage of preseason, with just FW **Sergi Solans** (Oregon State) returning to college for another year ...

Overall on Dec. 20, RSL selected eight players via the 2025 MLS SuperDraft, including a quartet of first-round picks – FW **Jesus Barea** (19th overall out of Missouri State), GK **Max Kerkvliet** (21st / UConn), FW **Lineker Rodrigues dos Santos** (29th / Marshall) and FW **Sergi Solans** (30th / Oregon State) ... RSL's four first-rounders marked the second-most of the initial round (Colorado, five) en route to the second-most picks throughout the entire draft (also Colorado, nine overall) ...

RSL entered draft day with only the 19th, 49th and 79th overall picks in the event's three rounds, but added three



more just hours prior to the 2025 MLS SuperDraft as part of its acquisition of veteran Brazilian FW **Elias Manoel**, with RSL send \$700,000 in future GAM to New York, taking each of the Red Bulls' natural selections (29th, 59th and 89th overall), as well as New York's natural second rounder in next year's draft ...

During the first round, RSL also acquired two more picks, sending \$75,000 in 2024 GAM to the Columbus Crew for the 21<sup>st</sup> overall pick (Kerkvliet) and \$50,000 to LA Galaxy for the 30<sup>th</sup> overall pick (Solans), the final selection of the first round ...

Later that day, RSL recouped \$400,000 in GAM from FC Dallas in exchange for FW Anderson Julio, while also acquiring versatile veteran MLS DF **Sam Junqua** in a depth move ...

### ***FIRST FULL PRESEASONS ::***

Much of RSL's 2025 roster work was accomplished last August, when new arrivals in the form of DP playmaker **Diogo Gonçalves**, U22 winger **Dominik Marczuk**, MF **Lachlan Brook** and DF **Javain Brown** donned the Claret-and-Cobalt ...

With a full preseason in advance of the mid-February CONCACAF foray, each player's flashes of brilliance from last Fall hopefully blossom into impactful stretches and consistent depth as RSL juggles eight games in 27 days to kick off 2025, and the potential of 19 games across multiple competitions in the first 74 days from mid-Feb. to early May with a successful Champions Cup run ...

### ***HOMEGROWN FACTORY ::***

RSL's homegrown poster boy, 27-year-old centerback **Justen Glad**, returns for his 11<sup>th</sup> season with the Claret-and-Cobalt, leading the charge amongst the 15 homegrown on RSL's 2025 roster ... Glad – who needs just 6 more MLS games played to move past **Tony Beltran** and **Chris Wingert** into third-place overall amongst MLS performers – is joined by DF **Bode Hidalgo** and DF **Tommy Silva** as RSL Academy products in the 2025 mix ...

FW **Zavier Gozo** – who made his MLS debut late in the 2023 season, and played just 11 minutes last year – is joined by several others, including FW **Axel Kei**, MF **Owen Anderson**, DF **Luis Rivera**, MF **Jude Wellings**, MF **Gio Villa**, MF **Aiden Hezarkhani** and DF **Omar Marquez** as players on MLS contracts looking to make an impact this season ...

All told, RSL has signed 45 players to HG contracts in the last 15 seasons, outpacing FC Dallas for the league-high contribution ...

### ***YOUTH WILL BE SERVED ::***

The Real Monarchs / MLS NEXT Pro pathway has also served RSL well, with MF **Noel Caliskan**, attacker **Jesus Barea** and MF **Matthew Bell** utilizing minutes at the USSF-sanctioned Division III level to prepare for first-team contributions ...

Other Monarchs standouts with opportunities to earn MLS consideration could include MF **Griffin Dillon**, DF **Loic Adjala** and FW **Ousman Touray** ...

### ***BETWEEN THE PIPES ::***

RSL will see a distinct change at the goalkeeper position for 2025, with veteran incumbent **Zac MacMath** now on the shelf with preseason surgery, replaced by Brazilian international **Rafael Cabral**, who arrives in MLS with nearly a decade of European experience in Italy and England prior to spending the last 18 months with Cruzeiro / Gremio in his home country ...

A few days into camp, with the MacMath injury news and the impending Beavers sale to Danish side Brøndby, RSL traded for Orlando City backup GK **Mason Stajduhar**, now entering his 10<sup>th</sup> MLS season ...

Gone is RSL Academy product and former RSL / Monarchs ingenue **Gavin Beavers**, who moved to Danish side Brøndby upon the completion of the January USA U-20 camp, as that side prepares for this year's Youth World Cup ...

First-round draftee **Max Kerkvliet** signed an MLS contract and will train daily as the third keeper and should expect to split Monarchs minutes with RSL Academy starlet **Will Mackay**, while draftee **Trace Alphin** and others will continue along their Monarchs / Academy developmental pathways ...

### ***ALONG THE SPINE ::***

Running it back in the engine room ahead of **Justen Glad** and **Brayan Vera** are veteran RSL pivots **Braian Ojeda** and **Emeka Eneli**, the 2024 team leaders in minutes played, appearances and starts ... 2023 standout **Pablo Ruiz** returns from injury to soak up the Matt Crooks minutes along with relative newcomer **Diogo Gonçalves**, while **Diego Luna**, **Tyler Wolff** and perhaps homegrown **Owen Anderson** will also occupy space underneath **Forster Ajago** and **Ariath Piol** up top ...

The versatile **Philip Quinton** – a right-sided centerback and now RSL's tallest player who excelled in late-season deployment at right back – is mirrored on the left side by newcomer **Sam Junqua**, an MLS veteran who is comfortable as a left centerback but can also play outside

on the left if needed in a back four (albeit not in the way the overlapping Katranis might) ...

U.S. Youth International DF **Kobi Henry** has also impressed in both back-3 and back-4 setups, playing mostly as a centerback or on the right ...

### ***ON THE OUTSIDE WINGS ::***

Running roughshod on either wing are **Alex Katranis** – the Greek left back who impressed last year with late game-winners in Vancouver and Philadelphia, amongst others – and the impressive **Dominik Marczuk**, the Polish international who displayed playmaking prowess, finishing precision and defensive work rate from his wide right attacking position ...

Late-summer acquisition **Lachlan Brook** looks to secure more minutes in 2025, playing on either wing, with the left-footed playmaker liking to cut inside and play centrally from either wing ...

### ***WINNING TOGETHER THROUGH DEVELOPMENT ::***

2025 preseason offered a glimpse into which young players have a chance to emerge this season, as first-round 2025 draft picks **Jesus Barea** and **Lineker Rodrigues** have the chance to prove their worth high up in the attack ...

Barea has signed an MLS deal in mid-March, while Lineker impressed in Santa Barbara and Coachella and now returns to the Monarchs ...

On the defensive side, rookies **Nick Dang** and **Aleksander Vukovic** are likely playing for Monarchs deals, as are 2024 draft picks **Max Jennings** and **Ruben Mesalles**, who arrive for their first preseasons with RSL after spending last year in the collegiate environment ...

### ***2025 SCHEDULE HIGHLIGHTS ::***

The remaining 2025 MLS schedule is highlighted by several key dates, including:

A visit from **reigning MLS Cup Champions LA Galaxy** next Sat., April 5, in what could be a second Utah trip and a third overall early-year match between the MLS Cup 2009 rivals, as a potential CONCACAF Champions Cup Round of 16 series in the first two weeks of March awaits – IF only RSL can get past Herediano (Costa Rica) in Round One;

Two **Rocky Mountain Cup matches** against Colorado, RSL looking to reclaim the fan-created, regional rivalry Cup title for a 14<sup>th</sup> occasion in the last 18 seasons with a Sat., May 17 visit to Commerce City, before welcoming the Rapids to the Wasatch Front on Sat., Oct. 4 in RSL's penultimate 2025 MLS reg. season match;

A return to RSL's traditional **Independence Day Fireworks on Sat., July 5**, against visiting St. Louis CITY SC, followed later that month with **Pioneer Day Festivities on Sat., July 26** against San Jose Earthquakes;

A trio of visits from Eastern Conference opponents to America First Field, as Toronto (Sat., April 19), D.C. United (Sat., June 14) and FC Cincinnati (Sat., July 19) travel to Utah for the first time in several seasons for RSL's out-of-Conference home matches;

And **multiple Leagues Cup matches** to be potentially played at America First Field between Tues., July 29 and Sun., August 31, with the third-year competition against LIGA MX teams interspersed with League matches coming out of the **July 23 MLS All-Star Game** to be played in Austin, TX;

As is typical in an odd-numbered year, RSL will travel away for **Decision Day 2025**, to be played on Sat., October 18 at St. Louis CITY SC, now in its third MLS season ...

### ***MORE 2025 SCHEDULE QUIRKS ::***

This upcoming season will see RSL make just **three Eastern Conference road trips**, including an early-season Nashville run (April 12) and back-to-back East Coast away weekends at New York Red Bulls and Charlotte FC (August 10/16) ...

Head Coach **Pablo Mastroeni's** side will also travel to face San Diego FC (April 26), Vancouver (May 3) and Dallas (May 10) in the Club's longest multi-game road stretch of the season, part of a 35-day run that sees RSL play six of eight on the road in that span, with an Austin FC (May 28) and LA Galaxy (May 31) road run concluding the congested stretch ...

**June and July then flip to see RSL play six of eight on Utah soil at America First Field**, the calendar offering two rare bye weekends (June 7 and June 21) during the summer months that sees two quick trips to Kansas City (June 28) and Portland (July 16) comingled with Utah visits from D.C. United (June 14), LAFC (June 25), St. Louis (July 5), Houston (July 12), Cincinnati (July 19) and San Jose (July 26) ahead of the July 29 League Cup kickoff ...

On three (3) MLS-only occasions, RSL will play **three games in an eight-day period**: May 10-17 (@DAL / v POR / @ COL), May 24-31 (v VAN, @ATX, @ LAG) and July 12-19 (v HOU, @POR, v CIN); additional midweek matches affecting the Club due to CONCACAF Champions League in March and April could potentially occur, as well as the August Leagues Cup slate ...

Other schedule periods see RSL hosting **multi-game homestands at America First Field** on four occasions – June 14/25 (DCU / LAFC), July 5/12 (STL / HOU), July 19/26 (CIN / SJ), and Sept. 27-Oct. 4 (ATX / COL) ...

The 2025 slate includes **four bye weekends, including international breaks** surrounding the following Saturdays: June 7, June 21, Sept. 6 and Oct. 11 (barring the necessity to reschedule to one of these dates) ...

Outside of both CONCACAF Champions Cup and Leagues Cup, RSL hosts **just two home Wednesday MLS matches** at America First Field, the first of which is May 14 against Portland, the other June 25 v. LAFC ...

A total of **10 MLS reg. season matches after the MLS All-Star Game**, to be played in Austin on Wed., July 23 just before Leagues Cup kicks off on July 29, the newly-formatted MLS v Liga MX showcase being played through August 31 ...

Interspersed with Leagues Cup, **RSL will host five (5) of those final 10 games at home**, including the Rocky Mountain Cup decider at AFF on Oct. 4 against Colorado, which wrested the Cup away from RSL last season ...

Other late-season run-in opponents for RSL at America First Field include San Jose, Austin, Kansas City and Minnesota, which eliminated RSL via penalty-kick tiebreakers in both 2024 Audi MLS Cup Playoff matches between the sides ...

## ***2024 MILESTONES IN REVIEW ::***

The record-setting 2024 RSL side amassed the Club's eighth 50-point season all-time (out of 20 seasons), and just the third since the 2014 campaign ... Finishing 6<sup>th</sup> overall out of 29 teams, RSL crashed out of the postseason by the thinnest of margins for a third consecutive year (Austin 2022, Houston 2023, Minnesota 2024), dropping a road shootout tiebreaker ...

Other 2024 RSL milestones:

Accumulated an all-time Club-high overall point total of 59 points, RSL's 16-7-11 (W-L-T) record eclipsing the previous record of 57 points, set in 2012; the 16 wins in 34 games matches the Club's second-highest win total in its 20 MLS campaigns (2013, 2019), trailing only the 17 won in 2012 ...

Achieved RSL's second-highest road record with 13 results in 17 away MLS matches, posting a 5W-4L-8T mark, with 23 of its 59 reg. season points amassed on the road; RSL's previous road best was recorded in 2023, with an outstanding 8W-5L-4T (28 pts) mark ...

RSL attained 59 points in 2024 by returning its America First Field home to "fortress" status, the Club's home mark of 11W-3L-3T the fourth-best in MLS and the fifth-highest in RSL's 20 previous MLS seasons ...

This most recent campaign was also the highest-scoring season in Real Salt Lake's 20 MLS years, with 65 goals through 34 matches, eclipsing the 57 scored in 2013; RSL's pair of goals scored on Decision Day enabled the 2024 side to match the all-time Club mark of 38 goals on home soil, matching the 2018 season's production in Sandy ...

During a nearly four-month span from early-March to late June, RSL embarked on a Club-record 15-game unbeaten run in MLS competition, marred only by an Open Cup match in Albuquerque ...

RSL striker and former Captain **Chicho Arango** scored 17 goals and added 13 assists during his first full season on the Wasatch Front, winning the Club Golden Boot and matching Alvaro Saborio's all-time RSL high for goals in a season, set in 2012 ...

## ***HOME FORTRESS BOUNCEBACK ::***

RSL's 2025 slate, including 34 MLS regular-season matches – along with multiple Leagues Cup contests (at least 3 from July 30 to Aug. 6 against LIGA MX powers) – could have seen the team play four of its first eight **at its America First Field home** – where RSL went 12-3-4 (W-L-T) in 2024 – with CCC advancement prior to a three-game road trip from April 26 – May 10 ...

Since April 16, 2005, RSL has enjoyed a prominent home-field advantage on Utah soil – posting a dominant 207-87-99 (Win-Loss-Draw) record across all competitions at home (1.83 points per game for a 0.654 win pct.) – since arriving on the Wasatch Front 20 years ago ...

Since opening its permanent home in Sandy just over 15 years ago, in October, 2008, RSL's 177-62-79 (W-L-T) mark at America First Field – home of the "RioT" Supporters Group umbrella – equates to a 1.92 points per game average and a 0.682 win pct, one of the truly amazing value proposition in North American sporting landscape today ...

## **MLS "30 FOR 30" 2025 HIGHLIGHTS ::**

With the addition of San Diego FC as the League's 30<sup>th</sup> club, arriving for Major League Soccer's 30<sup>th</sup> season, the MLS schedule format will include every MLS team competing in 34 regular season games, featuring 17 at home and 17 on the road ... Clubs will play conference opponents twice (28 games), once at home and once away ... Each club will play six different cross-conference opponents (3 home / 3 away) ...

**MLS Season Pass on Apple TV** will continue to broadcast all MLS matches live throughout the season complimented by extensive studio coverage ... The popular whip around studio show, *MLS 360*, provides live look-ins from every active match alongside expert analysis in English and Spanish ... Pregame and postgame studio shows, *MLS Countdown* and *MLS Wrap Up* in English and *MLS La Previa* and *MLS El Resumen* in Spanish, return with full preview and postgame analysis and insights across all matchday action ... **MLS Season Pass** will also continue to feature a wide array of on-demand content and in-depth special features spanning all 30 MLS clubs ...

Returning for its 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive season, **FOX Sports will air 34 MLS games in 2025** in the U.S., including 15 matches on FOX and 19 matches on FS1, with all FOX Sports broadcasts also providing Spanish-language coverage on FOX Deportes ...

MLS stadiums across the United States and Canada will be featured prominently with 14 MLS venues serving as hosts to the first-ever 32-team FIFA Club World Cup and the 2025 Gold Cup, CONCACAF's flagship men's national team tournament ... **MLS will pause regular season play from June 15-24** for the FIFA Club World Cup, an event featuring Inter Miami CF and Seattle Sounders FC, and the CONCACAF Gold Cup ...

**Leagues Cup 2025**, the official CONCACAF tournament between LIGA MX and MLS, will be played July 29 to August 31 and, similar to other global cup competitions, Leagues Cup will take place during the MLS regular season ...

**Decision Day 2025 – the final matchday of the MLS regular season with postseason implications on the line – is set for Saturday, October 16** ... The slate of 14 matches will feature all Eastern Conference matches kicking off at 4 p.m. MT and all Western Conference matches beginning at 7 p.m. MT, respectively on **MLS Season Pass on Apple TV** ... Additionally, New York City FC will host Seattle Sounders in an interconference match at 4 p.m. MT on the final matchday of the season ...

The Audi 2025 MLS Cup Playoffs will culminate in Major League Soccer's championship match, **MLS Cup 2025 presented by Audi, on Saturday, December 6**, with hosting rights awarded to the competing team with the better regular-season record ...

## **2025 MILESTONES TO FOLLOW ::**

With its home win on March 1 against Seattle, RSL boasted its 13<sup>th</sup> home MLS reg. season win vs. the Sounders, RSL's second-highest all-time total of home wins (13, also KC/DAL) ... RSL's 18 home wins against Colorado sets the standard ...

The near-sellout on March 1 also gave RSL 6 million total fans on Utah soil since April 16, 2005, in both MLS reg. season and Audi MLS Cup Playoffs action ...

Others to watch:

- RSL's win last weekend against LA Galaxy gave the Club 250 all-time (MLS Reg. Season only)
- RSL needs three more HOME wins for 175 all-time (MLS reg. Season only)
- Last week, **Justen Glad** passed Wingert/Beltran and move into 3<sup>rd</sup> all-time with 248 MLS appearances (Rimando/Beckerman)
- Glad needs 3.5 seasons at 2700 each to catch Beckerman's nearly 30,000 minutes
- **Pablo Ruiz** needs one MLS assist to move into the Club's Top-10 all-time
- Glad is only 2 cautions shy of moving into 2nd place all time (49)
- MacMath needs 2 MLS appearances & starts to reach 100 in goal for each RSL category
- MacMath needs 3 wins with RSL to reach 40 all-time (reg. Season)
